ACTION REQUESTED:

Conduct Public Hearing and Adoption of Resolution No. 1213-0078 – Request to the California State Board of Education for a General of Education Code Section 52055.740(a) on behalf of *Frick Middle School*, incorporated herein by reference as though fully set forth, to the California State Board of Education and authorizes the submission of same with requisite supporting documentation.

BACKGROUND:

The Quality Education Investment Act (QEIA) is the result of a settlement between Governor Schwarzenegger and the California Teachers' Association (CTA) which is aimed at boosting student achievement at low-performing schools. In May 2007 State Superintendent of Public Instruction Jack O'Connell announced that 488 low-performing schools in California were selected to receive QEIA funding. The Oakland Unified School District has 13 QEIA funded schools; four middle schools and nine elementary schools.

QEIA schools have demonstrated meaningful to significant growth in academic achievement over-all as a result of implementing the various strategies outlined in the QEIA program. QEIA non-compliance reported for schools in the 2011-12 school years have been determined to be correctable under the state's General Waiver process. The district, in an effort to ensure maintenance of these funds for the 2013-14 school years for specific schools, must seek a General Waiver of the State Board of Education.

The District is taking steps to further assist QEIA funded schools in meeting the compliance targets set forth under the Quality Education Investment Act. The continued provision of QEIA funding for the 2013-14 school years will likely contribute significantly to continued academic gains for the designated school.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The adoption of the Request by the District and granting of the Waiver by the State Board of Education will assist the District in maintaining approximately \$305,000 in QEIA funding annually.

The approval of this waiver request will not have a negative fiscal impact on the District.

For each funded school, the county superintendent of schools for the county in which the school is located shall annually review the school and its data to determine if the school has met all of the following program requirements by the school by the end of the third full year of funding:

- (1) Meet all of the following class size requirements:
- (A) For kindergarten and grades 1 to 3, inclusive, no more than 20 pupils per class, as set forth in the Class Size Reduction Program Chapter 6.10 (commencing with Section 52120)).
- (B) For self-contained classrooms in grades 4 to 8, inclusive, an average classroom size that is the lesser of clause (i) or (ii), as follows:
 - (i) At least five pupils fewer per classroom than was the average in 2006-07.
 - (ii) An average of 25 pupils per classroom.
- (iii) For purposes of this subparagraph, average classroom size shall be calculated at the grade level based on the number of self-contained classrooms in that grade at the school site. If the self-contained classrooms at the school averaged fewer than 25 pupils per classroom during the 2005-06 school year, that lower average shall be used as the "average in 2006-07" for purposes of this subparagraph. A school that receives funding under this article shall not have a self-contained classroom in grades 4 to 8, inclusive, with more than 27 pupils regardless of its average classroom size.

Outcome Rationale:

This Waiver is requesting that the requirement for Frick Middle School to keep class size maximums at 27 students or fewer be suspended for the 2011-12 school year in light of the following circumstances:

The school made a good-faith effort to stay within QEIA class size maximums of 27, but challenges of balancing the master schedule and ongoing student enrollment to the site during the course of the year made it difficult to always stay within the 27 student maximum requirement. Eight classes were in violation of this rule throughout the course of 2011-12. Through corrective action and natural attrition, the site was able to bring all class sizes that violated this rule to within guidelines by no later than March 2, 2012. Specifically:

- 1 class was brought within guidelines in October, 2011
- 4 classes were brought within guidelines in January, 2012
- 1 class was brought within guidelines in February, 2012
- 2 classes were brought within guidelines in March, 2012

Student Population:

Oakland USD has a student population of 38,040 (in 2011-12) and is located in an Urban Setting *in Alameda* County. Frick Middle School had a student population of 431 in 2011-12.
