

We have completed our review of applications received for the FY 2011 Transition to Teaching Program Grant Competition (CFDA 84.350A/B/C). We are pleased to inform you that your application was selected for funding. Using the criteria published in the application notice, each application received a comprehensive review by a panel of three external reviewers with expertise in appropriate content areas. This year's program was once again extremely competitive. The Department reviewed seventy-five (75) applications and was able to make 30 grant awards. We made 21 awards under 84.350A (local project scope), seven awards under 84.350B (statewide project scope), and two awards under 84.350C (national or regional project scope).

We are enclosing a copy of the reviewers' technical review forms, which include the score your application received for each criterion and the strengths and weaknesses of your application.
