(C) fina to	is Agreement is entered into between the Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) and <u>Fagle Village Community Center Youth and Fami</u> DNTRACTOR). OUSD is authorized by Government Code Section 53060 to contract for the furnishing of special services and advice in ancial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal, and administrative matters with persons specially trained, experienced, and competent perform such services. CONTRACTOR warrants it is specially trained, experienced, and competent to provide such services. The ties agree as follows:
1.	Services: The CONTRACTOR shall provide the ("Services" or "Work") as described in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
2.	Terms: CONTRACTOR shall commence work on 10/01/2012 , or the day immediately following approval by the Superintendent if the aggregate amount CONTRACTOR has contracted with the District is below \$81,000 in the current fiscal year; or, approval by the Board of Education if the total contract(s) exceed \$81,000, whichever is later. Notice shall be effective when received if personally served or, if mailed, three days after mailing. Either party must give written notice of a change of address. CONTRACTOR shall submit invoices in a form that includes the name of the person providing the service, the service performed, the date service was rendered, and the hours spent on the work.

8. Invoicing

Invoices furnished by CONTRACTOR under this Agreement must be in a form acceptable to OUSD. All amounts paid by OUSD shall be subject to audit by OUSD.

- Invoices shall include, but not be limited to: Consultant name, consultant address, invoice date, invoice sequence number, purchase order number, name of school or department service was provided to, period of service, number of hours of service, brief description of services provided, hourly rate, total payment requested.
- 2. Invoices from Agencies or Organizations must include evidence of compliance with section 19 herein:
 - Fingerprinting of Employees and Agents: Agency or organization must provide a current list of all employees, agents and volunteers working at an OUSD site when invoicing, and must include the Department of Justice ATI number for each person, and at statement that subsequent arrest records have been requested for each person listed.
 - ii. Tuberculosis Screening: The list must also include a statement that TB Clearance is on file for each person.
- 9. Status of Contractor: This is not an employment contract. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partner, or joint venture of OUSD, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of OUSD and/or to which OUSD's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all Federal, State, and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees. In the performance of the work herein contemplated, CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor or business entity, with the sole authority for controlling and directing the performance of the details of the work, OUSD being interested only in the results obtained.

10. Insurance:

- 1. Commercial General Liability Insurance: Unless specifically waived by OUSD, the following insurance is required:
 - If CONTRACTOR employs any person to perform work in connection with this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall procure and maintain at all times during the performance of such work, Workers' Compensation Insurance in conformance with the laws of the State of California and Federal laws when applicable. Employers' Liability Insurance shall not be less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident or disease.

- CONTRACTOR is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which require every employer to be insured against liability for workers' compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code, and will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the Work of this Contract.

- iii. CONTRACTOR shall maintain Commercial General Liability insurance, including automobile coverage with limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage. The coverage shall be primary as to OUSD and shall name OUSD as an additional insured. Evidence of insurance must be attached. Endorsement of OUSD as an additional insured shall not affect OUSD's rights to any claim, demand, suit or judgment made, brought or recovered against CONTRACTOR. The policy shall protect CONTRACTOR and OUSD in the same manner as though each were separately issued. Nothing in said policy shall operate to increase the Insurer's liability as set forth in the policy beyond the amount or amounts shown or to which the Insurer would have been liable if only one interest were named as an insured.
- iii. If CONTRACTOR is offering OUSD professional advice under this Contract, CONTRACTOR shall maintain Errors and Omissions insurance or Professional Liability insurance with coverage limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per claim.

OR

- iv. CONTRACTOR is not required to maintain any insurance under this agreement. (Completed and approved Waiver of Insurance Form is required.) Waiver of insurance does not release CONTRACTOR from responsibility for any claim or demand.
- 11. Licenses and Permits: CONTRACTOR shall obtain and keep in force all licenses, permits, and certificates necessary for the performance of this Agreement.

- 12. **Assignment:** The obligations of CONTRACTOR under this Agreement shall not be assigned by CONTRACTOR without the express prior written consent of OUSD.
- 13. Anti-Discrimination. It is the policy of OUSD that in connection with all work performed under Contracts there be no discrimination against any employee engaged in the work because of race, color, ancestry, national origin, religious creed, physical disability, medical condition, marital status, sexual orientation, gender, or age and therefore the CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited to, the California Fair Employment and Housing Act beginning with Government Code Section 12900 and Labor Code Section 1735 and OUSD policy. In addition, the CONTRACTOR agrees to require like compliance by all its subcontractor(s). Contractor shall not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment on the basis of actual or perceived; race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, age, marital status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, veteran status, gender, sex or sexual orientation.
- 14. **Drug-Free / Smoke Free Policy**. No drugs, alcohol, and/or smoking are allowed at any time in any buildings and/or grounds on OUSD property. No students, staff, visitors, CONTRACTORS, or subcontractors are to use drugs on these sites.
- 15. Indemnification: CONTRACTOR agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend OUSD and its officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims or losses accruing or resulting from injury, damage, or death of any person, firm, or corporation in connection with the performance of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR also agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend OUSD and its elective board, officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims or losses incurred by any supplier, contractor, or subcontractor furnishing work, services, or materials to CONTRACTOR in connection with the performance of this Agreement. This provision survives termination of this Agreement.
- 16. Copyright/Trademark/Patent/Ownership. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement shall become the property of OUSD and cannot be used without OUSD's express written permission. OUSD shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark, and/or patent of said matter in the name of OUSD. CONTRACTOR consents to use of CONTRACTOR's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium. These matters include, without limitation, drawings, plans, specifications, studies, reports, memoranda, computation sheets, the contents of computer diskettes, artwork, copy, posters, billboards, photographs, videotapes, audiotapes, systems designs, software, reports, diagrams, surveys, source codes or any other original works of authorship, or other documents prepared by CONTRACTOR or its Sub-CONTRACTORs in connection with the Services performed under this Agreement. All works shall be works for hire as defined under Title 17 of the United States Code, and all copyrights in those works are the property of OUSD.
- 17. **Waiver:** No delay or omission by either party in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right or prevent a similar subsequent act from constituting a violation of the Agreement.
- 18. **Termination:** OUSD may at any time terminate this Agreement upon written notice to CONTRACTOR. OUSD shall compensate CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily provided through the date of termination. In addition, OUSD may terminate this Agreement for cause should CONTRACTOR fail to perform any part of this Agreement. In the event of termination for cause, OUSD may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to OUSD exceeds the cost of providing the services pursuant to this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall pay the additional cost.
- 19. Conduct of Consultant. CONSULTANT will adhere to the following staff requirements and provide OUSD with evidence of staff qualifications, consistent with invoicing requirements outlined in Section 8, which include:
 - 1. Tuberculosis Screening
 - 2. Fingerprinting of Employees and Agents. The fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 apply to CONTRACTOR's services under this Agreement and CONTRACTOR certifies its compliance with these provisions as follows: "CONTRACTOR certifies that CONTRACTOR has complied with the fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 with respect to all CONTRACTOR's employees, subcontractors, agents, and subcontractors' employees or agents ("Employees") regardless of whether those Employees are paid or unpaid, concurrently employed by OUSD, or acting as independent contractors of CONTRACTOR, who may have contact with OUSD pupils in the course of providing services pursuant to the Agreement, and the California Department of Justice has determined that none of those Employees has been convicted of a felony, as that term is defined in Education Code section 45122.1. Contractor further certifies that it has received and reviewed fingerprint results for each of its Employees and Contractor has requested and reviews subsequent arrest records for all Employees who may come into contract with OUSD pupils in providing services to the District under this Agreement.

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In the event that OUSD, in its sole discretion, at any time during the term of this contract, desires the removal of any CONSULTANT related persons, employee, representative or agent from an OUSD school site and, or property, CONSULTANT shall immediately upon receiving notice from OUSD of such desire, cause the removal of such person or persons.

- 20. **No Rights in Third Parties.** This Agreement does not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein.
- 21. OUSD's Evaluation of CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR's Employees and/or Subcontractors. OUSD may evaluate the CONTRACTOR's work in any way that OUSD is entitled to do so pursuant to applicable law. The OUSD's evaluation may include, without limitation:
 - 1. Requesting that OUSD employee(s) evaluate the CONTRACTOR and the CONTRACTOR's employees and subcontractors and each of their performance.
 - 2. Announced and unannounced observance of CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s).

- 22. Limitation of OUSD Liability. Other than as provided in this Agreement, OUSD's financial obligations under this Agreement shall be limited to the payment of the compensation provided in this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event, shall OUSD be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenue, arising out of, or in connection with, this Agreement for the services performed in connection with this Agreement.
- 23. Confidentiality. The CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR's agents, personnel, employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s) shall maintain the confidentiality of all information received in the course of performing the Services. CONTRACTOR understands that student records are confidential and agrees to comply with all state and federal laws concerning the maintenance and disclosure of student records. This requirement to maintain confidentiality shall extend beyond the termination of this Agreement. Contractors will be permitted access to student data only where permissible under state and federal law and only after executing OUSD's Confidentiality Agreement Regarding Student Data.
- 24. Conflict of Interest. CONTRACTOR shall abide by and be subject to all applicable OUSD policies, regulations, statutes or other laws regarding conflict of interest. CONTRACTOR shall not hire any officer or employee of OUSD to perform any service by this Agreement.

CONTRACTOR affirms to the best of his/her/its knowledge, there exists no actual or potential conflict of interest between CONTRACTOR's family, business or financial interest and the services provided under this Agreement, and in the event of change in either private interest or services under this Agreement, any question regarding possible conflict of interest which may arise as a result of such change will be brought to OUSD's attention in writing.

Through its execution of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR acknowledges that it is familiar with the provisions of section 1090 *et seq.* and section 87100 *et seq.* of the Government Code of the State of California, and certifies that it does not know of any facts which constitute a violation of said provisions. In the event CONTRACTOR receives any information subsequent to execution of this Agreement, which might constitute a violation of said provisions, CONTRACTOR agrees it shall notify OUSD in writing.

- 25. Integration/Entire Agreement of Parties. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, and agreements, whether oral or written. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by both Parties.
- 26. **Litigation:** This Agreement shall be performed in Oakland, California and is governed by the laws of the State of California. The Alameda County Superior Court shall have jurisdiction over any state court litigation initiated to enforce or interpret this Agreement. If litigation is initiated, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees and costs.
- 27. Contract Contingent on Governing Board Approval: The District shall not be bound by the terms of this Agreement until it has been formally approved by the District's Governing Board, and no payment shall be owed or made to CONTRACTOR absent formal approval. This Agreement shall be deemed to be approved when it has been signed by the Board of Education, and/or the Superintendent as its designee.
- 28. **Signature Authority:** Each party has the full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement, and the person signing this Agreement on behalf of each Party has been given the proper authority and empowered to enter into this Agreement.
- 29. Counterparts: This Agreement and all amendments and supplements to it may be executed in counterparts, and all counterparts together shall be construed as one document.
- 30. Incorporation of Recitals and Exhibits: The Recitals and each exhibit attached hereto are hereby incorporated herein by reference.
- 31. Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion: The prospective primary participant certifies to the best of its knowledge and belief, that it and its principals: Are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency according to Federal Acquisition Regulation Subpart 9.4, and by signing this contract, certifies that this vendor does not appear on the Excluded Parties List. (EVCCYFS) is to create a safe place to support the development of the "whole child", both in and out of the classroom, through academic, cultural, recreational, mental health and family services. EVCCYFS undertakes these issues by offering integrated and well-rounded services, free of charge, to its students and their families.

History

Since 2001, EVCCYFS has operated the After School Program, Mental Health Services Program, and Family Resource Center at Westlake Middle School in Oakland, CA with the sole purpose of addressing issues of poverty, low academic performance and violence. This is actualized through its mission of providing a safe academic environment that supports the development of the whole child, both in and out of the classroom, through academic, cultural, recreational, mental health and family services.

In 2009, EVCCYFS established itself as an independent 501(c)(3), nonprofit organization in order to provide Westlake families one-stop access to a wide array of public and community services on campus. EVCCYFS is receiving growing recognition as a model of success in the Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) for its early adoption of a Community School framework as well as its unique partnership with Westlake Middle School faculty and staff. The district is now looking at EVCCYFS and its partnership with Westlake Middle School as an exemplary Community School model - one that can be replicated at other school sites.

The Community School framework is gaining momentum across the nation as a key to removing barriers to academic success. Locally, the Oakland Unified School District is using the Community School framework as a blueprint for change and is striving to transform its schools with this model.

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Our Programs

Through the delivery of the Community Schools framework at Westlake, EVCCYFS' partnership with Westlake Middle School is anchored around three core strategies: (1) After School Program, (2) Mental Health Services, and (3) Family Resource Center.

Our After School Program

EVCCYFS' After School Program (ASP) has been in operation since 2001, providing after school education and enrichment support to Westlake Middle School students each school day, commencing immediately upon the conclusion of the regular day and operates until 6pm. ASP is open to all Westlake students, ranging from those performing at or below grade level to high achieving students. Over the past five years, EVCCYFS has delivered 293,893 units of after school service to students, exceeding its projection of 227,168 by 66,725 units of after school service. ASP provides students with a safe, supervised space during out of school time where students engage in a variety of academic, enrichment, recreational, cultural, and athletic programs.

Staff and credentialed teachers operate a daily Homework Center where students gain additional learning time and assistance in completing homework. The student/teacher ratio ranges between 20:1 and 7:1, depending on instructional demand. The program is operated in alignment with California state curricula standards.

For effective delivery of services, EVCCYFS staff members have access to the school's equipment, telecommunications, classrooms, Cafetorium, library, computer lab, music room, gymnasium and playground.

Research by the National Association of Elementary School Principals has shown that, "children gain social skills and self-confidence from interacting with peers and adult role models through enrichment activities and cultural programs such as art and music that are increasingly squeezed out of the school day". To address this issue, EVCCYFS's after school enrichment activities are designed to offer students opportunities to explore and cultivate their creative, artistic and athletic talents through project-based learning clubs involving art, sports, and science-related programs.

Our Mental Health Services program

Our Mental Health Services (MHS) program was established to provide all Westlake students with safe, caring and confidential counseling support so they can be successful both in school and in life. Students' struggles, grief and trauma are often reflected in other behaviors, such as chronic absenteeism, behavior problems in the classroom, low-self esteem and/or poor grades.

EVCCYFS staff became increasingly aware of the preponderance of emotional and mental health issues experienced by students when they joined Westlake's Referral Assessment Management Team (RAM Team), an early intervention program designed to help struggling students. EVCCYFS reached out to community-based mental health providers for support and from those efforts; EVCCYFS's Mental Health Services Program (MHS) was developed. The program provides mental health counseling, case management, health screening and referrals, and parent involvement services to Westlake students and their families. Services include individual and group counseling on-site as well as referrals to other programs if needed. Students access the program through self-referral, or by referral from a parent, caretaker, teacher, counselor or administrator, and their participation is based on parental or caretaker consent. With the help of our partners, EVCCYFS' MHS program has served over 500 students in the past 5 years.

The Family Resource Center

The Family Resource Center (FRC) helps parents and caregivers receive the support they need to help their children become successful and to make family life a bit easier. The FRC provides opportunities for parents and caregivers to access basic resources that will lessen the burden of day-to-day challenges of family living, such as fresh and staple food, emergency student transportation assistance, public benefits enrollment assistance, information and referral to municipal resources for housing, employment, and information and referral to subsidized health insurance, to name a few.

The Family Resource Center coordinates opportunities for parent engagement in their children's success that go beyond the academic day. For example, the FRC holds Back-to-SchoolNight events, BBQs, holiday celebrations, school carnivals, as well as evening classes on yoga, computers, parenting, and other subjects. The FRC works with Westlake's Language Arts department to co-host the school's Family Literacy events The FRC also works with Westlake's Science Department to plan, implement, and execute Family Science Nights.

The Family Resource Center also aims to demystify the school's policies and procedures for families that are uncomfortable or unfamiliar with the school environment and protocols. Family participation in FRC events has increased nearly 300% in the past year, demonstrating the value of EVCCYFS' programs.

The FRC is located near the school's main entrance and is open Monday - Friday, from 8:30 am - 4:30 pm. This office has proven to be a popular space where families can use computers, check out books, or simply sit down and meet with staff or other parents and caretakers. Since the start of the 2011/12 academic year, the FRC has logged over 1,500 contacts with parents and caretakers.
