Wandra Boyd, DAC Chairperson, invited Board Members to the Second Annual Clarence E. Johnson Parent Conference to be held on Saturday, March 3, from 8:30 A.M. to 2:00 P.M. The conference will be held at the Cesar Chavez Education Center on International Boulevard. Workshops will be held on parent empowerment, parent participation and support for parents to increase their student's success.

Morris Tatum, President, AFSCME, Local 257, stated the District's Management Team has been meeting on labor contract issues, including the rewriting of labor contracts and job reclassifications.

Vanessa Brooks, Vice President, SEIU, commented on minutes of November 16 and comments made by Vernon Hal, Deputy Superintendent, Business and Operations, regarding the "bumping" process. She said SEIU employees have been used to balance the budget for the District.

Mynette Theard, President of SEIU, said classified employees at schools are entitled to be addressed on the closing of the five schools. Nothing is in place. They reserve bumping rights and location of reassignment. She said Special Education is an eyesore for her members.

Clementina Duran, OCO, representing Lazear parents, said Lazear parents wish to have input on the transition process. Many Lazear families did not get their first choice and siblings were assigned to different schools.

Olga Gonzalez spoke of the transition process faced by many Lazear families and many are disappointed in the schools their children were assigned. The transition process has not worked for their families.

Teresa Duena, Lazear parent, spoke on the transitions process which created resentment for the students and families.

Keytera Beckford submitted a charter petition renewal request on behalf of American Indian Public Charter School II.

Jo Anna Lougin, Executive Director, UAOS, stated a staff memo was distributed that said to immediately rewrite all labor contracts. She said employees have rights and the District needs to rethink the situation.

Betty Olson-Jones, OEA President, said they were told yesterday that employees are holding meetings about the about the rewrite of labor contracts and current job descriptions. She asked the District not to bargain in public which may be moving toward an unfair labor practice.

Valarie Abad submitted a charter renewal petition for the Conservatory of Instrumental Arts Academy.

Manny Lopez asked questions about process for closing schools and the Mutual Matching Process.

Trish Gorham, OEA, commented on the Mutual Matching process. She said if it were about the kids, the District would not be closing schools. It is about choosing teachers that cost less and non-contractual working conditions.

Oscar Wright said President Barack Obama's recent State-of-the-Union speech included comments on immigrants but did not address the plight of Black America.

Tania Kappner, OEA and BAMN, said it is disgusting that Lazear Elementary School is being closed. She said Black schools are being targeted and that schools of most need of funding and class size reductions have been set up for failure. She said we need to keep the schools open to get the funding.

Jean Cohen, Alameda Labor Council, stated any proposal to change existing contracts and negotiations shall not be bargained in public and the existing contract must be voted on with the union and shall not be broken in public.

Ben Tapscott stated McClymonds is at a deplorable low. The Superintendent has done nothing to rebuild the school. He said four Black schools and one Latino School were closed with racist criteria. The parents should organize to fight the closures.

Janan Apayden, OEA, spoke on the Mutual Matching process. She said the process will lead to greater destabilization in teaching that will adversely affect students in the long run. She said no teacher would attempt to join a staff where they are not welcome and teachers are capable of making a good decision about where they are placed.

J. Report of Regular Board Members

Director Yee reiterated a previous request that the Superintendent post the Facilities Master Plan on the District's web page.

Director Dobbins reported on District 6 activities at Skyline High School, Day of Action at

Havenscourt campus; DAC workshop at Frick Middle School, and Go Public Schools event at Brewer Middle School. Director Dobbins said he attended the recent meeting of the OAL Policy Board Committee meeting. Director Dobbin stated there is an effort to Save Oakland Sports and to support Oakland teams from a business perspective.

Director Gallo thanked the Fremont High School community and OCO for engaging our parents and students to make Fremont a great campus and school. He thanked Life Academy students for volunteering their time in the beautification efforts. He stated Ascend K-8 had their Winter Expo. Director Gallo acknowledged the Lazear community. He said the real issue for the Board is to rescind the school closure at Lazear. It is a school that is committed to raising academic performance and enrollment. Our priority should be to win parents back and provide a quality education.

Vice President Jumoke Hinton Hodge stated on February 23 there will be a Black History Month Symposium acknowledging individuals in the math and science professions and to discuss the impact of STEM in West Oakland. Appreciation was given to District staff for volunteering at the Sunday celebration.

President London said this Friday will be our second green gloves symposium for our custodial staff to talk about best practices.

Gail Greely, Coordinator, Charter Schools Office, said Unity High School is completing its second charter term. The school has a high percentage of students eligible for free reduced lunch. There are many English Learners and increasing number of special needs students. The school has an API of 735 and a state wide rank of 3. The school provides a full service advisory program and has responded to student needs with summer school and after school program. The school seeks to enroll a more diverse student population. Based upon analysis and outcomes over the past year the school is deemed to be academically sound and effective and a viable organization. Staff recommendation is to approve the charter renewal petition, as revised, to require text revisions contained in the staff report.

Vice President Hinton Hodge asked about the school's math program.

David Castillo, principal, Oakland Unity High School, said the school has piloted many things, including math. It is mainly a diagnostic program. They are part of a pilot this year and they are seeing better scores on benchmark assessments this year compared to last year.

Director Gallo asked about the current site's capacity.

Mr. Castillo stated the school is booked solid at 255 and averaging 25 in class size. They plan to grow and are looking for a new facility to allow enrolling 100 ninth graders next year and ultimately grow to 400 students.

Daniel Zavazua, Dean of Students, Oakland Unity, spoke of the supports in place for African American students and off campus programs.

Sam Brewer, teacher and Assistant Principal, addressed the demographic imbalance and obstacles faced at Oakland Unity. He said they are a small school. He runs the recruitment efforts. Many African American students are interested in their program. They are open to visits and ideas and working with other schools and they are participating in more options fairs.

PUBLIC COMMENTS ON THIS ITEM:

Jim Mordecai asked about concurrent enrollment in terms of results. He said the school wrote their charter aiming for the demographics they were aiming for. The Executive Director is on the Board. Has anything happened regarding a conflict of interest and is there any follow up?

Kate Nichol, California Charter Schools Association, stated the school has met and exceeded accountability measures. The school historically has had 200 students on their waiting list and she encouraged the District to partner with charter schools on the Facility Master planning process.

Jennifer LeBarre, Director, Nutrition Services and Zenobia Barlow, Project Director for the Center for Ecoliteracy Feasibility Study Staff, reviewed the Oakland Unified School District Feasibility Study. Ms. LeBarre used a powerpoint to review Executive Summary of the District's Feasibility Study; Finances and Project Cost Estimates through Year 5, Additional Staff Projections, and Yearly Ongoing Operating Revenue vs. Expense Projections. Information was reviewed on Food and Health and Wellness Policy on page

15 of the report, Teaching and Learning and The Dining Experience and Procurement Findings and Recommendations on pages 16-17, Key Findings and Recommendations affecting Facilities for Years one through ten.

BOARD DISCUSSION

Director Dobbins asking about local buying.

Ms. LeBarre said a 250-mile radius is designated local.

Director Gallo said he is still trying to fix Oakland High school for the kids. He said Oakland High School has a closed campus and there are students who find ways to buy their lunches from vendors off site.

Director Gallo commented on the facilities issue and the building of five new kitchens which will have an impact on other areas. He said five custodians were added for the new school health centers.

Director Kakishiba said the priority whether we should be in this business or not is a legitimate question for the Board to decide. He asked if the expansion has any immediate impact on the present work force and if there are professional growth and leadership opportunities? He said the District does not pay food service workers very much and that is a problem.

Ms. LeBarre stated school lunch is reimbursable expense and the expenses are covered.

Vice President Hinton Hodge stated we can create community change through food. She asked who will get the jobs and how are we training for them? Where are our young people in this conversation?

Ms. LeBarre stated she will talk to student leadership to ensure we are going in the right direction. The goal is to increase meal program participation. She said there is the potential to work with charter schools and local school districts. She said the District is looking into partnerships.

PUBLIC COMMENTS ON THIS ITEM:

Allison Rodman, Oakland School Food Alliance (OSFA), spoke in support saying they have done a lot of the research and this is a long project in the making.

Ruth Woodruff, Chabot Elementary School, said it is time for change. It needs to be safe for the kids.

Betty Olson-Jones, OEA President, stated kids do not learn if they do not engage academically and socially.

Ms. LeBarre said the Feasibility Study item would be brought back in March for Board approval.

Director Gallo asked about Fremont High School. He said we did not provide the cafeteria

support to be successful. Students were reaching through the fence to buy lunch from vendors. He said he would like to fix what we have first.
