Many of our purchasing and repair contracts for music supplies were not approved in time to meet budget deadlines. There was a new budget timeline moving all purchasing deadlines up by a month and many new budget procedures which led to many purchase orders being returned because they were needing to be separated because of dollar amounts or other reasons. In addition, procurement was overwhelmed by the number of requests coming from schools at the end of the year and thus some requests were not processed. We were unable to hire a STIP sub due to lack of applicants.

\$90,000	The acquisition of more instruments will allow for an expanded learning experience for our students. This funding will ensure that students have a wider variety of musical experiences. Funds are also needed to repair many of our instruments which are older and no longer functional. Our older instruments continue to break down and need repairs. Proper protection and storage are needed in the form of new cases and instrument racks. We need additional funds for these types of materials because many of our purchasing contracts were not approved in time before budget deadlines last year and so we were unable to acquire the instruments and music	

	supplies that were needed. This year we will essentially be buying two years worth of instruments. A smartboard and sound system will give our students a more immersive music class experience.	
\$10,000	The expansion of our after school music program will provide more students access to specific music programs like Jazz Band and World Music that they may not have time to experience during the regular school day.	The number of students who are able to experience music class at Roosevelt will grow.
\$11,343.91	Students will be able to take Field Trips to places such as Cazadero Music Camp. Students will also get to go on Field Trips which include performance opportunities such as Performance at the Park at Six Flags Great America. The money will be used for transportation, entrance fees, etc.	Students will have greater opportunities to engage with music in real world settings. Students will be able to see professional musicians, give performances themselves and gain .

Art also needs large amounts of consumable supplies such as sketchbooks, canvas, paints, charcoal pencils, pastels, etc.	·

\$65,000	We will hire an additional STIP sub. This person will provide stability and predictability for our students when their normal teacher is not present. During this time, teachers can be out for extended periods with little to no warning. Unpredictability can activate traumatic responses in our students and harm their ability to learn. In addition, this person will provide coverage for teachers so they can meet more often with the families of their students and build partnerships. Lastly, this position will create coverage that will allow teachers to take time to collaborate and plan.	Students will benefit from having more stability and predictability in staffing. Students will benefit from stronger partnerships between teachers and parents/guardians. Students will benefit from stronger and more individualized lesson plans designed to meet their needs.
