#### 1. Music Program

#### **Programmatic Narrative Based on Rubric**

Our new music teacher has done a phenomenal job building on the program that his predecessor created. He has a strong mentor that supports him to create dynamic and varying levels of music programs for our students. In addition, he is working with music artists who come in to provide lessons on specialized instruments. Currently, 160 students are taking music. This includes students in the Newcomer and SDC program as well.

Our proposal is to utilize \$5,000 to buy more musical instruments and materials to provide increased access to quality instruments and key classroom supplies.

#### 2. Art Program

#### **Programmatic Narrative Based on Rubric**

Our Arts Integration Specialist has been working closely with teachers to consultancy to include classroom experiences and perspectives through an arts lens. This has provided students with a more creative and accessible classroom experience.

We would like to provide a student-led mural project on campus. This will require supplies such as spray paint, design materials and cleaning supplies.

In addition, the dance program would like to put on a school-wide performance. The dance teacher would like to begin building a costume wardrobe for her program.

#### 3. World Language Program

### Programmatic Narrative Based on Rubric Our Spanish teacher is in her 2nd year at Elmhurst and has been building momentum in the language program. The Spanish class for native Spanish speakers has increased literacy and communication skills, particularly for students coming from the newcomer program. With a focus on providing Spanish 1 for 6th and 7th graders, we will continue to build a pathway for our Spanish program.

We would like to purchase text sets to support our read, write and talk instructional program in Spanish.

#### 4. 5th to 6th Grade Enrollment Retention

#### **Programmatic Narrative Based on Data Analysis**

Our Case Manager has been working closely with 6th grade students, families and teachers to support a positive transition to 6th grade. We are continuing to see students enter 6th grade with a need to develop skills in communication, problem solving and inter-relational skills. Our Case Manager has established strong, positive relationships with many students. This provides space for them to hold mediations and better support students to be successful in class.

We are seeing a number of 6th grade students who need continued academic support. We would like to offer after-school tutoring for students. Many of the sixth graders are really struggling with the transition to 6th grade. They are experiencing higher expectations and more academic rigor in many of their classes. From Marking Period 2, 122/260 (47%) of 6th graders received below a 3.0 GPA. Tutoring opportunities will support 6th graders to see more success and be retained in our school.

In addition, we would like the 6th grade restorative justice, counselor and AP team to do home visits with 6th grade students who are having challenges during the transition to middle school. Challenges include: chronic absence, low academic performance, and behavior issues. Home visits will allow our staff to build strong family partnerships and learn more from the family's perspective in order to better serve students. Strong family partnerships will retain our families through middle school.

#### 5. Safe and Positive School Culture

#### **Programmatic Narrative Based on Data Analysis**

Our Restorative Justice Facilitator is working closely with our Assistant Principal and counselor to create positive Tier 1 experiences for 6th graders. They hold community building activities in Homeroom, rotating so that they serve all 6th grade students. The RJ facilitator has built positive relationships and gained trust among students and families in order to support them in times of conflict.

Because the RJ Facilitator is new to the work as well other RJ Facilitators on campus, we would like to provide coaching for this role. We also want to provide a professional development opportunity for our 6th grade leadership team to increase their coaching tools and skillsets.
