



Highlights from Schools

OUSD Students are Rooted in Reading


We recently challenged all OUSD students to get [#RootedinReading](#) by reading as much as possible and then completing i-Ready reading lessons every week.



Enrollment

- 21.2% or 7,253 Students in OUSD are African American.
 - *52.4% are African American Male.*
 - *47.6% are African American Female.*
- 27% or 1,981 of the enrolled African American students have Special Education Supports.




Chronic Absence



- 54.7% of all African American students YTD are chronically absent.
- This is a 11.6 percentage point increase for African American students since October 2021.
- COVID -19 positive testing protocols along with the shortened number of days in the year so far explain some of the inflated Chronic Absence rates for African American students.
- MetWest and Sojourner Truth are excluded in this snapshot.


Suspensions




- 6.2 % of all OUSD African American students have been suspended.
- The number and proportion of unique students suspended since October 2021 has more than doubled.
- Only 3.9% of all OUSD students suspended YTD.

Suspension Incidents




Disproportionality Explained



- African American students make up 21% of the overall OUSD population.
- 6.2% of African American students are suspended district wide.
- The African American students that are suspended make up 58% of all students suspension incidents YTD.

iReady



- 21.2% of AA Elementary students are performing “early on grade” or “Mid above grade level” at the mid- year assessment window.
- There is a 8.6 percentage point increase between the fall and mid-year assessments for African American students.



Vaccine-eligible student vaccination rate




Vaccine-eligible student vaccination rate by board district

Dashboard is updated nightly. Data here include COVID-19 vaccination data in our student information system up to yesterday.

Testing Program

- OUSD COVID-19 Testing is successfully testing 6,000+ people every week
- OUSD Testing Positivity Rate has dropped to 1.6%
 - Pooled testing has resumed at elementary sites
- All sites either have access to weekly on-site rapid or pooled testing (K-12), or at-home test kits (ECE)
- County Positivity Rate has dropped to 5%
- Preparations are underway for at-home test kit distribution for spring break

Covid Testing Implementation Update

- Weekly Pooled Testing Pilot running at elementary schools.
- Drop-in Weekly Testing at Secondary.
- At-home tests provided for weekly use at ECE sites.




Weekly COVID-19 Testing at OUSD Sites 2021-22





Cumulative count of COVID-19 tests administered since the start of the 2021-22 school year



Weekly Districtwide Data

Dashboard last updated on 3/1/2022

Dashboard is updated daily at 7am to include all reported cases with presumed positive dates occurring in the prior week (2/21/2022 to 2/27/2022), as well as full at-home classroom quarantines for dates up to 01/10/22. Cases for the current week of 2/28/2022 will not be reflected in the dashboard until the following Monday. Counts include cases reported for OUSD school-based staff and students who were physically present on school campuses during their infectious period for COVID-19. Data may be incomplete depending on when the case was reported/confirmed and when contact tracing was completed. The presumed positive date is the earlier of first symptom onset or positive test collection date. Pursuant to updated guidance from ACPHD and CDPH as of 01/10/2022, classroom at-home quarantines will no longer be initiated following multiple cases.

Weekly count of classrooms in full at-home quarantine

Graph shows the weekly count of classrooms with at least 1 day during the week in full at-home quarantine. Full at-home quarantines may last up to 10 days after the date of on-site exposure and thus 1 classroom may be represented across multiple weeks (depending on when cases are reported to us). Effective beginning the week of 08/30/21, high schools are not undergoing modified quarantines, and thus high school full at-home quarantines initiated by one positive case are no longer reflected here. Only TK-8 and early childhood classrooms with 3+ potentially epidemiologically linked cases prior to the week of 01/10/22 are reflected here, following new guidance from ACPHD and CDPH regarding classroom at-home quarantines.
