13.0 Governance / **Compliance:** This Subcontract shall be governed by the laws of the State of California, without giving effect to conflict of law principles. Subcontractor shall also comply with all applicable

Federal and state laws, regulations, standards, orders, and requirements.

14.0 Disputes: The parties will attempt to settle any dispute, claim or controversy arising out of or relating to this Subcontract or the breach, termination, enforcement, interpretation or validity thereof, including the determination of the scope (hereinafter a "Dispute"), through good faith negotiations. Such negotiations shall take place face to face, between representatives authorized to settle the Dispute, within 30 days from the date one party provides the other party with written notice of a Dispute and the legal and factual basis for such Dispute (hereinafter the "Negotiations"). Only in the event that a Dispute cannot be resolved through such good faith Negotiations, either party may submit the Dispute to arbitration in San Francisco, California. The arbitration shall be administered by JAMS pursuant to its Comprehensive Arbitration Rules and Procedures. No party shall file an arbitration demand or complaint until the parties have engaged in good faith Negotiations and such Negotiations have ended in an impasse. Judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrators may be entered in any court having jurisdiction. This clause shall not preclude parties from seeking provisional remedies in aid of arbitration from a court of appropriate jurisdiction. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no Dispute concerning a party's or a third party's rights in or to intellectual property protected in accordance with Federal law (an IP Dispute") shall be subject to arbitration and any such IP Dispute may be filed only in a federal court of competent jurisdiction, subject to the obligation to participate in Negotiations, as set forth herein.

A-C. Salaries and Wages; Fringe Benefits

Employee salaries and benefits are based upon a calendar-year salary schedule as agreed upon by the Oakland Unified School District and the United Administrators of Oakland Schools (UAOS). Salaries include the actual days worked for each employee and earned leave, e.g., holidays, vacations, sick leave, etc. Salary rates are current actual rates. Benefits include worker's compensation, unemployment tax, retirement, medical/dental, life insurance, disability insurance, and other staff benefits.

Hourly wages for teachers (*Other Personnel*) are based on an agreement between the Oakland Unified School District and the Oakland Education Association (OEA.) Extended contract work outside teachers' regular work hours is to be compensated at a rate of \$38.50 per hour, plus benefits. Actual benefits vary between individuals based on selected health insurance plans, numbers of dependents, etc., but are estimated at 30% of the hourly extended contract rate.

Senior Personnel

Samuel Berg will serve as project director for the external evaluation, at 15% FTE, which is equivalent to 1.5 months or 34 days. He will be responsible for managing all aspects of the project, including communicating with project staff; monitoring progress; overseeing the budget; data collection and analysis; and report writing.

Brenda Tuohy will serve as Senior Personnel on this project, at 15% FTE, which is equivalent to 1.5 months or 34 days. She will be responsible for the ongoing Professional Learning Community of teachers participating in this project, including planning and facilitating ongoing meetings and professional development sessions, as well as providing follow-up and coaching support for individual participants.

Courtney Ortega, who is also serving as Senior Personnel on this project is estimated to be spending 10% of her time dedicated to this project. We are not seeking funds for her salary, as she is funded as a permanent district employee and has the full support of her supervisors to allocate time and resources to this project.

This budget contains support for all of the time that will be needed by senior personnel to execute this project.

Other Personnel

In Year 1, a team of OUSD educators--3 with expertise in middle school computer science and 3 with expertise in middle school mathematics--will be selected as the first cohort of teachers (Cohort 1) in this project. They will meet for 8-two hour sessions in the Fall of 2021 to develop the data science unit, and 8-two hour sessions in the Spring of 2022 to prepare, pilot, and revise the unit.

In Year 2, the first cohort of teachers will be joined by up to 9 additional computer science teachers who will attend a 3-day summer institute (20 hours) to learn about data science and the unit developed to teach data science to middle school students. This training will be facilitated in-part by the teachers from Cohort 1, who will dedicate an additional two hours to the project during the institute (22 hours.) This group of teachers (Cohort 1 & Cohort 2) will meet for an additional 6-two hour sessions throughout the year to prepare to implement and reflect upon the implementation of the data science unit.

E. Travel

Per diem and mileage is charged at Oakland Unified School District's approved reimbursement rates. Airfare estimates are based on current average round-trip coach fares. Lodging is based on average rates for various cities. For each trip, other expenses include ground transportation (including shuttles, taxis, or trains), parking, tolls, and incidentals.

In Year 1 and 2, Samuel Berg will attend PI meetings. In Year 2, a two-person team comprised on one member of the OUSD Senior Personnel and one teacher from the project will attend the SIGCSE conference and the California Mathematics Council (CMC) North conference to share their process and results with the larger computer science and mathematics communities.

G. Other Direct Costs

G1. Materials and Supplies. This category includes costs of office supplies required for all meetings, teacher collaboration sessions, summer institutes, and leadership team, and advisory team meetings.

G6. Other

Copying and Shared Equipment. This category includes all general office fees for copier leases and usage of scanners, copiers and printers in the OUSD STEM office. Special printing and graphics expenses will be charged directly to the project contract. An outside printing vendor will be engaged to do bulk printing of the unit plan materials that will be provided to the piloting teachers.

Educational Fees. This category includes registration fees for the SIGCSE and CMS-North conferences, attended by two OUSD staff in Year 2.

Refreshments. This category includes light refreshments for teachers participating in the Professional Learning Community and other meetings that take place after school hours, as well as lunch during the 3-day summer institute in Year 2.

The Indirect Costs are determined by the California Department of Education (CDE) is based on expenditures from previous years. Current Indirect Costs for the Oakland Unified School District are set at 5.56% of the overall award amount.


