## SERVICES AGREEMENT 2022-2025 - NO COST

This Services Agreement ("Agreement") is a legally binding contract entered into between the Oakland Unified School District ("OUSD") and the below named entity or individual ("VENDOR," together with OUSD, "PARTIES"):
Oakland Natives Give Back Fund, Inc.
The PARTIES hereby agree as follows:

## 1. Term.

a. This Agreement shall start on the below date ("Start Date"):

June 1, 2022
If no Start Date is entered, then the Start Date shall be the latest of the dates on which each of the PARTIES signed this Agreement.
b. The work shall be completed no later than the below date ("End Date"):

## June 30, 2025

If no End Date is entered, then the End Date shall be the first June 30 after the Start Date. If the term set forth above would cause the Agreement to exceed the term limits set forth in Education Code section 17596, the Agreement shall instead automatically terminate upon reaching said term limit.
2. Services. VENDOR shall provide the services ("Services") as described in \#1A and \#1B of Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. To the extent that there may be a school closure (e.g., due to poor air quality, planned loss of power, COVID-19) or similar event in which school sites and/or District offices may be closed or otherwise inaccessible, VENDOR shall describe in \#1B of Exhibit A whether and how its services would be able to continue.
3. Alignment. VENDOR agrees to work and communicate with OUSD staff, both formally and informally, to ensure that the Services are aligned with OUSD's mission and are meeting the needs of students as determined by OUSD.
4. Inspection and Approval. VENDOR agrees that OUSD has the right and agrees to provide OUSD with the opportunity to inspect any and all aspects of the Services performed including, but not limited to, any records or other materials (physical or electronic) produced, created, edited, modified, reviewed, or otherwise used in the preparation, performance, or evaluation of the Services. One example of such records or other materials is proof of VENDOR compliance with Section 16.b (Fingerprinting/Criminal Background Investigation). The Services performed by VENDOR must meet the approval of OUSD, and OUSD reserves the right to direct VENDOR to redo the Services, in whole or in part, if OUSD, in its sole discretion, determines that the Services were not performed in accordance with this Agreement.
5. Data and Information Requests. VENDOR shall timely provide OUSD with any data and information OUSD reasonably requests regarding students to whom the Services are provided. VENDOR shall register with and maintain current information within OUSD's Community Partner database unless OUSD communicates to VENDOR in writing otherwise, based on OUSD's determination that the Services are not related to community school outcomes. If and when VENDOR's programs and school site(s) change (either midyear or in subsequent years), VENDOR shall promptly update the information in the database.

## 6. Confidentiality and Data Privacy.

a. OUSD may share information with VENDOR pursuant to this Agreement in order to further the purposes thereof. VENDOR and all VENDOR's agents, personnel, employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s) shall maintain the confidentiality of all information received in the course of performing the Services, provided such information is (i) marked or identified as "confidential" or "privileged," or (ii) reasonably understood to be confidential or privileged.
b. VENDOR understands that student data is confidential. If VENDOR will access or receive identifiable student data, other than directory information, in connection with this Agreement, VENDOR agrees to do so only after VENDOR and OUSD execute a separate data sharing agreement.
(i) If VENDOR is a software vendor, it agrees to access or
receive identifiable student data, other than directory information, only after executing a California Student Data Privacy Agreement ("CSDPA") or CSDPA Exhibit E (available here).
(ii) If VENDOR is not a software vendor, it agrees to access or receive identifiable student data, other than directory information, only after executing the OUSD Data Sharing Agreement (available here).
(iii) Notwithstanding Paragraph 27 (Indemnification), should VENDOR access or receive identifiable student data, other than directory information, without first executing a separate data sharing agreement, VENDOR shall be solely liable for any and all claims or losses resulting from its access or receipt of such data.
c. All confidentiality requirements, including those set forth in the separate data sharing agreement, extend beyond the termination of this Agreement.

## 7. Copyright/Trademark/Patent/Ownership.

a. VENDOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement, excluding (i) any intellectual property that existed prior to execution of this Agreement ("Prior Property"), and (ii) VENDOR Property, shall be works for hire as defined under Title 17 of the United States Code, and all copyrights in those works are the property of OUSD. These matters include, without limitation, drawings, plans, specifications, studies, reports, memoranda, computation sheets, the contents of computer diskettes, artwork, copy, posters, billboards, photographs, videotapes, audiotapes, systems designs, software, reports, diagrams, surveys, source codes or any other original works of authorship, or other documents prepared by VENDOR, its employees, or its subcontractors in connection with the Services performed under this Agreement. Other than Prior Property and VENDOR Property, VENDOR cannot use, reproduce, distribute, publicly display, perform, alter, remix, or build upon matters produced under this Agreement without OUSD's express written permission. OUSD shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to register the copyright, trademark, and/or patent of said matter in the name of OUSD. OUSD may, with VENDOR's prior written
consent, use VENDOR's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium.
a. VENDOR Property. Subject to the limited rights expressly granted hereunder, VENDOR and its licensors or suppliers own all right, title, and interest in and to all intellectual property developed by VENDOR regarding its programs, whether Prior Property or developed during the course of the Agreement, to enable it to render the services under this Agreement, including, without limitation, all intellectual property related to the Every Day Counts Attendance Challenges program and all other programs of VENDOR, including but not limited to those identified in the Scope of Work attached to Exhibit A, along with all related program documentation, materials, content, and specifications, and all modifications, enhancements, improvements, and all derivative works thereto (collectively, "VENDOR Property"). Reports, communications, and similar work product prepared by VENDOR for OUSD in the course of OUSD's administration and oversight of VENDOR's services, including, but not limited to, OUSD's evaluation of the program and status updates regarding the services, shall not be considered VENDOR Property.
8. Compensation. VENDOR agrees to provide the Services at no cost to OUSD.
9. Equipment and Materials. VENDOR shall provide all equipment, materials, and supplies necessary for the performance of this Agreement.

## 10. Termination and Suspension.

a. For Convenience by OUSD. OUSD may at any time terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to VENDOR. Upon approval by OUSD legal counsel, the OUSD Superintendent or an OUSD Chief or Deputy may issue the termination notice without approval by the OUSD Governing Board, in which case this Agreement would terminate upon ratification of the termination by the OUSD Governing Board or thirty (30) days after the notice was provided, whichever is later.
b. Due to Unforeseen Emergency or Act of God. Notwithstanding

Paragraph 19 (Coronavirus/ COVID-19) or any other language of this Agreement, if there is an unforeseen emergency or an Act of God during the term of this Agreement that would prohibit or limit, at the sole discretion of OUSD, the ability of VENDOR to perform the Services, OUSD may terminate this Agreement upon seven (7) days prior written notice to VENDOR. Upon approval by OUSD legal counsel, the OUSD Superintendent or an OUSD Chief or Deputy may issue the termination notice without approval by the OUSD Governing Board, in which case this Agreement would terminate upon ratification of the termination by the OUSD Governing Board or seven (7) days after the notice was provided, whichever is later.
c. For Cause. Either PARTY may terminate this Agreement by giving written notice of its intention to terminate for cause to the other PARTY. Written notice shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate. Cause shall include (i) material violation of this Agreement or (ii) if either PARTY is adjudged bankrupt, makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors, or a receiver is appointed on account of its insolvency. Upon approval by OUSD legal counsel, the OUSD Superintendent or an OUSD Chief or Deputy may issue the termination notice without approval by the OUSD Governing Board, in which case this Agreement would terminate upon ratification of the termination by the OUSD Governing Board or three (3) days after the notice was provided, whichever is later, unless the condition or violation ceases or satisfactory arrangements for the correction are made.
d. Upon termination, VENDOR shall provide OUSD with all materials produced, maintained, or collected by VENDOR pursuant to this Agreement, whether or not such materials are complete or incomplete or are in final or draft form.
e. If OUSD, at its sole discretion, develops health and safety concerns related to the VENDOR's provision of Services, then the OUSD Superintendent or an OUSD Chief or Deputy may, upon approval by OUSD legal counsel, issue a notice to VENDOR to suspend the Agreement, in which case VENDOR shall stop providing Services under the Agreement until further notice from OUSD. OUSD shall compensate VENDOR for Services satisfactorily provided through the date of suspension.
11. Legal Notices. All legal notices provided for under this Agreement shall be sent: (i) via email to the email address set forth below,(ii) personally delivered during normal business hours, or (ii) sent by U.S. Mail (certified, return receipt requested) with postage prepaid to the other PARTY at the address set forth below.

Notice shall be effective when received if personally served or emailed or, if mailed, three days after mailing. Either PARTY must give written notice of a change of mailing address or email.
12. Status.
a. This is not an employment contract. VENDOR, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. VENDOR understands and agrees that it and any and all of its employees shall not be considered employees of OUSD, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of OUSD and/or to which OUSD's employees are normally entitled, including, but
not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. VENDOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all Federal, State, and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to VENDOR's employees.
b. If VENDOR is a natural person, VENDOR verifies all of the following:
(i) VENDOR is free from the control and direction of OUSD in connection with VENDOR's work;
(ii) VENDOR's work is outside the usual course of OUSD's business; and
(iii) VENDOR is customarily engaged in an independently established trade, occupation, or business of the same nature as that involved in the work performed for OUSD.
c. If VENDOR is a business entity, VENDOR verifies all of the following:
(i) VENDOR is free from the control and direction of OUSD in connection with the performance of the work;
(ii) VENDOR is providing services directly to OUSD rather than to customers of OUSD;
(iii) the contract between OUSD and VENDOR is in writing;
(iv) VENDOR has the required business license or business tax registration, if the work is performed in a jurisdiction that requires VENDOR to have a business license or business tax registration;
(v) VENDOR maintains a business location that is separate from the business or work location of OUSD;
(vi) VENDOR is customarily engaged in an independently established business of the same nature as that involved in the work performed;
(vii) VENDOR actually contracts with other businesses to provide the same or similar services and maintains a clientele without restrictions from OUSD;
(viii) VENDOR advertises and holds itself out to the public as available to provide the same or similar services;
(ix) VENDOR provides its own tools, vehicles, and equipment to perform the services;
(x) VENDOR can negotiate its own rates;
(xi) VENDOR can set its own hours and location of work; and
(xii) VENDOR is not performing the type of work for which a
license from the Contractor's State License Board is required, pursuant to Chapter 9 (commencing with section 7000) of Division 3 of the Business and Professions Code.

## 13. Qualifications and Training.

a. VENDOR represents and warrants that VENDOR has the qualifications and ability to perform the Services in a professional manner, without the advice, control or supervision of OUSD. VENDOR will perform the Services in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of its profession for services to California school districts and in accordance with applicable laws, codes, rules, regulations, and/or ordinances. All VENDOR employees and agents shall have sufficient skill and experience to perform the work assigned to them.
b. VENDOR represents and warrants that its employees and agents are specially trained, experienced, competent and fully licensed to provide the Services identified in this Agreement in conformity with the laws and regulations of the State of California, the United States of America, and all local laws, ordinances and/or regulations, as they may apply, if VENDOR was selected, at least in part, on such representations and warrants.
14. Certificates/Permits/Licenses/Registration. VENDOR's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such certificates, permits, licenses and registration as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of Services pursuant to this Agreement.
15. Insurance.
a. Commercial General Liability Insurance. Unless specifically waived by OUSD as noted in Exhibit A, VENDOR shall maintain Commercial General Liability Insurance, including automobile coverage, with limits of at least one million dollars ( $\$ 1,000,000$ ) per occurrence and two million dollars $(\$ 2,000,000)$ aggregate for corporal punishment, sexual misconduct, harassment, bodily injury and property damage. The coverage shall be primary as to OUSD and shall name

OUSD as an additional insured with the additional insured endorsement provided to OUSD within 15 days of effective date of this Agreement (and within 15 days of each new policy year thereafter during the term of this Agreement). Evidence of insurance shall be attached to this Agreement or otherwise provided to OUSD upon request. Endorsement of OUSD as an additional insured shall not affect OUSD's rights to any claim, demand, suit or judgment made, brought or recovered against VENDOR. The policy shall protect VENDOR and OUSD in the same manner as though each were separately issued. Nothing in said policy shall operate to increase the Insurer's liability as set forth in the policy beyond the amount or amounts shown or to which the Insurer would have been liable if only one interest were named as an insured.
b. Workers' Compensation Insurance. VENDOR shall procure and maintain at all times during the performance of such work, Workers' Compensation Insurance in conformance with the laws of the State of California (including, but not limited to, Labor Code section 3700) and Federal laws when applicable. Employers' Liability Insurance shall not be less than one million dollars $(\$ 1,000,000)$ per accident or disease.

## 16. Testing and Screening.

a. Tuberculosis Screening. Unless specifically waived by OUSD as noted in Exhibit A, VENDOR is required to screen employees who will be working at OUSD sites for more than six hours. VENDOR agents who work with students must submit to a tuberculosis risk assessment as required by Education Code section 49406 within the prior 60 days. If tuberculosis risk factors are identified, VENDOR agents must submit to an intradermal or other approved tuberculosis examination to determine that he/she is free of infectious tuberculosis. If the results of the examination are positive, VENDOR shall obtain an x-ray of the lungs. VENDOR, at its discretion, may choose to submit the agent to the examination instead of the risk assessment.
b. Fingerprinting/Criminal Background Investigation. Unless specifically waived by OUSD as noted in Exhibit A, for all VENDOR employees, subcontractors, volunteers, and agents providing the Services, VENDOR shall ensure completion of
fingerprinting and criminal background investigation, and shall request and regularly review subsequent arrest records. VENDOR confirms that no employee, subcontractor, volunteer, or agent providing the Services has been convicted of a felony, as that term is defined in Education Code section 45122.1. VENDOR shall provide the results of the investigations and subsequent arrest notifications to OUSD.
Waivers are not available for VENDORS whose employees, subcontractors, volunteers, and agents will have any contact with OUSD students.
c. VENDOR shall use either California Department of Justice or Be A Mentor, Inc. (http://beamentor.org/OUSDPartner) finger-printing and subsequent arrest notification services.
VENDOR agrees to immediately remove or cause the removal of any employee, representative, agent, or person under VENDOR's control person from OUSD property upon receiving notice from OUSD of such desire. OUSD is not required to provide VENDOR with a basis or explanation for the removal request.

## 17. Incident/Accident/Mandated Reporting.

a. VENDOR shall notify OUSD, via email pursuant to Paragraph 11 (Legal Notices), within twelve (12) hours of learning of any significant accident or incident in connection with provision of the Services. Examples of a significant accident or incident include, without limitation, an accident or incident that involves law enforcement, possible or alleged criminal activity, or possible or actual exposure to a communicable disease such as COVID-19. VENDOR shall properly submit required accident or incident reports within one business day pursuant to the procedures specified by OUSD. VENDOR shall bear all costs of compliance with this Paragraph.
b. To the extent that an employee, subcontractor, agent, or representative of VENDOR is included on the list of mandated reporters found in Penal Code section 11165.7, VENDOR agrees to inform the individual, in writing that they are a mandated reporter, and describing the associated obligations to report suspected cases of abuse and neglect pursuant to Penal Code section 11166.5.

## 18. Coronavirus/COVID-19.

a. Through its execution of this Agreement, VENDOR declares that it is able to meet its obligations and perform the Services required pursuant to this Agreement in accordance with any shelter-in-place (or similar) order or curfew (or similar) order ("Orders") issued by local or state authorities and with any social distancing/hygiene (or similar) requirements.
b. Consistent with the requirements of Paragraph 17 (Incident/Accident/Mandated Reporting), VENDOR agrees to notify OUSD, via email pursuant to Paragraph 11 (Legal Notices), within twelve (12) hours if VENDOR or any employee, subcontractor, agent, or representative of VENDOR (i) tests positive for COVID-19 or shows or reports symptoms consistent with COVID-19,, and has been on OUSD property or has been in prolonged close contact with any OUSD student or student's family member, staff, agents, representatives, officers, consultants, trustees, and volunteers within 48 hours of testing positives for COVID-19 or the development of symptoms consistent with COVID-19.
c. In addition to the requirements of subdivision (b), VENDOR agrees to immediately adhere to and follow any OUSD directives regards health and safety protocols including, but not limited to, providing OUSD with information regarding possible exposure of OUSD student or student's family member, staff, agents, representatives, officers, consultants, trustees, and volunteers to VENDOR or any employee, subcontractor, agent, or representative of VENDOR and information necessary to perform contact tracing, as well as complying with any OUSD testing and vaccination requirements.
d. VENDOR shall bear all costs of compliance with this Paragraph, including but not limited to those imposed by this Agreement.
19. Assignment. The obligations of VENDOR under this Agreement shall not be assigned by VENDOR without the express prior written consent of OUSD and any assignment without the express prior written consent of OUSD shall be null and void.
20. Non-Discrimination. It is the policy of OUSD that in connection with
all work performed under Contracts there be no discrimination because of race, color, ancestry, national origin, religious creed, physical disability, medical condition, marital status, sexual orientation, gender, or age; therefore, VENDOR agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited to, the California Fair Employment and Housing Act beginning with Government Code section 12900 and Labor Code section 1735 and OUSD policy. In addition, VENDOR agrees to require like compliance by all its subcontractor (s). VENDOR shall not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment on the basis of actual or perceived; race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, age, marital status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, veteran status, gender, sex, sexual orientation, or other legally protected class.
21. Drug-Free/Smoke Free Policy. No drugs, alcohol, and/or smoking are allowed at any time in any buildings and/or grounds on OUSD property. No students, staff, visitors, VENDORS, or subcontractors are to use controlled substances, alcohol or tobacco on these sites.
22. Waiver. No delay or omission by either PARTY in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right or prevent a subsequent act from constituting a violation of this Agreement.
23. No Rights in Third Parties. This Agreement does not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein.
24. Conflict of Interest.
a. VENDOR shall abide by and be subject to all applicable regulations, statutes, or other laws regarding conflict of interest. VENDOR shall not hire any officer or employee of OUSD to perform any service by this Agreement without the prior approval of OUSD Human Resources.
b. VENDOR affirms to the best of his/her/its knowledge, there exists no actual or potential conflict of interest between VENDOR's family, business or financial interest and the services provided under this Agreement, and in the event of change in either private interest or services under this

Agreement, any question regarding possible conflict of interest which may arise as a result of such change will be brought to OUSD's attention in writing.
c. Through its execution of this Agreement, VENDOR acknowledges that it is familiar with the provisions of section 1090 et seq. and section 87100 et seq. of the Government Code, and certifies that it does not know of any facts which constitute a violation of said provisions. In the event VENDOR receives any information subsequent to execution of this Agreement which might constitute a violation of said provisions, VENDOR agrees it shall notify OUSD in writing.
25. Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion. Through its execution of this Agreement, VENDOR certifies to the best of its knowledge and belief, that it and its principals are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency according to Federal Acquisition Regulation Subpart 9.4, and by signing this contract, certifies that this vendor does not appear on the Excluded Parties List (https://www.sam.gov/).
26. Limitation of OUSD Liability. OUSD shall have no financial obligations under this Agreement other than as provided in this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event shall OUSD be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenue, arising out of, or in connection with, this Agreement for the Services performed in connection with this Agreement.

## 27. Indemnification.

a. To the furthest extent permitted by California law, VENDOR shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless OUSD, its Governing Board, agents, representatives, officers, consultants, employees, trustees, and volunteers ("OUSD Indemnified Parties") from any and all claims or losses accruing or resulting from injury, damage, or death of any person or entity arising out of VENDOR's performance of this Agreement. VENDOR also agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend OUSD

Indemnified Parties from any and all claims or losses incurred by any supplier, VENDOR, or subcontractor furnishing work, services, or materials to VENDOR arising out of the performance of this Agreement. VENDOR shall, to the fullest extent permitted by California law, defend OUSD Indemnified Parties at VENDOR's own expense, including attorneys' fees and costs, and OUSD shall have the right to accept or reject any legal representation that VENDOR proposes to defend OUSD Indemnified Parties.
b. To the furthest extent permitted by California law, OUSD shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless VENDOR, its Board, agents, representatives, officers, consultants, employees, trustees, and volunteers ("VENDOR Indemnified Parties") from any and all claims or losses accruing or resulting from injury, damage, or death of any person or entity arising out of OUSD's performance of this Agreement. OUSD shall, to the fullest extent permitted by California law, defend VENDOR Indemnified Parties at OUSD's own expense, including attorneys' fees and costs.
28. Audit. VENDOR shall establish and maintain books, records, and systems of account, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, reflecting all business operations of VENDOR transacted under this Agreement. VENDOR shall retain these books, records, and systems of account during the term of this Agreement and for three (3) years after the End Date. VENDOR shall permit OUSD, its agent, other representatives, or an independent auditor to audit, examine, and make excerpts, copies, and transcripts from all books and records, and to make audit(s) of all records and other data related to Services covered by this Agreement. Audit(s) may be performed at any time, provided that OUSD shall give reasonable prior notice to VENDOR and shall conduct audit(s) during VENDOR'S normal business hours, unless VENDOR otherwise consents.
29. Litigation. This Agreement shall be deemed to be performed in Oakland, California and is governed by the laws of the State of California, but without resort to California's principles and laws regarding conflict of laws. The Alameda County Superior Court shall have jurisdiction over any litigation initiated to enforce or interpret this Agreement.
30. Incorporation of Recitals and Exhibits. Any recitals and exhibits attached to this Agreement are incorporated herein by reference. VENDOR agrees that to the extent any recital or document incorporated herein conflicts with any term or provision of this Agreement, the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall govern.
31. Integration/Entire Agreement of Parties. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the PARTIES and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, and agreements, whether oral or written. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by both PARTIES.
32. Severability. If any term, condition or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.
33. Provisions Required By Law Deemed Inserted. Each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted in this Agreement shall be deemed to be inserted herein and this Agreement shall be read and enforced as though it were included therein.
34. Captions and Interpretations. Section and paragraph headings in this Agreement are used solely for convenience, and shall be wholly disregarded in the construction of this Agreement. No provision of this Agreement shall be interpreted for or against a PARTY because that PARTY or its legal representative drafted such provision, and this Agreement shall be construed as if jointly prepared by the PARTIES.
35. Calculation of Time. For the purposes of this Agreement, "days" refers to calendar days unless otherwise specified and "hours" refers to hours regardless of whether it is a work day, weekend, or holiday.
36. Counterparts and Electronic Signature. This Agreement, and all amendments, addenda, and supplements to this Agreement, may be executed in one or more counterparts, all of which shall constitute one and the same amendment. Any counterpart may be executed
and delivered by facsimile or other electronic signature (including portable document format) by either PARTY and, notwithstanding any statute or regulations to the contrary (including, but not limited to, Government Code section 16.5 and the regulations promulgated therefrom), the counterpart shall legally bind the signing PARTY and the receiving PARTY may rely on the receipt of such document so executed and delivered electronically or by facsimile as if the original had been received. Through its execution of this Agreement, each PARTY waives the requirements and constraints on electronic signatures found in statute and regulations including, but not limited to, Government Code section 16.5 and the regulations promulgated therefrom.
37. Agreement Publicly Posted. This Agreement, its contents, and all incorporated documents are public documents and will be made available by OUSD to the public online via the Internet.

## 38. Signature Authority.

a. Each PARTY has the full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement, and the person(s) signing this Agreement on behalf of each PARTY has been given the proper authority and empowered to enter into this Agreement.
b. Notwithstanding subparagraph (a), only the Superintendent, Chiefs, Deputy Chiefs, and the General Counsel have been delegated the authority to sign contracts for OUSD, and only under limited circumstances, which require ratification by the OUSD Governing Board. VENDOR agrees not to accept the signature of another other OUSD employee as having the proper authority and empowered to enter into this Agreement or as legally binding in any way.
c. Notwithstanding Paragraph 10, if this Agreement is executed by the signature of the Superintendent, Chiefs, Deputy Chiefs, or General Counsel under their delegated authority, and the Board thereafter declines to ratify the Agreement, the Agreement shall automatically terminate on the date that the Board declines to ratify it. Upon termination, VENDOR shall provide OUSD with all materials produced, maintained, or collected by VENDOR pursuant to this Agreement, whether or not such materials are complete or incomplete or are in final or draft form.
39. Contract Contingent on Governing Board Approval. OUSD shall not be bound by the terms of this Agreement unless and until it has been (i) formally approved by OUSD's Governing Board or (ii) validly and properly executed by the OUSD Superintendent, the General Counsel, or a Chief or Deputy Chief authorized by the Education Code or Board Policy, and no payment shall be owed or made to VENDOR absent such formal approval or valid and proper execution.

The Oakland Natives Give Back Fund, Inc. (ONGB) is a non-profit organization committed to addressing chronic absenteeism to ensure students are on the right path for academic achievement and graduation. The programming provided in this agreement was created to raise student and parent engagement of the importance of daily on-time attendance, and create a school culture of attendance and academic achievement.

The ONGB Attendance Learning Institute (ALI), was created to further examine the policies that promote culturally responsive best practices to combat chronic absenteeism rates. During the course of this agreement, ONGB staff will partner with local OUSD schools to implement the Every Day Counts Attendance Challenge and out Kindergarten Attendance Challenge to raise student and parent awareness of the importance of daily school attendance. ONGB may also provide other attendance and enrollment outreach and support at the request of OUSD, including but not limited to outreach to chronically absent OUSD students.
Every Day Counts Attendance Challenge. The EDCAC is a district-wide attendance challenge open to students attending Oakland Public Schools in grades $\mathrm{K}-12$, to enter a drawing for a monthly cash prize that serves as an incentive for good to perfect attendance. Students with good attendance for each round can compete for a chance to win $\$ 500$ each round and/or up-to $\$ 100$ for each bonus day. Good attendance for this campaign is defined as no more than one unexcused absence each round and/or perfect attendance for a single day bonus day. Up to 20 recipients will be awarded for each round listed below.

Round 1: Sept. 1, 2022 - Sept. 30, 2022
Round 2: Oct. 1, 2022 - Oct. 31, 2022
Round 3: Nov. 1, 2022 - Nov. 30, 2022
Round 4: Jan. 1, 2023 - Jan. 31, 2023
Round 5: Feb. 1, 2023 - Feb. 28, 2023
Round 6: Mar. 1, 2023 - Mar. 31, 2023
Round 7: Apr. 1, 2023 - Apr. 30, 2023

Bonus Round: Select days during the month of December 2022 and May 2023
The award dates and award amounts may change in future years. All updates will be shared with OUSD prior to posting at school sites and within the school district.

This campaign is open to all OUSD public schools and Oakland charter schools. Pre-registration is required for participation. Pre-registration means that the parents must provide consent to enter their student(s) into the drawing at the time of registration. Participants can register through our website www.oaklandnatives.org, scanning the QR Code on the marketing material or contacting ONGB staff at each school to request the link to register via email at programs@oaklandnatives.org. The principal and attendance staff at each school site will also receive copies of all marketing materials along with a letter describing the best strategies for ongoing promotions and the student selection process for all finalists to be presented with the Round and Bonus Day awards described above.

Kindergarten Attendance Challenge: The Kindergarten Challenge is a collaborative effort between Oakland Natives Give Back, the California Department of Education, and Californians Dedicated to Education Foundation. The priority objectives of the program are to help young students entering school systems and their families to develop the healthy habit of attending school every day by cultivating a strong culture of learning, fostering a connected community of young scholars, and most importantly providing awareness on the importance of attending school EVERY SINGLE DAY. Secondarily, by implementing the Kindergarten Challenge Program and providing resources for families, we hypothesize that parents will elect to enroll their children in participating schools/

This Data Sharing Agreement ("Agreement") is a legally binding contract entered into between the Oakland Unified School District ("OUSD") and the below named entity(ies) or individual(s) ("RECIPIENT," together with OUSD, "PARTIES"):

The PARTIES hereby agree as follows:

1. Limited Purpose of Agreement. This Agreement pertains only to OUSD's transmission of data to RECIPIENT, and RECIPIENT's protection of such data. To the extent that OUSD seeks to impose any other legal obligations on RECIPIENT (e.g., RECIPIENT's provision of services to OUSD), or RECIPIENT seeks to impose any other legal obligations on OUSD (e.g., OUSD payment of compensation to RECIPIENT), such obligations shall be set forth in a separate agreement. If such an agreement exists at the time of execution of this Agreement, the Parties shall identify it in Exhibit A.
2. Data to be Provided. The Parties shall list the categories of data to be provided in the Schedule of Data, attached hereto as Exhibit B. The data categories listed in Exhibit B, and any portion thereof (including without limitation, meta data, user content or other non-public information and/or personally identifiable information contained in that data), shall be referred to hereinafter as OUSD Data.
3. Term.
a. This Agreement shall start on the below date ("Start Date") : June 1, 2022 If no Start Date is entered, then the Start Date shall be the latest of the dates on which each of the PARTIES signed this Agreement.
b. The work shall be completed no later than the below date ("End Date" ):June 30, 2025
If no End Date is entered, then the End Date shall be the first June 30 after the Start Date. For OUSD Data transmitted as part of a research project approved by OUSD's Department of Research, Assessment, and Data ("RAD"), if the term is longer than one calendar year, be aware that you must obtain approval from RAD prior to extending the research project into the second and subsequent calendar years, and no data will be shared during the second and subsequent calendar years unless and until this approval is obtained.
4. Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. OUSD data limited to student directory information, as defined in 34 C.F.R. § 99.31(a)(11) and OUSD Administrative Regulation 5125.1), or de-identified student information, as defined in 34 C.F.R. § 99.31(b), does not require completion of a data sharing agreement. For other student data, check any of the following that apply:

X OUSD Data includes personally identifiable information from a student record other than directory information. RECIPIENT is responsible for obtaining
parental consent, as defined in 34 C.F.R. § 99.30, and presenting evidence thereof to OUSD.

OUSD Data includes personally identifiable information from a student record, and:

X RECIPIENT is a contractor, consultant, volunteer, or other party to whom OUSD has outsourced institutional services or functions, and RECIPIENT performs an institutional service or function for which the agency or institution would otherwise use employees; is under the direct control of the agency or institution with respect to the use and maintenance of education records; and is subject to the requirements of § 99.31(a) governing the use and redisclosure of personally identifiable information from education records. (See 34 C.F.R. § 99.31(a)(1)(i)(B).)
$\square$ RECIPIENT is another school, school system, or institution of postsecondary education where an OUSD student seeks or intends to enroll, or where the student is already enrolled, and the disclosure is for purposes related to the student's enrollment or transfer. (See 34 C.F.R. § 99.31(a)(2).)
$\square$ RECIPIENT is an authorized representatives of the Comptroller General of the United States; the Attorney General of the United States; the Secretary of Education; or State and local educational authorities. (See 34 C.F.R. § 99.31(a)(3).)

RECIPIENT requires the data in order to determine an OUSD student's eligibility for financial aid; amount of aid; conditions for aid; or to enforce the terms and conditions of the aid. (See 34 C.F.R. § 99.31(a)(4).)

RECIPIENT is an organization conducting studies for, or on behalf of, educational agencies or institutions to develop, validate, or administer predictive tests; administer student aid programs; or improve instruction. (See 34 C.F.R. § 99.31(a)(6).) Any RECIPIENT receiving OUSD Data pursuant to this subsection must first submit a research application pursuant to OUSD's Department of Research, Assessment, and Data protocols, and such application shall be incorporated into this Agreement by reference.

The disclosure is in connection with a health or safety emergency. (See 34 C.F.R. §§ 99.31(a)(10) \& 99.36.)
5. Privacy Compliance. RECIPIENT shall comply with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations pertaining to data privacy and security, including the Family Educational

Rights and Privacy Act, the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act, the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment, the Student Online Personal Information Protection Act, AB 1584, and all other California privacy statutes.
6. Authorized Use. OUSD Data, including persistent unique identifiers, shall be used for no purpose other than as agreed herein and/or otherwise legally authorized. RECIPIENT shall not make any re-disclosure of any OUSD Data without the express written consent of OUSD.
7. Advertising Prohibition. RECIPIENT is prohibited from using or selling OUSD Data to (a) market or advertise to students or families/guardians; (b) inform, influence, or enable marketing, advertising, or other commercial efforts by RECIPIENT; (c) develop a profile of a student, family member/guardian or group, for any commercial purpose other than providing the Service to OUSD; or (d) use the OUSD Data for the development of commercial products or services.
8. OUSD Data Property of OUSD. All OUSD Data transmitted to the RECIPIENT pursuant to this Agreement is and will continue to be the property of and under the control of OUSD. RECIPIENT acknowledges and agrees that all copies of such OUSD Data transmitted to the RECIPIENT, including any modifications or additions or any portion thereof from any source, are subject to the provisions of this Agreement in the same manner as the original OUSD Data. The Parties agree that as between them, all rights, including all intellectual property rights in and to OUSD Data shall remain the exclusive property of OUSD.
9. Correction of Records. OUSD shall establish reasonable procedures by which a parent, guardian, or eligible student may review OUSD Data in the pupil's records, correct erroneous information, and procedures for the transfer of pupil-generated content to a personal account, consistent with the functionality of services. RECIPIENT shall respond in a timely manner to OUSD's request for OUSD Data in a pupil's records held by RECIPIENT to view or correct as necessary.
10. Third Party Request. Should a Third Party, including law enforcement and government entities, contact RECIPIENT with a request for data held by RECIPIENT pursuant to the Services, RECIPIENT shall redirect the Third Party to request the data directly from OUSD. RECIPIENT shall notify OUSD in advance of a compelled disclosure to a Third Party.
11. Employee Obligation. RECIPIENT shall require all employees and agents who have access to OUSD Data to comply with all applicable provisions of this Agreement with respect to the data shared under the Agreement.
12. Subprocessors. RECIPIENT shall enter into written agreements with all Subprocessors performing functions pursuant to this Agreement or any other Agreement identified in Exhibit A, whereby the Subprocessors agree to protect OUSD Data in manner consistent with the terms of this Agreement.
13. No Re-Identification or Re-Disclosure. RECIPIENT agrees not to attempt to re-identify deidentified OUSD Data and not to transfer de-identified OUSD Data to any party unless (a) that party agrees in writing not to attempt re-identification, and (b) prior written notice has been given to OUSD who has provided prior written consent for such transfer. RECIPIENT shall not copy, reproduce or transmit any data obtained except as necessary to fulfill the Agreement
14. Disposition of Data. RECIPIENT shall dispose or delete all OUSD Data upon written request by OUSD or when it is no longer needed for the purpose for which it was obtained. Disposition shall include (1) the shredding of any hard copies of any OUSD Data; (2) Erasing; or (3) Otherwise modifying the personal information in those records to make it unreadable or indecipherable by human or digital means. Nothing in this Agreement authorizes RECIPIENT to maintain OUSD Data beyond the time period reasonably needed to complete the disposition. RECIPIENT shall provide written notification to OUSD when the OUSD Data has been disposed.
15. Data Security. RECIPIENT agrees to abide by and maintain adequate data security measures, consistent with industry standards and technology best practices, to protect OUSD Data from unauthorized disclosure or acquisition by an unauthorized person.
16. Data Breach. In the event that OUSD Data is accessed or obtained by an unauthorized individual, RECIPIENT shall provide notification to OUSD within a reasonable amount of time of the incident, and not exceeding forty-eight (48) hours. RECIPIENT shall follow the following process:
a. The security breach notification shall be written in plain language, shall be titled "Notice of Data Breach," and shall present the information described herein under the following headings: "What Happened," "What Information Was Involved," "What We Are Doing," "What You Can Do," and "For More Information." Additional information may be provided as a supplement to the notice.
b. The security breach notification described above shall include, at a minimum, the following information:
(i) A list of the types of personal information that were or are reasonably believed to have been the subject of a breach.
(ii) If the information is possible to determine at the time the notice is provided, then either (1) the date of the breach, (2) the estimated date of the breach, or (3) the date range within which the breach occurred. The notification shall also include the date of the notice.
(iii) Whether the notification was delayed as a result of a law enforcement investigation, if that information is possible to determine at the time the notice is provided.
(iv) A general description of the breach incident, if that information is possible to determine at the time the notice is provided.
c. RECIPIENT agrees to adhere to all requirements in applicable State and in federal law with respect to a data breach related to the OUSD Data, including, when appropriate or required, the required responsibilities and procedures for notification and mitigation of any such data breach.
d. RECIPIENT further acknowledges and agrees to have a written incident response plan that reflects best practices and is consistent with industry standards and federal and state law for responding to a data breach, breach of security, privacy incident or unauthorized acquisition or use of OUSD Data or any portion thereof, including personally identifiable information and agrees to provide OUSD, upon request, with a copy of said written incident response plan.
e. RECIPIENT is prohibited from directly contacting parent, legal guardian or eligible pupil unless expressly requested by OUSD. If OUSD requests RECIPIENT's assistance providing notice of unauthorized access, and such assistance is not unduly burdensome to RECIPIENT, RECIPIENT shall notify the affected parent, legal guardian or eligible pupil of the unauthorized access, which shall include the information listed above. If requested by OUSD, RECIPIENT shall reimburse OUSD for costs incurred to notify parents/families of a breach not originating from OUSD's use of the Service.
17. Equipment and Materials. RECIPIENT shall provide all equipment, materials, and supplies necessary for the performance of this Agreement.

## 18. Termination.

a. For Convenience by OUSD. OUSD may at any time terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to RECIPIENT. Upon approval by OUSD legal counsel, the OUSD Superintendent or an OUSD Chief or Deputy may issue the termination notice without approval by the OUSD Governing Board, in which case this Agreement would terminate upon ratification of the termination by the OUSD Governing Board or thirty (30) days after the notice was provided, whichever is later.
b. Due to COVID-19. Notwithstanding any other language of this Agreement, if a shelter-in-place (or similar) order due to COVID-19 is issued or is in effect during the term of this Agreement that would prohibit or limit, at the sole discretion of OUSD, the ability of RECIPIENT to perform the Services, OUSD may terminate this Agreement upon seven (7) days prior written notice to RECIPIENT. Upon approval by OUSD legal counsel, the OUSD Superintendent or an OUSD Chief or Deputy may issue the termination notice without approval by the OUSD Governing Board, in which case this Agreement would terminate upon ratification of the termination
by the OUSD Governing Board or seven (7) days after the notice was provided, whichever is later.
c. For Cause. Either PARTY may terminate this Agreement by giving written notice of its intention to terminate for cause to the other PARTY. Written notice shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate. Cause shall include (i) material violation of this Agreement or (ii) if either PARTY is adjudged bankrupt, makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors, or a receiver is appointed on account of its insolvency. Upon approval by OUSD legal counsel, the OUSD Superintendent or an OUSD Chief or Deputy may issue the termination notice without approval by the OUSD Governing Board, in which case this Agreement would terminate upon ratification of the termination by the OUSD Governing Board or three (3) days after the notice was provided, whichever is later, unless the condition or violation ceases or satisfactory arrangements for the correction are made.
d. Upon termination, RECIPIENT shall provide OUSD with all materials produced, maintained, or collected by RECIPIENT pursuant to this Agreement, whether or not such materials are complete or incomplete or are in final or draft form.
19. Legal Notices. All legal notices provided for under this Agreement shall be sent via email to the email address set forth below and shall be either (i) personally delivered during normal business hours or (ii) sent by U.S. Mail (certified, return receipt requested) with postage prepaid to the other PARTY at the address set forth below.

20. Status.
a. This is not an employment contract. RECIPIENT, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. RECIPIENT understands and agrees that it and any and all of its employees shall not be considered employees of OUSD, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of OUSD and/or to which OUSD's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. RECIPIENT shall assume full responsibility for payment of all Federal, State, and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to RECIPIENT's employees.
b. If RECIPIENT is a natural person, RECIPIENT verifies all of the following:
(i) RECIPIENT is free from the control and direction of OUSD in connection with RECIPIENT's work;
(ii) RECIPIENT's work is outside the usual course of OUSD's business; and
(iii) RECIPIENT is customarily engaged in an independently established trade, occupation, or business of the same nature as that involved in the work performed for OUSD.
c. If RECIPIENT is a business entity, RECIPIENT verifies all of the following:
(i) RECIPIENT is free from the control and direction of OUSD in connection with the performance of the work;
(ii) RECIPIENT is providing services directly to OUSD rather than to customers of OUSD;
(iii) the contract between OUSD and RECIPIENT is in writing;
(iv) RECIPIENT has the required business license or business tax registration, if the work is performed in a jurisdiction that requires RECIPIENT to have a business license or business tax registration;
(v) RECIPIENT maintains a business location that is separate from the business or work location of OUSD;
(vi) RECIPIENT is customarily engaged in an independently established business of the same nature as that involved in the work performed;
(vii) RECIPIENT actually contracts with other businesses to provide the same or similar services and maintains a clientele without restrictions from OUSD;
(viii) RECIPIENT advertises and holds itself out to the public as available to provide the same or similar services;
(ix) RECIPIENT provides its own tools, vehicles, and equipment to perform the services;
(x) RECIPIENT can negotiate its own rates;
(xi) RECIPIENT can set its own hours and location of work; and
(xii) RECIPIENT is not performing the type of work for which a license from the Contractor's State License Board is required, pursuant to Chapter 9
(commencing with section 7000) of Division 3 of the Business and Professions Code.
21. Certificates/ Permits/ Licenses/ Registration. RECIPIENT's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such certificates, permits, licenses and registration as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of Services pursuant to this Agreement.

## 22. Coronavirus/COVID-19.

a. Through its execution of this Agreement, RECIPIENT declares that it is able to meet its obligations and perform the Services required pursuant to this Agreement in accordance with any shelter-in-place (or similar) order or curfew (or similar) order ("Orders") issued by local or state authorities and with any social distancing/hygiene (or similar) requirements.
b. Consistent with the requirements of the paragraph titled Incident/Accident/Mandated Reporting, RECIPIENT agrees to notify OUSD, via email pursuant to the paragraph titled Legal Notices, within twelve (12) hours if RECIPIENT or any employee, subcontractor, agent, or representative of RECIPIENT tests positive for COVID-19, shows or reports symptoms consistent with COVID19, or reports to RECIPIENT possible COVID-19 exposure.
c. RECIPIENT agrees to immediately adhere to and follow any OUSD directives regards health and safety protocols including, but not limited to, providing OUSD with information regarding possible exposure of OUSD employees to RECIPIENT or any employee, subcontractor, agent, or representative of RECIPIENT and information necessary to perform contact tracing, as well as complying with any OUSD testing and vaccination requirements.
d. RECIPIENT shall bear all costs of compliance with this Paragraph, including but not limited to those imposed by this Agreement.
23. Assignment. The obligations of RECIPIENT under this Agreement shall not be assigned by RECIPIENT without the express prior written consent of OUSD and any assignment without the express prior written consent of OUSD shall be null and void.
24. Non-Discrimination. It is the policy of OUSD that in connection with all work performed under Contracts there be no discrimination because of race, color, ancestry, national origin, religious creed, physical disability, medical condition, marital status, sexual orientation, gender, or age; therefore, RECIPIENT agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited to, the California Fair Employment and Housing Act beginning with Government Code section 12900 and Labor Code section 1735 and OUSD policy. In addition, RECIPIENT agrees to require like compliance by all its subcontractor ( $s$ ). RECIPIENT shall not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment on the basis of actual or perceived; race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, age, marital status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, veteran status, gender, sex, sexual orientation, or other legally protected class.
25. Drug-Free/Smoke Free Policy. No drugs, alcohol, and/or smoking are allowed at any time in any buildings and/or grounds on OUSD property. No students, staff, visitors, RECIPIENTS, or subcontractors are to use controlled substances, alcohol or tobacco on these sites.
26. Waiver. No delay or omission by either PARTY in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right or prevent a subsequent act from constituting a violation of this Agreement.
27. No Rights in Third Parties. This Agreement does not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein.
28. Conflict of Interest.
a. RECIPIENT shall abide by and be subject to all applicable, regulations, statutes, or other laws regarding conflict of interest. RECIPIENT shall not hire any officer or employee of OUSD to perform any service by this Agreement without the prior approval of OUSD Human Resources.
b. RECIPIENT affirms to the best of his/her/its knowledge, there exists no actual or potential conflict of interest between RECIPIENT's family, business or financial interest and the services provided under this Agreement, and in the event of change in either private interest or services under this Agreement, any question regarding possible conflict of interest which may arise as a result of such change will be brought to OUSD's attention in writing.
c. Through its execution of this Agreement, RECIPIENT acknowledges that it is familiar with the provisions of section 1090 et seq. and section 87100 et seq. of the Government Code, and certifies that it does not know of any facts which constitute a violation of said provisions. In the event RECIPIENT receives any information subsequent to execution of this Agreement which might constitute a violation of said provisions, RECIPIENT agrees it shall notify OUSD in writing.
29. Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion. Through its execution of this Agreement, RECIPIENT certifies to the best of its knowledge and belief, that it and its principals are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency according to Federal Acquisition Regulation Subpart 9.4, and by signing this contract, certifies that this vendor does not appear on the Excluded Parties List (https://www.sam.gov/).
30. Limitation of OUSD Liability. OUSD shall have no financial obligations under this Agreement other than as provided in this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event shall OUSD be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenue, arising out of, or in
connection with, this Agreement for the Services performed in connection with this Agreement.
31. Indemnification.
a. To the furthest extent permitted by California law, RECIPIENT shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless OUSD, its Governing Board, agents, representatives, officers, consultants, employees, trustees, and volunteers ("OUSD Indemnified Parties") from any and all claims or losses accruing or resulting from injury, damage, or death of any person or entity arising out of RECIPIENT's performance of this Agreement. RECIPIENT also agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend OUSD Indemnified Parties from any and all claims or losses incurred by any supplier, RECIPIENT, or subcontractor furnishing work, services, or materials to RECIPIENT arising out of the performance of this Agreement. RECIPIENT shall, to the fullest extent permitted by California law, defend OUSD Indemnified Parties at RECIPIENT's own expense, including attorneys' fees and costs, and OUSD shall have the right to accept or reject any legal representation that RECIPIENT proposes to defend OUSD Indemnified Parties.
b. To the furthest extent permitted by California law, OUSD shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless RECIPIENT, its Board, agents, representatives, officers, consultants, employees, trustees, and volunteers ("RECIPIENT Indemnified Parties") from any and all claims or losses accruing or resulting from injury, damage, or death of any person or entity arising out of OUSD's performance of this Agreement. OUSD shall, to the fullest extent permitted by California law, defend RECIPIENT Indemnified Parties at OUSD's own expense, including attorneys' fees and costs.
32. Audit. RECIPIENT shall establish and maintain books, records, and systems of account, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, reflecting all business operations of RECIPIENT transacted under this Agreement. RECIPIENT shall retain these books, records, and systems of account during the term of this Agreement and for three (3) years after the End Date. RECIPIENT shall permit OUSD, its agent, other representatives, or an independent auditor to audit, examine, and make excerpts, copies, and transcripts from all books and records, and to make audit(s) of all records and other data related to Services covered by this Agreement. Audit(s) may be performed at any time, provided that OUSD shall give reasonable prior notice to RECIPIENT and shall conduct audit(s) during RECIPIENT'S normal business hours, unless RECIPIENT otherwise consents.
33. Litigation. This Agreement shall be deemed to be performed in Oakland, California and is governed by the laws of the State of California, but without resort to California's principles and laws regarding conflict of laws. The Alameda County Superior Court shall have jurisdiction over any litigation initiated to enforce or interpret this Agreement.
34. Incorporation of Recitals and Exhibits. Any recitals and exhibits attached to this Agreement are incorporated herein by reference. RECIPIENT agrees that to the extent any recital or document incorporated herein conflicts with any term or provision of this Agreement, the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall govern.
35. Integration/Entire Agreement of Parties. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the PARTIES and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, and agreements, whether oral or written. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by both PARTIES.
36. Severability. If any term, condition or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.
37. Provisions Required By Law Deemed Inserted. Each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted in this Agreement shall be deemed to be inserted herein and this Agreement shall be read and enforced as though it were included therein.
38. Captions and Interpretations. Section and paragraph headings in this Agreement are used solely for convenience, and shall be wholly disregarded in the construction of this Agreement. No provision of this Agreement shall be interpreted for or against a PARTY because that PARTY or its legal representative drafted such provision, and this Agreement shall be construed as if jointly prepared by the PARTIES.
39. Calculation of Time. For the purposes of this Agreement, "days" refers to calendar days unless otherwise specified and "hours" refers to hours regardless of whether it is a work day, weekend, or holiday.
40. Counterparts and Electronic Signature. This Agreement, and all amendments, addenda, and supplements to this Agreement, may be executed in one or more counterparts, all of which shall constitute one and the same amendment. Any counterpart may be executed and delivered by facsimile or other electronic signature (including portable document format) by either PARTY and, notwithstanding any statute or regulations to the contrary (including, but not limited to, Government Code section 16.5 and the regulations promulgated therefrom), the counterpart shall legally bind the signing PARTY and the receiving PARTY may rely on the receipt of such document so executed and delivered electronically or by facsimile as if the original had been received. Through its execution of this Agreement, each PARTY waives the requirements and constraints on electronic signatures found in statute and regulations including, but not limited to, Government Code section 16.5 and the regulations promulgated therefrom.
41. Agreement Publicly Posted. This Agreement, its contents, and all incorporated documents are public documents and will be made available by OUSD to the public online via the Internet.
42. Signature Authority.
a. Each PARTY has the full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement, and the person(s) signing this Agreement on behalf of each PARTY has been given the proper authority and empowered to enter into this Agreement.
b. Notwithstanding subparagraph (a), only the Superintendent, Chiefs, Deputy Chiefs, and the General Counsel have been delegated the authority to sign contracts for OUSD and only under limited circumstances, which require ratification by the OUSD Governing Board. RECIPIENT agrees not to accept the signature of another other OUSD employee as having the proper authority and empowered to enter into this Agreement or as legally binding in any way.
c. Notwithstanding Paragraph 18, if this Agreement is executed by the signature of the Superintendent, Chiefs, Deputy Chiefs, or General Counsel under their delegated authority, and the Board thereafter declines to ratify the Agreement, the Agreement shall automatically terminate on the date that the Board declines to ratify it.
43. Contract Contingent on Governing Board Approval. OUSD shall not be bound by the terms of this Agreement unless and until it has been (i) formally approved by OUSD's Governing Board or (ii) validly and properly executed by the OUSD Superintendent, the General Counsel, or a Chief or Deputy Chief authorized by the Education Code or Board Policy, and no payment shall be owed or made to RECIPIENT absent such formal approval or valid and proper execution.

Data identified in Exhibit B.

The Oakland Natives Give Back Fund (ONGB) is a non-profit organization committed to addressing chronic absenteeism to ensure students are on the right path for academic achievement and graduation. Our organization is requesting data to understand the impact of our programs on attendance outcomes within OUSD partner schools. We created the Attendance Learning Institute (ALI), to further examine the policies that promote culturally responsive best practices to combat chronic absenteeism rates. ALI features the one program that has a broad district-wide reach: The Every Day Counts Attendance challenge registers students at schools for a monthly cash prize that serves as an incentive for perfect to good attendance. During the 2018-2019 school year ONGB registered over 7000 students attending 82 schools for this challenge. The Kindergarten Attendance Challenge ONGB plans to continue tracking the progress of these students enrolled in the OUSD system as well as newly registered students enrolled between 2022-23, 2023-24 and 2024-25 school years.

In addition to the data elements mentioned in Exhibit B, we request a listing of all students who were chronically absent for the 2021-2022 school year. Our goal is to have this information be made available 60-45 days prior to the start of each school year for targeted student outreach for the upcoming school year. The listing should represent students participating in ONGB programming for which we have parental consent. It should also include a roster of students who are not participating in ONGB programming. This list will be used to extend attendance-related resources and as a comparison group in future program assessments.

The requested data will allow us to review the following: 1) the extent to which there are attendance improvements for students registered in our program at each of our partner schools and 2) the extent to which school-wide awareness-raising activities improved attendance at the school level. Our guiding research questions for the Every Day Counts Attendance Challenge and the Kindergarten Attendance Challenge include the following:

- Is there an association between ONGB school-wide awareness-raising events and the attendance patterns of the overall school?
- Is there an association between ONGB incentives and the attendance patterns of students registered for the Every Day Counts Attendance Challenge?
- Is there an association between the attendance patterns of students who received the Every Day Counts Attendance and Kindergarten Attendance Challenge programming in comparison to other students within OUSD schools of similar demographics and grade levels. \}
