Chair Roro calls meeting to order at 5:05pm when we achieve quorum Bowman welcomes all members, thanks them for their time and for being present

Review of Buckets of Funding used at Life Academy (and all OUSD schools):

- Discretionary
- Supplemental
- Concentration (no longer this is now at \$0)
- Title 1 and Title 4 these are what SSC approves funding of and what we will be examining tonight
- Measure G1 input gathered through SSC tonight!

## Title 1 Approval \$150,750

- Bowman introduces Title 1 proposed use for 22-23.
- Primary use will be to pay for portions of teacher salaries for intervention classes to support students who are underperforming in math and reading.
- 10th Grade ELA Teacher (1 literacy section)
- 6th Grade Math Teacher (2 math intervention sections)
- HS Math Teacher (2 math intervention sections)
- 7th Grade Math Teacher (1 intervention section)
- 8th Grade ELA Teacher (1 intervention section)
- MS Science Teacher (2 intervention sections)
- After paying for these, if there are leftover funds, Bowman proposed that \$10,000

go toward the Wrights Institute contract to provide mental health services to our students. If there are funds beyond that Bowman proposes that those funds are split evenly between extended contracts for teachers to provide after school tutoring and OT for classified staff to provide translation for family meetings.

 SSC unanimously approves the use of Title 1 funds for the above uses for 22-23 school year

## Title 1 Parent Engagement: \$4,020

- Bowman introduces that we have \$4020 in Title 4 for 22-23
- Proposal is that the entirely of these funds are used for translation for family meetings so that all meetings can be fully accessible to all members in our community (the majority of whom are Spanish speakers).
- SSC unanimously approves the use of Title 1 Parent Engagement funds for the above uses for 22-23 school year

### Title IV: \$10,050

- Bowman introduces that we have \$10,050 in Title 4 for 22-23
- Bowman proposed they go toward the Wrights Institute contract to provide mental health services to our students.
- SSC unanimously approves the use of Title IV carryover funds for Wrights Institute

## Measure G1:

- Boolani introduces that we have around 100k in G1 for 22-23.
- Boolani explains use from previous years: 50% of case manager to support RJ, 2 student advisor positions to support transition into 6th and into 9th grades, and 1 partial theatre arts position to ensure that we are providing theatre arts for our 6th grade students.
- With staffing shifts, the real dollar amount leaves about 10k of more funding...
  proposal is bring in local artists to do some public art around school to 1) give
  students exposure to real artists; 2) have students participate in making art to
  beautify our campus; and 3) learn the skills of mural making, door painting, and
  print-making.
- SSC unanimously approves the use of Measure G1 to continue funding these positions.
