A Sign In To Speak Card called during Agenda Item K but not responded to by the requester is not repeated and a new Sign In To Speak Card is not accepted under this - V - Item. Not more than 30 minutes shall be allocated for the purpose of this item. Likewise, as under Item K, the Board may not discuss or take any action on a non-agenda item not appearing on the posted agenda for this meeting, except the Board or staff, as permitted by law, may briefly respond to a statement made or questions posed by a member of the public. In addition, on his or her own initiative or in response to questions posed by the public, a member of the Board or its staff may ask a question for clarification, make a brief announcement, or make a brief report of personal activities.
