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Memorandum of Agreement

2012-2013 School Year School Grants for Healthy Kids

This Action for Healthy Kids (AFHK) grant agreement is between Action for Healthy Kids and Oakland High. The purpose of this agreement is to establish the terms and conditions under which AFHK has awarded a grant to Oakland High in Oakland USD located in Oakland, CA.

Article I: Scope

This agreement applies to the grant award made to Oakland High in June 2012 as outlined in Oakland High's proposed project plan submitted in spring 2012. These grant dollars specifically support work done during the 2012-2013 school year that support enhanced school nutrition programs, policies, and practices.

Article II: Grant Award

AFHK agrees to award a total of \$1571 to Oakland High pending receipt of signed MOA, submission of five-person grant implementation team, and submission of a mid-term report due December 14, 2012. AFHK reserves the right to rescind the grant award in the event of non-compliance with this MOA. In the unlikely event that the funder supporting this work does not make timely grant payments to Action for Healthy Kids, we reserve the right to reduce the amount of your grant and/or change the schedule of payments accordingly.

Oakland High agrees to comply with such reasonable procedures established by AFHK as requirements for this grant. The grant period will be from June 1, 2012 through June 14, 2013

Article III: Grant Communications

Oakland High agrees to comply with AFHK's logo and communications guidelines for all grant-related materials, including but not limited to program materials, presentations, announcements, press releases, and curricula. - Submit a minimum of 25 photographs documenting the program in action (10 due with midterm report, 15 due with final project report).
- Complete all required AFHK reporting and evaluation protocols in a timely manner.

AFHK reserves the right to audit grant programs and budgets as needed.

Article VII: AFHK Resources

Throughout the grant term, AFHK will provide the following resources to Oakland High to support this effort:

- Grant funds in the amount of \$1571 to be spent according to proposed Oakland High project plan.
- Training and resources via phone, email, and webinars to provide technical assistance to Oakland High and grant implementation team (including school staff, administrators and parent/community volunteers).
- Opportunities to share ideas and best practices with other granted schools.
- Connections with local, state, and national resources and partners.
- Successes from other funded schools.

Article VIII: Reporting Requirements

Reports on the above deliverables must be submitted to the national office as follows:

- December 14, 2012 Mid-term report for work completed from June 1, 2012 to December 14, 2012.
- June 14, 2013 Final report for work completed from June 1, 2012 to June 14, 2013.
