February -March: Students apply for federal and state financial aidStudents apply for private sources of fundingSchool or District uploads all seniors' GPA to CSAC through the webgrants account Selection. March - June: Students and families choose a college based on smart financial decisionsStudents and families prepare a sustainable financial plan. District uploads graduation verification data Persistence HS
