Chairperson London said the Life Enrichment Committee has been very interested in looking at the Joint Use Agreement between the District and the City of Oakland. She said the City has expressed an interest in having more of our school sites open after school and on the weekends. This request came before the Facilities Committee and the committee pushed back because it wanted to make sure there was a way to cover the cost associated with having those sites open including security and custodial costs. Each City Councilmember is going to contact his or her counterpart on the School Board to have joint engagements in the community with Board Members around which schools the community wants to see open after school and on the weekends.

Director Hodge said we still have not been able to get a response from the City on the Intergovernmental Relations Committee's request for a single issue around safety concerns and joint work. She said it is evident that the City Council sets the agenda for the meetings. Director Hodge said she is concerned that the partnership is not quite a partnership.

Chairperson London said Superintendent Smith said he hopes Board Members will have engagements with their constituents around the strategic plan the Board and the Superintendent are developing.

Liz Vance, Urban Strategies Council, distributed to Committee Members the 2009-2010 Board Community Engagement Report dated March 12, 2010. Agenda topics included:

Ms. Vance said of the seven (7) meetings held there were 96 comments from constituents.

Laura Moran said she and Sara Nunoz have met to discuss the next steps. She said it would be good if each Board Member could have at least one follow-on meeting from the fall engagements letting their communities know some of the budget decisions that were made and how Board Members tried to integrate feedback they heard from the fall engagements. Ms. Moran said her only concern for the spring engagements is staffing and funding. Ms. Moran said the cost will be approximately \$1,000 per meeting and the very least would be \$500 per meeting.

Chairperson London said the spring engagements should be held in May.

Laura Moran said they will try to hold the meetings in May. She said she will have Sara Nunoz to start working with Board Members around dates.

Chairperson London made a motion and Director Hodge second the motion to send this item to the Full Board on April 14th. Chairperson London's motion was for Board Members to engage in a second round of community meetings that will address feedback from the fall sessions; look at how the budget is shaping up for the 2010/2011 fiscal year; work with the community around the strategic plan. Embedded in the strategic plan is the issue of having schools as the centers of the community and open to the community during non school hours.

Chairperson London asked staff to give an overview of opportunities.

Laura Moran said the District will apply for the following grants. (1) Investment and Improvement (I-3) Grant with ConnectEd. She said ConnectEd will submit an I3 Grant application for the District and six other California school districts. (2) Jane Nicholson, Complimentary Learning Department, will be applying for a Pre K - 3 Grant with Hewlett Packard. (3) Pivot Learning will give the District funds to develop version 2.0 of our Performance Management and Data Systems. (4) Ms. Moran said the District has been encouraged by the Department of Education to apply for a TIFF Grant (Teacher Incentive Fund) to be used for teachers and principals. (5) The District has been working with Cal State Eastbay for a \$2.1 million dollar Transition to Teaching Grant. (6) Choice Neighborhoods Grant - Ms. Moran said District staff has met with several community organizations to review the data and come up with some agreement on the two levels of criteria. Superintendent Smith and Mayor Dellums are in talks about having a special panel that would make a decision about the anchor organization submitting the application. Superintendent Smith wants the Intergovernmental Relations Committee to recommend four persons to be on the panel. Members of the panel would not be a member of the anchor organization.

Chairperson London said the Intergovernmental Relations Committee is not prepared to submit names for the panel today. She said if we are going to forward names the committee would need to schedule a Special Committee Meeting.

Secretary Rakestraw said any names submitted by this committee would have to be sanctioned by the Board.

Chairperson London said the names would have to be sanctioned and placed on April 14th Board Meeting Agenda. She said there would have to be a Special Meeting of this committee and Chairperson London said she would not be available for a Special Meeting until April 12th.

Brad Stam, Chief Academic Officer, talked about the ConnectEd Grant. He said the District will pursue a validation level grant up to \$30 million dollars in conjunction with eight other California school districts. The District is at the Letter of Intent level with seven development level I-3 Grants. Other development level grants the District is applying for are EL, Leadership Development with New Leaders and Technology.

Director Hodge said she would appreciate "Ripple Effects" being explored.

Jennifer LeBarre, Director of Nutrition Services, made a PowerPoint Presentation on Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010. Highlights of the presentation:

Meal Program Reimbursement calls for an increase in funding of \$4.5 billion over 10 years.

Nutritional Standards ensures water is available free of charge during meal service.

Institute of Medicine Meal Program Recommendations calls for significant changes in meal planning moving away from nutrient standard menu planning back to food based.

After School Meals calls for expansion of current pilot program to all 50 states increasing the amount of food provided to students and increase in reimbursement.

Farm to School provides \$25 million in funding to develop, implement and revise Farm to School Programs.

Direct Certification increases opportunities for children to be automatically qualified for free meals and automatically qualifies foster children for free meals.

Other Child Nutrition Provisions provides funding to study hunger and childhood obesity.

What's Missing - The District asks sufficient funding.

Next Steps at the Federal Level

The Senate will review the Bill and add or delete as they see fit; The House will also put up their own version of the Bill; The Bill needs to be approved so it is in effect by October 1, 2010.

Suggested Next Steps: Give feedback to Senator Feinstein and Senator Boxer; Letter writing to Nancy Pelosi and George Miller; Meet with Barbara Lee and George Miller staff.
