Planning and Piloting <ul style="list-style-type: none">• \$525 per pupil	X	<p>The current academic year started with a new principal (Michael Ray) whose initially identified priorities strongly aligned to three of the four pillars of our Linked Learning initiative that was already underway.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• In order to reflect our continued commitment to work based learning -- and inspired by the potential to move students along career technical degree and certificate paths -- Mr. Ray, worked with Peralta College District to identify off-site certificate and/or degree programs that articulate with the design/engineering pathway courses offered on site.• Subsequently, we are continuing to refine our plan to align with pathway-related certificate/degree programs at Peralta College District. <p>We have also identified Project Lead the Way (PLTW) as the core curriculum of the pathway courses, as well as a resource to build cross-curricular integration across grade levels.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The 2nd revised program of study for 2018-2019 better reflects the interests of our students, the capacity of our pathway learning experience providers, and the goals and progress toward a whole-school transformation to a Linked Learning-focused, PBL-driven, design program.• We are collaborating with various stakeholders to shift current funding destinations in order to purchase PLTW Engineering Modules, and to continue to build out and implement the pathway to authentically align with the tenets of Linked Learning Silver certification, in the immediate, and Gold certification, ultimately. <p>Additionally, we have identified a Linked Learning Consultant, per the recommendation of the Linked Learning Team, who will work with our team to immediately begin to implement to recommendations and necessary components to strengthen and refine our program.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• This consultant will specifically help us build out our Linked Learning PLC of teachers and counselors who will drive the work at the school site level. The core work of the consultant and



		<p>team will be to align out Graduate Profile work to expected student learning outcomes, including tying rubrics to our exhibitions and PBL projects that teacher teams already using across the curriculum to bring Linked Learning into each classroom.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Having a consultant and Linked Learning PLC will also allow us to have a wider and more diverse group of people who will have the capacity to lead professional development for all teachers on the site. This will further allow us to better on board new staff to be able to implement a rigorous, relevant, and integrated curriculum from the beginning.
