Tim White, Assistant Superintendent for Facilities, said this item has been reviewed by members of the Facilities Advisory Committee. Prior to that, public comment was taken at meetings held at school sites. The State Administrator is being asked to approve the Request for Qualifications and Real Property Development Proposals for the development of a 9.47 acre property between 10th and 12th Streets, and the Lake/Peralta Park and 4th Avenue. Input received from board members and the community was incorporated into the form which includes a focus on the educational component for use of District property. We reprioritized the District's Goals and Objectives in the RFO, ensured there was a focus on providing the District with a long-term source of revenue, established an architectural land-use design that provides for cosmetic, economic and social benefits for the surrounding properties, and ensured that it is consistent with the City plan for ultimate development of the Estuary in this area; and finally ensured there are improvements that globally affect the entire neighborhood. The six parcels are: 1029 4th street, 1065 3rd Avenue, 1025 2nd Avenue, 1105 2nd Avenue, 4th Avenue and 1100 3rd Avenue. The District insisted on construction of a new instructional small school campus serving preschool through high school that encompasses La Escuelita and MetWest communities. The preschool will provide for 150 students and the K-12 would provide for a minimum of 740 students. The District also insisted on developing the property at its highest and best

use as distinguished from its clinical version - multi-family, high density residential. We would like to see the use of that term in its broadest context to include factors related to more than financial gain on the use of the property--neighborhood improvements and enhancement to the educational facilities---social and cultural impacts and environmentally responsible design--that come from the developers. Mr. White said we would like to integrate the project into the surrounding community. This is some of the most valuable pieces of property in Oakland. He said the ideas will be reviewed by the State Administrator's staff and ultimately the decision will be made by Dr. Ward and the Board as to what idea most consistently represents the District's vision in developing the property. We imagine it to be an interactive process. The role of the Facilities Advisory Committee is to review the proposals prior to presentation to the full Board.

Mr. White said the Summary and Selection Process ends on July 14 with the approval of the State Administrator. There are several steps in the process prior to that. If approved tonight, the proposal will be distributed on February 7. On February 21, the District would hold a mandatory conference, tour of the properties and have discussions with the developers who attend the conference. On February 28, we would accept written questions from potential proposers. On May 9, the developer proposals are due. On May 19, the District will start review of the proposals, select a short list and set up interviews. We envision the participation of the Board and State Administrator would enhance itself through this Process. On June 1, the short list proposers make additional presentation at a public meeting. The selection of the recommended developer will be made on June 8 and be scheduled for the next regular board meeting on July 14. Between that time the District and the preferred developer will commence negotiations.

Dr. Ward approved the RFQRPDP but noted there may be minor changes prior to it going on the street. He stated it is not mandatory that these kinds of requests for qualifications or proposals go through a board action or approval process. Many times it is done outside of the Board process and once all of the bidding and proposals are accepted, then it's brought to a public meeting. We are trying to do this for the sake of transparency for the sake of input and to get revenues in terms of the properties are available,

R. Board Discussion

State Administrator Ward, noting the arrival of Director Kerry Hamill and President Gary Yee invited them to comment on the just adopted New Business - Facilities Item, Legislative File No. 05-0103.

Director Hamill said the Board sat as the Facilities Advisory Committee a couple of weeks ago and spent a couple hours discussing the request for proposals. She thanked Tim White for reflecting the changes they mentioned at the other meeting. Director Hamill stated, if we are building new schools in any context, there is a need to ensure we have state eligibility so that we can get a 50 percent match for our construction. It will be difficult to explain to the public during this time when we are closing schools why we are building new schools. There are various growth pots around and some of it is dedicated to Oakland. Over the years we have left hundreds of millions of dollars on the table in Sacramento vis-à-vis new school construction.

State Administrator Ward said one of the key components we are looking at facilities for next year is where we house the departments here with facilities that are available in our

school sites. We will be finding new homes for various departments in this facility.

Mr. White said the existing Facilities Master Plan will be updated. The scope has changed because of the acceleration of the small school development. We now have a Small School Phase Analysis Phase II and the original update of Phase I.

President Yee said many of the schools that are in desperate need of repair, upgrade, modernization or replacement of portables always feel left out when the Phase I is the new school construction. He appreciates the discussions about what is going on across the School District. Dr. Ward said the Executive Director of Special Education has requested space at school sites to bring in nonpublic school students.
