Overview of Life Academy

- Life Academy serves 450 students in grade 6-12
- Our students come from all over East Oakland.
 - 90.5% of our students are Latinx
 - 4.2% of our students are Black/African American
 - 3% of our students are Asian
 - 80% of our students speak Spanish as their first language
 - 97% of our students qualify for Free/Reduced Lunch
 - 22.3% of our students have IFPs











Overview of Life Academy

- 95.1% Graduation rate 2024, 4.9% still enrolled
- 93.4% of 2024 Graduates A-G eligible
- 20.3% Reclassification rates 2024
- 56% of students enrolled in Dual Enrollment (80% passed with C or better)
- 80% of students engaged in internships
- 100% of students in grade 10 who have received healthcare certifications:
 - FIrst Aid
 - Mental Health First Aid
 - \circ CPR
 - Stop the Bleed Certification
- We pride ourselves in living out the values of being a small school-by-design: connection, collaboration, and cohesiveness.















Health & Bioscience

Life Academy's pathway supports students in cultivating their knowledge and interest in the following areas:

- Public Health
- Biotechnology
- Health Care
 - Careers beyond becoming a doctor: medical assistant, physical therapist, emergency tech, nurse, dental tech, phlebotomist, medical interpreter, etc











Reflections on 2024-2025: Progress to Goals



Goal 1: By 2026 all humanities classes will have a unit dedicated to a text that is aligned with our pathway themes (healthcare, public health, bioscience/technology).

Goal 2: By 2026 Life's internship program will be thriving, with 100% of all Life Academy juniors enrolled in an internship, a work based learning opportunity, and/or a dual enrollment course.

Goal 3: By 2026, all students will be prepared to take higher level math courses (AP Calc, AP Stats, or Dual Enrollment Calc/Stats) by senior year.







Life Academy of Health & Bioscience Progress in 2024-2025

Our Pathway Progress:

- Alignment around our nascent Graduate Profile
- Collaboration with Highland Hospital HEAL Program + Dual Enrollment
- Increase in student attendance in youth focused conferences aligned to our Academy themes (i.e. Samuel Merritt Bright Minds, UC Davis Behavioral Health)
- Increase in job shadowing opportunities (i.e. Kaiser, Genentech, BioRad)
- All students and families are aware of math proficiency levels and are tracking their own/their student's progress
- ILT cohesion and alignment around standards
- Strong gains in creating more effective IEP goals that reflect student needs and alignment to Grad Profile competencies
- Strong Pathway aligned units in 9th and 12th grade Humanities (Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks, The Spirit Catches You and You Fall Down). Preparations to add The Anxious Generation to 10th Grade HUM 25-26.









Life Academy of Health & Bioscience Challenges in 2024-2025

Our Pathway Challenges:

- The Small School model and the Pathway model don't always align
 - Master scheduling for grade levels of 65
 - Providing pathways to career / minimum numbers for DE courses
- Tension with upholding two values in math and science
 - Ensuring that we are opening as many doors for young people to live choice-filled lives
 - Attending to equity across cohorts by NOT tracking via math and science courses
- Recruiting teachers who have a background and/or interest in health care/health sciences
- There is never enough time to attend to the work that we know is necessary to move the needle for kids









Life Academy of Health & Bioscience Insights on 2024-2025

Big Insight #1:

- Our work on the graduate profile will underscore all our subsequent strategic goals and the levers we pull to meet these goals. In the remainder of the 24-25 school year, we will:
 - Complete Life Academy Graduate Profile aligned to our Academy themes
 - Create a Scope & Sequence for the teaching (and reteaching) of each competency in grades 9-12
 - Design rubrics for each competency

Why Now?

- Post COVID we back and we are sharper than ever
- Academy Team is stable and strong
- We have a Pathway Coach who is positioned to lead this work
- We retrospectively see that we need to have a stronger "North Star" through which we filter our programmatic, pathway and curricular decisions (i.e. our Measure H Strategic Goals)
