

Our KIPPsters and Future Leaders

- Our students represent West Oakland and the greater Oakland community. This school year, we have 267 students in grade five through eight.
 - 72% African-American
 - 24% Hispanic or Latino
 - 4% Asian or Pacific Islander
 - 72% qualify for federal free- and reduce-price meals

 Measurable results and focus on college graduation




Our Results

 KIPP Bridge Charter School was named a California Distinguished School in 2011, an award that is given to fewer than one percent of California public schools annually.



KIPP Bridge API Score Over Time



- Our API scores has increased significantly over time to a phenomenal score of 911 in 2011.
- We have a Similar Schools Rank of 10 and a Statewide Rank of 9.

Our Results - continued


 In 2011, KIPP Bridge was awarded the Hart Vision Charter School of the Year Award by the California Charter Schools Association.



- * KIPP Bridge was also featured in "Chartering and Choice as an Achievement Gap-Closing Reform", a report published by the California Charter Schools Association, for its outstanding results in educating African-American students and closing the achievement gap.
- API scores for African American students increased by 114 points from 2007 to 2010 and increased its African American proficiency rates by more than 22% in ELA and 30% in math.

KIPP Bridge Students in College

- Our founding Class of 2010 has an 86% college matriculation and 92% high school graduation rates (1 student still persisting).
- The Class of 2011 has an 80% college matriculation and 88% high school graduation rates (3 students still persisting).
- Our students have gone on to colleges such as UC Berkeley, UC Riverside,
 Barnard College, CSU Sacramento, CSU Fullerton, Lewis & Clark University,
 Sonoma State University, St. Mary's College, Mills College, and George Washington University.
