These smaller schools, featuring teams of dedicated
educators and parents, are producing personalized
learning environments that foster improved
attendance and higher academic performance.





The close synergy among teachers, parents and administrators has resulted in better student-teacher interaction, increased parent-teacher rapport and, most importantly, a more effective learning setting where students do better in school.

These new schools are the result of the commitment of the Oakland Unified School District to systematic change and its burning focus on improving classroom outcome.



The Oakland Unified School District's goals are equity and high standards. We are committed to closing the achievement gap so that all of our students will have access to post-secondary education. We are focusing on strategies that provide greater opportunities for African American, Latino, second-language learners and students from lower socioeconomic backgrounds.

We already know what works - improved instruction, sensitivity to diversity, high standards and closer relationships among students, parents and educators. OUSD is eradicating the

accountability gap so that all parties are collectively responsible for the rise in each child's performance.







#### What Has OUSD Already Accomplished?

Greater face-to-face interaction and steady, hands-on leadership is producing measurable results:

- New Small Autonomous School attendance as of 2002-2003 climbed to a rate of 95%-97%\*, well outperforming comparison schools
- High school enrollment increased 38% across the District (all in one year)\*\*
- High school graduation rates above national average

Additionally, we have seen marked increases in individual scores on state-mandated tests. Students who were previously evaluated among those groups displaying lower academic performance are now counted among some of OUSD's strongest performers.


