D. Welcome and Chabot Elementary School Highlight

Jonathan Meyer, Chabot Principal, welcomed everyone to the Board Meeting. He said they are celebrating their new building. Mr. Meyer thanked the taxpayers of Oakland for Measure "B". He pointed to the second building, still under construction, that will house kindergarten through 2nd grade students. Mr. Meyer acknowledged the Chabot Teachers in the audience. He said the school has done well focusing on the achievement gap. Chabot's scored 932 as a school on the API Index and African American Students scored 870. Mr. Meyer presented Board Member with a Chabot Tote Bag.

Director Jody London presented a slide show highlighting the progress of the construction project to date. She said one of the things staff wanted was a multi-purpose room where the entire school could have an assembly together. The school made a compromise to keep six portable classrooms on the upper yard in exchange for a multi-purpose room.

Last year Voncile and James co-founded African American Student Action Planners, an organization which supports African American Students and their families at Oakland Technical High School. They also began the CAHSE Intervention Program to mentor and tutor 38 African American Senior who failed CAHSE and in danger of not graduating.

Mr. Harris said you volunteer because you care. He said if your wife is going to do something you can't say no.

Director London read from the Recognition being presented to Phyllis and Tony Hall. Phyllis coordinates Westlake's Extended Day Program and much of its Mental Health Programming as well. Student Director Eric Adams reported:

All City Council (ACC) Middle School Update

We just had our monthly Middle School Leadership Meeting on Tuesday October 20th, with 37 students representing 5 middle schools (Barack Obama Academy, Edna Brewer, Montera, Melrose Leadership Academy, and Explore). The ACC Governing Board led a workshop on the importance of our School Site Councils, what they do, and how middle school students can participate in them. Students walked away really interested in joining or at least attending their respective school site councils.

Our middle school delegates reported the following improvements at their schools:

- · Melrose is continuing their project to get lockers. Students are organizing fund raisers with food sales and a community day to build lockers at Melrose.
- Explore students are seeing that stricter rules, after school activities, and conflict management are resulting in overall better relationships between people at Explore
- · Students at Edna Brewer are happy about their new mural, longer lunches and longer passing periods
- · Montera students were excited about room improvements on room 400 and more peaceful passing periods
- Students felt that there is a more unified student body at Barack Obama.

Some remaining concerns for our middle school delegates are:

- · Students frustrated with each others' attitudes, lack of funding (for lockers), and school lunches at Melrose
- Lack of field trips, issues with cafeteria food, and gum chewing at Montera
- · Violence and bullying, foul language, negative reinforcement, issues with uniforms,

We also just had our monthly High School ACC General Meeting on October 15th. We revised and adopted our Student Bill of Rights and Responsibilities. We had a lot of student participation, and we were excited to see all of the students show such great interest in working on the document. Yashida Crawford, Executive Director Moving Forward Education, spoke on behalf of Martin Luther King Elementary School and the possible closing of that school. She said at their Back-To-School Night the school had over 100 parents in attendance. She said last week they had their Family Reading Night and over 100 family members participated in the event citing that a lot of the parents were walking back to their homes. That is one of the benefits of a neighborhood school like Martin Luther King. When schools like Martin Luther King are closed and students are forced to attend schools elsewhere, that has the unintentional consequence of preventing parents who want to be advocates for their children's education from being a part of the process because they have to make arrangements to get to the campus that they may not have. She said a majority of the parents at the school do not know there is a possibility the school may be closed.

Gregory Mitchell, Moving Forward Education at Martin Luther King Elementary School, said he found out today the school might be closing. He said West Oakland is a community that is under served and under resourced. He spoke of the incarnation and homicide rates in West Oakland saying he can only see it getting worse.

Linda Chambers, Teacher at Martin Luther King School for 29 years, said she loves teaching at Martin Luther King School. She asked the Board to consider the school has a new Principal. She said she has seen the school go through a lot of changes and thinks the new principal has brought new positive energy to the school. She said the teachers enjoy working with the Principal. She said she thinks the test scores will reflect the renewed energy and hard work this year.

Ida Oberman submitted a petition for Community School for Creative Education for the Board's consideration.

Steven Neat, Teacher at Kaiser Elementary School, speaking tonight regarding the teachers receiving a contract offer in the next few weeks that's worth agreeing to. He said the District receives \$3,000 more per student that the state average and the District pay teachers \$10,000 less than the state average. He said a flyer was handed out at a recent Board Meeting and on the flyer the District claimed "Teachers are underpaid and we are exploring ways to increase teacher salaries."

Laverne Bell, Parent at Martin Luther King School, said she has volunteered at the school for three years and is President of the PTA. She said with all the hard work she put into the school she would hate to see the school close. She said the Family Reading Night was excellent and she helped with that event.

Will Delaney, Grandparent of a Martin Luther King School student, said since Ms. Groves has been Principal, he has seen a renewed inspiration with teachers, parents and the students. He said they are in the process of developing multiple programs to help the children increase their academics. He said he would hate to see all their efforts go to waste at Martin Luther King School. He asked the Board not to take the school away and let the community bring the school where it needs to be.

Oscar Wright said he has seen a lot of change take place here. Mr. Wright said of the Superintendent that he believes he really wants to make this school district all it can be for all of our children. He said we have a new Chief of Police and we now have a chance to make a turn. He said we now have the opportunity to make the school district what it should be.

Jim Modercai spoke about Martin Luther King School and any of the West Oakland Schools that are closed. He said the Board's challenge is whatever school is closed you have to explain it in straight terms. He said every school you consider closing you have to answer this question, Why? He said there are certain rules that have to be followed.

Ben Visnick, Oakland High School Teacher, said it disturbs him that the teachers have a 3% pay cut on the table again. He said the District needs to adopt a Comprehensive Pedestrian Awareness, Injury Prevention Curriculum and Driver Safety Program. He said for the last 10 years Driver Education Teachers have fought to maintain this legally required high school class. He said through Results Based Budgeting most Principals in the high schools have cut the program against state law. Mr. Visnick requested the Superintendent meet with the remaining Driver Education Teachers to plan the reimplementation of the Driver Education Program.

J. Report of Regular Board Members

Director Spearman read to the audience an email from Director Hodge who is out of town attending the Council of Great City Schools Conference. The email read "Greetings, unfortunately I am unable to participate in the important meeting tonight because I am taking advantage of a learning opportunity offered by the Council of Great City Schools. I wish the Superintendent and other the Directors were here. I came a day early to attend the pre-conference session on the process of seeking and supporting outstanding district leadership. I had a change to reflect on the amazing work we have done as a Board of Education in the last six months beginning with our search for the Superintendent and the

summer time process of selecting and contracting with the best Superintendent in the nation. We have done a great job. I look forward to bringing back good information that will help us conduct a meaningful and rich evaluation with the Superintendent. Today was the best part, we spent time looking at the Board of Education doing self evaluation. This is critical to defining the success of the District, our ability to self evaluate as a Board will ultimately allow us to have a greater impact on the performance and support of the Superintendent. If we deem to become more reflective of our work together as a team and identify ways to improve we will feel more accountability and I dare say gain credibility with the community of educators, students and families we serve. Tonight is the beginning of many intense, thoughtful and challenging meetings. Now more than ever we should be centering ourselves to listen and support each other to do the best work. Have a great meeting, listen well and put families and students first tonight. The West Oakland Brain Trust will meet Monday, November 2nd 8:30a.m. at the Prescott-Joseph Center.

Director Spearman asked the Board to dedicate this meeting in the memory of Alana Williams, a Frick Middle School Student who was the victim of a hit and run accident. Director Spearman reported in District 7 they are starting to have many conversations with all the high schools in District 7 as to what they are going to look like. She said we are going to have to make some hard decisions; everybody is not going to be pleased with some of the decisions we are going to make. We are going to try and make them together and make them in a way that everyone will understand. Director Spearman said on behalf of the family of Alana Williams, we would like to thank the District/Community for coming together and giving that family the support.

Vice President Yee reported last week in District 4 there were many celebrations and fund raisers. He said there is energy and optimism at schools and among the people. Vice President Yee reported that at the last meeting we heard an announcement from Director Kakishiba and he said thanks to President Gallo and General Counsel Minor we are hosting a Board Study Session on November 12th at 6:00 P.M. in the Board Room to talk about the matter. He encouraged those who have followed this to attend the meeting. Vice President Yee acknowledged the Staff Award Ceremony held for all District Staff where the contributions of all staff were celebrated.

Director Kakishiba said he would hold his remarks and reserve his time for the three big academic items on the agenda tonight.

Director Dobbins thanked Director Spearman for all her work during the tragedy at Frick Middle School. He reported the District is working with Councilmember Brooks to ensure a traffic light is installed on 64th Avenue and Foothill Blvd. He thanked the Mayor's Office for getting the Crossing Guard.

District 6 Events:

Director London thanked the Board and Board Staff for helping set up the meeting here tonight. She said she wanted the Board Meeting held at Chabot so that everyone to see what you can get for \$19 Million in Oakland. Director London said she would like for us to have a comprehensive safety program in conjunction with the City where we do safe routes to school audits at all campuses. She said the findings of the safety study will be different in every neighborhood.

- On November 11th Director London will be the guest speaker of the Piedmont Avenue School Neighborhood Improvement League talking about some of the same issues we are going to talk about tonight. The meeting will be held at the Piedmont Gardens Senior Center and she is scheduled to speak at 7:45 P.M.

President Gallo recognized Director Spearman for her work and the kindness she demonstrated in East Oakland to the Frick Middle School Community. President Gallo said she not only helped the Williams Family directly; she was also involved with the school. She helped organized the community and he said he wanted to commend her publicly for her outstanding job representing the District. He also thanked Laura Moran for the many days she spent with the family and at Frick Middle School.

President Gallo asked the Superintendent to respond to the Martin Luther King parents about the school closure and a response regarding where we are at this point with the Teacher's Contract.

Dr. Smith responded to the questions about Martin Luther King School. He said the process for the conversations with school closures is open. The conversations at each school site will be: 1) What are the benefits? 2) How is this school serving children? 3) What is the highest quality option in that neighborhood? He said we need to be looking at the whole regional strategy for how we are serving children in the city. This is a quality education conversation; not a school closure conversation. Dr. Smith said he wanted to ensure where our children are is of the highest quality and best place for them to be for the long haul. He said when you look at the health of a school and of a community, if you have too few students in an area to sustain both the economic viability of a school and the quality of instructional services at that school; we need to figure out how to get the best available options for those students and families. That's the conversation we are in. What's the right strategy for Martin Luther King School? That's for us to decide in the next six weeks. Dr. Smith said he will be making a recommendation to the Board based on conversations with community and staff bringing those recommendations to the Board on December 9th. These care conversations are ongoing and he said he doesn't have a decision made already. There are recommendations that we have been public about and now we are in conversation. He said he was clear with staff that he did not want to decide and then defend. Dr. Smith said his job is to make his best recommendation for the health and well being of all the children in the city.

Dr. Smith responded to the teacher's contract question. He said we have been in conversation and working with the teacher's union. He said he has no desire to take

anything away from the teachers and we are trying to figure out how to come to agreement in really hard times.

President Gallo said everyone needs to be engaged with the conversations the Board will be having from here until December. He said in December the Board will have to take some action. He said we need to be very clear as we go through the budget discussions at the school sites and in the community; that we have to be very clear and look at it from the business prospective. Our enrollment keeps decreasing and we have competitors, charter schools. President Gallo said he has been visiting the charter schools seeing what they are doing differently; observing their administrative levels and how they are able to function; what their facilities look like and how they are able to maintain them. President Gallo said we need to learn from our competition; not only the charter schools but the neighboring school districts because they are in competition for the students we do have.

Director Kakishiba presented this item to the Board. He said included in the agenda is an outline centered on what the Board needs to decide on and the calendar is built around that. The Superintendent has a more detailed process calendar with more meetings. The calendar was developed in Committee with staff. Director Kakishiba said the calendar will come back at the November Board of Education Meeting for final adoption.

Board Members Comments

Director London thanked Director Kakishiba for his leadership on this. She asked if the Board was definitely having a Board Meeting on Saturday, November 14th?

Director Kakishiba said originally the meeting was scheduled for November 16th.

Brad Stam, Chief Academic Officer, said the original meeting was scheduled for November 16th but he cannot attend that meeting. Mr. Stam said he is hoping Director Kakishiba was available on November 14th and they could poll the Board on their availability. He said we have a request from community members to get those dates so we are posting those dates. He said the framework the Board is looking at is decision making; what needs to be done by when so that we can make the most informed decision possible. He said we are looking at somewhere between \$80 Million-\$100 Million over the next few years. This is

not a cut of \$27 Million this year and survive.

Laura Moran, Chief Services Officer, said we did discuss this at the study session and we are hoping that it could be adopted tonight; if there were any changes we could make those. We are also trying to integrate all the Community Engagement Sessions Board Members will be hosting as well as the Superintendent to get a set of core questions we will be asking at each session so that we can collect the input from the community and be able to bring back to the Board summarized feedback. She said we are going to do a deeper set of questions for the Principals and Site Administrators and the Student Board Members are getting feedback from the student body.

Director London asked about the development of an on-line tool.

Ms. Moran said we are going to have a way for people to answer some questions on-line and provide some feedback.

Director Kakishiba said he recommends, if it is ok with the rest of the Board, to meet on Saturday, November 14th at 9:00 A.M. and schedule the calendar for formal adoption at that meeting.

Director Kakishiba said this is the Board's first discussion on the Superintendent's proposed strategic budget priorities for 2010-2011. This is a work in progress and not the final recommendations. This is a tool for us to start the discussion about what the Board thinks some of the priorities are in this context; giving the Superintendent feedback and to come back at subsequent Board Meetings between now and December. Director Kakishiba said it is important for us to give the Superintendent that feedback. Director Kakishiba asked Dr. Smith to present and frame this for the Board.

Public Comments

Ben Visnick said he appreciated President Gallo's comments about building ADA in the District. He said there is a trend back from the private schools to Skyline High School and he hopes we see the trend at Oakland High School and Oakland Tech High School. He said many of our former affluent parents cannot afford to pay \$30,000 a year for a private school education when we can offer an equivalent education in the District.

Ward Rountree said this should not be a discussion just about the budget but it has to be about the priorities of the District and its expenditures. He said the goal of the District is educating its 38,000 students and making sure they have all that they need to be successful.

He said not only should we talk about the budget, we have to talk about it in the context of what is good for the education of the 38,000 students in the District. He said before you set the budget the Board should set the priorities for the expenditures.

Betty Olson-Jones said it does start with your priorities. She said under No Child Left Behind our country has become obsessed and addicted to the lure of test scores. Everything is based on that priority. She said we don't need all those buckets of money going into professional development; we need to use the expertise we already have.

Anna Turetsky, AFT President, said we don't want the students coming home to parents who are not there and who have to work for \$8 and hour in bad areas at entry levels for the rest of their lives. We don't want to lower the intelligence and education of the people who are contributing to our society. We must provide these skills to adults. We always have.

Jim Mordecai said you have a lot of issues which begins with the big picture. When you set priorities and resources, you can say we are going to bring in the resources and we are going to make sure we change that. He said whatever resources you had yesterday you have less tomorrow. When looking at setting academic priorities you have to take an attitude.

Joanna Lougin, UAOS, said we have had the opportunity to meet several times with Mr. Hal, Chief Financial Officer, going over the budget stuff. Ms. Lougin said Mr. Hal has been doing a wonderful job. He has been explaining the necessary items people need to know. She said when I look at these priorities you have listed: 1)Effective principals at every school. 2)Effective teachers retained at every school. 3)Quality teacher support and collaboration. She said these priorities are going to take money. Ms. Lougin asked Board Members if they are going to be strong enough to support the Superintendent when it gets down to the rubber hitting the road?

Response from the Superintendent

Dr. Smith said from the beginning he has been talking about academic and fiscal solvency. He said they have to be twins. If you over invest in one we have seen what happens, the District is taken over. He said we have to maintain local control to make local decisions that are in the best interest of our children. He said to create the conditions he has heard people talk about it has to be done locally. He said his job is to make the best recommendations for academic and fiscal solvency.

Dr. Smith described academic solvency as eliminating a gap in performance. He said if tests didn't reflect what we see outside of school, I would be on board. Unfortunately, those same gaps exist in terms of increased mortally rate; lack of access to jobs; and increased likelihood to die violent deaths. He said those patterns play out and we have a change to interrupt them. The tool we have is standardized tests. Until we have a different measure, we have to close the gaps on the tests we have now. He said we cannot starve this organization and chip it across the same and think we are going to do better. We have to be different outcomes for all our students and do it with less money. How will that happen? I have been directed by the Board to make my recommendation for the academic priorities I think will get us to the next best place. He said we must have safety and school climate has to be the conditions that promote and protect our children. There has been a huge focus on literacy in the District, scripted. There have been some gains with Open Court. We have to have literacy for a purpose. He said the priorities he is

recommending to the Board are academic priorities, not strategies. Dr. Smith asked Brad Stam and Laura Moran to elaborate on the subject.

Brad Stam said he echoes Dr. Smith's passion on the need to focus on quality teaching; it is the heart and soul of what we do here in the District. He said quality teaching means results in high levels in learning for every student, in every classroom, everyday. With the massive cuts the District faces, we are going to have to do things differently. It will mean fewer central resources and fewer contracts. We continue a trend to build on the over 100 Teachers on Special Assignment currently coaching other teachers in the District to build their capacity to be able to support all teachers who have needs. We have been investing and we continue to invest trying to build the instructional knowledge base and competence of our teacher leader corps and teacher corps internally and with some external partnerships. Mr. Stam said he believes we have made a significant investment and we will see the product of that investment continue to flower.

Laura Moran talked about safe and supportive schools priority. She said this set of priorities starts with supporting something already happening at our schools, teachers and staff are creating safety for our student's every day. Ms. Moran said she is at the schools when things are going well and when things are in crisis. What you notice is the students and the families really trust our teachers, principals and classified staff at our schools around creating this feeling of safety and belonging. We have to find a way to fund these priorities that don't come out of the District's General Fund.

Ms. Moran spoke of strategies for Secure Campuses and Violence Reduction.

- · We had a contract with OPD that we phased out of and we have been rebuilding our own police department.
- · We hired a chief that is committed to building the national model for a school based community policing services integrated into the school community.
- · Our school police department have taken over the School Security Officer Program and is continuing to look at ways to upgrade that program.
- · Mandatory extended student learning on afterschool, Saturday's and summers to have productive things for our students to do.
- · Promoting Restorative Justice and Restorative Practices. Our Board's Safety Committee asked that we develop a Board Policy that we will be bringing to you shortly.
- · Truancy Reduction.
- · Continuing to engage civic and community partners to reduce violence in the community.
- · Community School Movement.

President Gallo asked Ms. Moran about closed campuses during lunch.

Ms. Moran said we have already started to close campuses for lunch as a safety measure; it will help with truancy and safety on the campuses.

- McClymonds we are closing the campus for 9th and 10th graders.
- · Castlemont we will be closing the campus for 9th and 10th graders before the end of the semester.

Fremont - we are working on that site.

Board Comments

Student Director Adams said there is a big worry for some students around what quality teaching is. He asked that the OEA and Ms. Moran partner with All City Council and talk with them about what they feel quality teaching is. He said regarding truancy, ACC has been holding focus groups around what students say the reason they don't come to school. Some of the responses were "My teacher just doesn't talk to me"; "My teacher does not teach to who I need to be taught as"; "My teacher cannot talk to me this way"; "My teacher doesn't know; explain something to me." He said if we can talk to youth and invest in them we can increase the good they are doing, what they are learning and the rate they are learning at.

President Gallo said for the school climate and culture one of the recommendations he will make to staff will be to work on a resolution, especially at the elementary school years. He said we allow 12 days for the family to be out of school and not be penalized or the child lose their spot in the classroom. He said we need to redefine the 12 day rule or reduce the number of days to six(6) or eight(8).

Director Spearman stressed the importance of parent education. She said we are going to have to take a look at what is going on with parent education and ensure that we have good parent education. She said we have a generation of parents that have no understanding of how to access the system and how to assist their children. She said in pockets of the District people have the capacity to do so. Director Spearman cited the Martin Luther King, Jr. School Parents speaking tonight saying they did not hear about the possible school closure until yesterday. She said we have been having this conversation over a year. She said a lot of people do not have these on-line tools in their house. She said they have cell phones because that is the device they use. We are going to start looking at the technology that is used in the everyday home.

Director London said she supports the priorities. She noted Mr. Stam said we are going to have less money for contracts. She said she hears from teachers often saying they would like to be assisting us in developing assessments and other tools. She encouraged staff to think about how we can use our existing work force. Director London said she agrees we need more training for parent development. She said the quality and consistency of after school services is critical. She said parents need to know there is a safe place for their child to be after school if they can't be there to pick the child up.

Vice President Yee said the real challenge is effective teaching and effective teachers which are not necessarily the same thing. He said effective teaching and effective instructional practices are the most powerful priorities we can focus on. The importance is we all agree on what is effective instructional practice. He said without the effective instructional practice, the A-G is meaningless. Vice President Yee said it is time to agree on a set of high quality instructional practices that we all can say this is what effective teaching is.

Director Dobbins said on our priorities the safe and supportive is the foundation of what we are doing. He said the reality of why people are choosing or not choosing our schools system is because they feel safe. Director Dobbins said he wondered how many students who attend Bancroft Middle School in San Leandro should be going to Oakland Public Schools? He said students will start out in elementary schools citing several schools in the Oakland Hills but leave Oakland for middle school because the parents don't feel safe.

Director Kakishiba said as a Board this is probably one of the most important decisions they will make around money. He said in order for us to lead this District and improve the lives of 38,000 young people, we have to do some of the things people have already said about schools. We as a Board are responsible for being very focused. Director Kakishiba said we are not looking at a service economy to drive student achievement; we are looking at the basic premise that if you have effective instruction in every classroom, young people are going to learn. They are going to want to be in school; build relationships. We voted our number one priority as having effective instruction in every classroom. We then voted on five essentials things to help us to get there. He said he sees some of them in the report and the presentation tonight that help articulate much of that. He said he thinks there was a very important investment with the 24% salary increase for teachers 10 years ago. We did not say this is what it will cost and this is how we are going to pay for it. Each year the Board and Superintendent are responsible for making sure that we made those cuts so that we can pay for those things. We have to figure out how we can invest more money into compensation for teachers and principals that's aimed at reducing turnover and flight; that provides more opportunities for professional growth and development.

N. Superintendent's Report

Dr. Smith reported on the Employee Recognition recently held that honored District employees. He said the employees were so proud of the certificate given them at the event. It is important that we recognize and honor the good work we are all doing. On Tuesday's and Friday's Dr. Smith said he visits school sites. He said he has been impressed by the way in which our children are welcomed and greeted and he is impressed about what is happening our schools. He reported that on Monday, November 2nd at 6:00 P.M. the new Police Chief, the Mayor and he will be at Prescott School to talk about what it take to create the kind of high priorities and focus on children we want to see and the kind of partnerships we can create. Dr. Smith said we have to make hard decisions and as a community we have to figure out how to stay committed and not tear each other down. He said we have to create a culture of trust and belief and believe that we can do this together. He said if we are fighting each other and tearing each other apart, the children will not be successful. Dr. Smith said he is open and willing to learn; to hear and be lead by people with good ideas. He asked that we all stay humble in this work.

Public Comments

Ward Rountree said he is excited about the discussion we just had about the academic priorities of this school district. He said this is what we have been asking for. He said it is important that the Board help set the agenda of what happens in the schools of this community.

O. Adoption of General Consent Report

Public Comments

Oscar Wright commented on the new construction work at Chabot School. He said last July he was asked to serve an unfinished term on the Measure "B" Committee. He said he had a chance to visit schools to see where and how the Measure "B" money was being spent. He said he saw the disparity in some of our schools compared to other schools. He noted that he only saw one black person on a job site. He said too much money is being wasted in Professional Service Agreements.

Jose Ortiz presented President Gallo with a certificate recognizing his efforts with (COPA) Community Outreach Program Alternative.

Jim Mordecai said he would hope other property owners would come and see how their money is being spent. He said Measure "G" had an oversight committee and they were promised the public would be involved. He said when you have expenditures that are supposed to go through an oversight committee it should be on the agenda.

Betty Olson-Jones said the Board needs to figure out the priorities and then we see where the budget goes. She said our Substitute Teachers make \$118 a day. Teachers who work after their duty day make \$23 dollars an hour. She said teachers put in all these additional hours and she said we need to come to the Board and say we need that tripled; she said it works for the Service Contracts.

Director Spearman had concerns regarding contracts on the agenda for Sports4Kids. She said there is a Standard that specifies what a PE Teacher is or who has to lead recess in elementary schools.

Brad Stam said the students are supervised during recess.

Director Spearman asked was there supposed to be a credential person supervising children during recess or sports activities in elementary schools?

Mr. Stam said, "Yes." He said the services Sports4Kids provides are done under that supervision and are compliant with the Education Code.

Director Spearman asked why we would have to give a contract to somebody to provide those services under the supervision of somebody.

Mr. Stam replied that it allows for relief for the majority of teachers so teachers have a duty free lunch. He said there is still supervision provided and Sports4Kids is probably the most popular and widely used program in the District among elementary schools.

Director Spearman asked Mr. Stam why an outside agency is providing this when it should be somebody working at the school doing this. She said if we are supposed to do this, why don't we have an FTE to do this?

Mr. Stam said some schools invest in a Prep Teacher to do PE. He said there may have been a time in the District where all teachers taught PE or certificated PE Teachers at elementary school. He said we do have a shortage of credential PE Teachers in the District.

Denise Saddler, Elementary NEXO, provided some additional information about Sports4Kids. She said Sports4Kids is a program not necessarily for recess and PE time. It's an opportunity to have an athlete work with the students on the physical education skills. She said this one of the programs that teachers like because it supports their work.

Mr. Stam said we have a childhood obesity epidemic in this city and it is necessary.

Jim Modercai said he thinks Director Spearman has it correct. There is a lot of support for

this program. It has a lot of good aspects to it.
