Amendments to Board Policy BP 3513.3 and 5131.62

Action Requested

Approval by the Board of Education of modifications in Board Policies 3513.3 and 5131.62

Background

Staff is recommending approval of changes in Board Policy 3513.3 and 5131.62 to conform to recommended changes by the California Department of Education and changes in state law relating to electronic cigarettes. It defines prohibited tobacco products to include products containing tobacco or nicotine, including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, miniature cigars, smokeless tobacco, snuff, chew, clove cigarettes, betel, electronic cigarettes, electronic hookahs, and other vapor-emitting devices, with or without nicotine content that mimic the use of tobacco products.

Discussion

The changes in the Board Policy conform to changes in State law and CDE's recommended definition of "tobacco products." The proposed changes are based upon the California School Board Association's recommended model and have been reviewed by the Office of the General Counsel.

Business and Noninstructional Operations

BP 3513.3 - Tobacco-Free Schools

The Governing Board recognizes that smoking and other uses of tobacco and nicotine products constitute a serious public health hazard and are inconsistent with district goals to provide a healthy environment for students and staff.

The Board prohibits the use of tobacco products at any time in district-owned or leased buildings, on district property, and in district vehicles. (Health and Safety Code 104420; Labor Code 6404.5; 20 USC 6083)

This prohibition applies to all employees, students, and visitors at any school-sponsored instructional program, activity, or athletic event held on or off district property. Any written joint use agreement governing community use of district facilities or grounds shall include notice of the district's tobacco-free schools policy and consequences for violations of the policy.

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The products prohibited include any product containing tobacco or nicotine, including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, miniature cigars, smokeless tobacco, snuff, chew, and clove cigarettes, on district-owned or leased property, and in district vehicles at all times. This prohibition also applies to electronic nicotine delivery systems, such as electronic cigarettes, electronic hookahs, and other vapor emitting devices, with or without nicotine content, that mimic the use of tobacco products any time,

This policy does not prohibit the use or possession of prescription products, or other FDA-approved cessation aids that have been approved by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Food and Drug Administration, such as nicotine patches or nicotine gum. Student use or possession of such products must conform to laws governing student use and possession of medications on school property.

Smoking or use of any tobacco-related product or disposal of any tobacco-related waste is prohibited within 25 feet of any playground, except on a public sidewalk located within 25 feet of the playground. In addition, any form of intimidation, threat, or retaliation against a person for attempting to enforce this policy is prohibited. (Health and Safety Code 104495)

Board PolicyStudents

BP 5131.62 - Tobacco

The Governing Board recognizes that tobacco use presents serious health risks and desires to provide support and assistance in the prevention and intervention of tobacco use among youth.

(cf. 5131.6 Alcohol and Other Drugs)

The Governing Board recognizes the serious health risks presented by tobacco use and desires to ensure that, through adoption of consistent policies, district students are made aware of those risks and, to the extent possible, protected from them. The Superintendent or designee shall establish a coordinated school health system which includes a comprehensive behavioral health education component that teaches students the knowledge, skills, and attitudes they need in order to lead healthy lives and avoid high-risk behaviors, such as tobacco use.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide prevention, intervention, and cessation education, information, activities, and/or referrals to district students and shall ensure consistent enforcement of district policies prohibiting student possession and use of tobacco products.

Prohibition Against Tobacco Use

Students shall not possess, smoke, or use tobacco, or any product containing tobacco or nicotine, or have in their possession, while on campus, while attending school-sponsored activities, or while under the supervision and control of district employees The products prohibited include any product containing tobacco or nicotine, including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, miniature cigars, smokeless tobacco, snuff, chew, and clove cigarettes, on district-owned or leased property, and in district vehicles at all times. This prohibition also applies to electronic nicotine delivery systems, such as electronic cigarettes, electronic hookahs, and other vapor emitting devices, with or without nicotine content, that mimic the use of tobacco products any time,

This policy does not prohibit the use or possession of prescription products, or other FDA-approved cessation aids that have been approved by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Food and Drug Administration, such as nicotine patches or nicotine gum. Student use or possession of such products must conform to laws governing student use and possession of medications on school property.

The district's comprehensive prevention / intervention program shall be based on an ongoing assessment of objective data regarding tobacco use in the schools, including but not limited to the California Healthy Kids Survey, and community and ongoing research identifying strategies that have proved effective in prevention or reducing tobacco use among youth. The program shall be designed to meet a set of measurable goals and objectives and shall be periodically evaluated to assess progress.

Prevention Instruction

The district shall provide developmentally appropriate, scientifically researched tobacco_use prevention curriculum from the Local Educational Agency Plan listinstruction for students in grades kindergarten through 12at selected grade levels from K-12 pursuant to Education Code 51202. Such instruction shall be aligned with state content standards and the state curriculum framework for health education and with any requirements of state and/or federal grant programs in which the district participates.

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The Superintendent or designee also may provide students with counseling and other support services to assist in the prevention or reduction of tobacco use.

Because of the additional health risks of tobacco use for prenatal development, the district shall provide outreach, motivational and other support services to prevent or reduce tobacco use among pregnant and parenting minors.

Information about smoking cessation programs shall be made available and encouraged for students and staff. (Health and Safety Code 104420)

The Superintendent or designee shall coordinate prevention and

The district may provide or refer students to counseling, intensive education, and other intervention services to assist in the cessation of tobacco use. Such intervention services shall be provided as an alternative to suspension for tobacco possession. See, also, District Administrative Regulation 5131.62 Tobacco Referral Policy and Intervention Protocol.

Program Planning

The district's tobacco-use prevention and intervention program shall be based on an assessment of tobacco-use problems in district schools and the community, an examination of existing services and activities in the community, and a determination of high-risk student populations that are most in need of district services. The district's comprehensive prevention / intervention program shall be based on an ongoing assessment of objective data regarding tobacco use in the schools, including but not limited to the California Healthy Kids Survey, and community and ongoing research identifying strategies that have proved effective in prevention or reducing tobacco use among youth. The program shall be designed to meet a set of measurable goals and objectives and shall be periodically evaluated to assess progress.

The Superintendent or designee shall coordinate with the local health department and county office of education in program planning and implementation. He/she may establish an advisory council including students, parents/guardians, district staff, representatives of the local health department and community organizations and, law enforcement professionals, and/or others with demonstrated expertise in tobacco prevention and cessation.

The Superintendent or designee also shall coordinate the district's tobacco-use prevention and intervention program with other district efforts to reduce students' use of illegal substances and to promote student wellness.

The Superintendent or designee shall involve students, parents/guardians, families and the community in support of school-select tobacco-use prevention programs based programs.on the model program designs identified by the California Department of Education (CDE) and may adapt the model to meet district needs. (Health and Safety Code 104420)

The Superintendent or designee shall not accept for distribution any materials or advertisements that promote the use or sale of tobacco products. He/she also shall not accept tobacco-use prevention or intervention funds or materials from the tobacco industry or from any entity which is known to have received funding from the tobacco industry.

Program Evaluation

To evaluate the effectiveness of the district's program and ensure accountability, the Superintendent or designee shall biennially administer the California Healthy Kids Survey or other appropriate student survey at selected grade levels in order to assess student attitudes toward tobacco and student use of tobacco. He/she also shall annually report to the Board, and to the CDE if required, the data specified in Health and Safety Code 104450.
