H. Public Comments on All Non-Agenda Items Within the Subject Matter Jurisdiction of the Committee

There were no Public Speaker Cards submitted.

I. Superintendent of Schools or Designee's Committee Liaison Report

Chairperson Gallo said Assistant Superintendent for Facilities Planning and Management, Timothy White, has a report regarding the District's heating systems and other issues taking place at some schools due to the weather. Chairperson Gallo said the Committee appreciates the work of the Facilities Staff upgrading and modernizing District facilities. He said we have to recognize within the District's 119 schools plus administrative facilities, there is great need for repairs. He said in a case such as Frick Middle School when the heating is not working, staff makes every effort to make sure there is a temporary fix or a permanent fix. He recognized the Facilities Staff for their quick response and improvement.

Chairperson Gallo said the residents of Oakland need to recognize and accept the fact the District has made tremendous improvements to our sites, but there are some sites that need additional repairs. He said he has no hesitation to say the District will ask the citizens for an another Facilities Bond to make sure students have an environment that is welcoming and inviting.

Mr. White provided the Committee a status report regarding the District's heating systems. Mr. White thanked the Board for their vision in the past for recognizing Facilities needs. He reported the recent cold snap has been particularly harsh even though it was for a short period. He said since returning from the Thanksgiving Holiday Break, the District had approximately 70 work order tickets related to heating repair issues. He reported out of

the 70 work order tickets submitted, as of last Thursday the department had completed the repairs on all but 20 of the tickets. He said of the remaining 20 tickets that had not been completed, on Friday and the weekend they were being worked on. He said as of yesterday, the work for the 20 remaining tickets was completed or in progress. He said 44 boiler systems have been identified to be in poor working condition and need replacing. He said those boilers are temperamental, and in some cases, the District is better off not ever shutting the system down once the system is up and running. He said until the boilers in that category are replaced with more energy efficient boilers, the District has to make some kind of decision regarding managing those boiler systems differently than we manage the rest of the inventory. He said in some cases facilities maintenance staff are successful in getting the boilers up and running and they make take two or three visits to make sure they reach the steady state of operation where the heating conditions are comfortable for the occupants. He said in some cases when the technicians leave the site, the boiler is up and operational and they have to make return visits periodically until the boiler reaches a steady state of operation. He said the lessons learned from last year and this year as the District has gone dark, realizing signification amounts of savings by going dark as it relates to heating and electrical savings, we may want to have a different approach as it relates to some sites where the equipment is old. He said over Winter Recess the District will look at different strategies, not abandoning the efforts to save money through energy savings but to temper them so the District doesn't take hits in terms of its credibility.

Director London said she assumes the District has a Deferred Maintenance List.

Mr. White said Yes."

Director London asked if the boilers were included on the Deferred Maintenance List.

Mr. White said many boilers are on the Deferred Maintenance List and they have been replaced during modernizations over the last several years.

Director London aksed if it was possible for the Committee to see the Deferred Maintenance List and will the list be a part of the Facilities Master Plan?

Mr. White said "No doubt". He said one of the issues with the Deferred Maintenance List is so many repairs qualify for Deferred Maintenance and the list is routinely updated. He said this is a year where the Deferred Maintenance List will be updated. He said it is a conversation he has had with the Director of Buildings & Grounds, Leroy Stokes, and there will be some modifications to the list. He said the list can be updated yearly but if the District is going to prioritize heat, other repairs will have to come off the list. He noted that heat is a health and safety issue as well as are many of the eligible Deferred Maintenance Projects.

Director London suggested the District review the Deferred Maintenance List with P G & E because the utility is trying to spend \$2 billion in Energy Efficiency money and there may be some rebate opportunities for the District.

Chairperson Gallo apologized to the students and parents of the District. He said the heating systems have been corrected.

Mr. White said the heating systems have been routinely addressed and he thinks they will

have to be addressed again.

Chairperson Gallo asked Mr. White if he walked into a school, was the District keeping students warm even if it is a temporary heating system?

Mr. White said for the majority of the schools that had heating problems he would characterize the issue as having been addressed. He said additional calls continue to come in and he doesn't see the calls stopping through the heating season as the District continues to struggle with an aging infrastructure. He said the District has 500 acres of land, hundreds of different buildings and in many cases, the heating systems are not uniform. He said with boiler systems replaced made through the Capital Program, the issues associated with the discussion and this particular trade is the fact that the District has the same number of schools to maintain with a dwindling workforce. He said with new equipment coming on-line in certain places, the District has expanded the amount of its heating equipment inventory and reduced the amount of resources to address that inventory.

J. Introduction of New Legislative Matter

New Matter - Director London requested a report on how the District is doing Master Planning for the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility. She said her interest is making sure the District is able to have that integrated into the Facilities Master Plan. She said the Committee has not looked at the Operational Expectation around facilities and that is a key piece around evaluating the Superintendent. She said what the leadership is looking from this Committee are the four indicators to be used. Chairperson Gallo said he thought the committee had discussed the Operational Expectations for facilities. Mr. White said there was a short discussion about that as it relates to the Superintendent's evaluation. Chairperson Gallo said certainly it can be brought to the Committee again.
