Backgroun d

In August 2013, the United States Department of Education ("DOE") granted eight California school districts including, OUSD, a one year waiver from No Child Left Behind ("NCLB"), in exchange for locally developed plans to prepare all students for college and career, focus aid for the needlest students, and support effective teaching. The waivers releases OUSD and the other districts from six ESEA requirements and their associated regulatory, administrative and reporting requirements. The waivers also release Title I set asides expenditures previously designated for Supplemental Education Services in the amount of \$3,400,000 to support the implementation of the waivers. The resolution before the Board is Staff's recommendation as to how to use the \$3.4 Million dollars.

WHEREAS, in August 2013, the United States Department of Education ("DOE") granted eight California school districts including, Oakland Unified, Fresno Unified, Long Beach Unified, Los Angeles Unified, Sacramento City Unified, San Francisco Unified, Sanger Unified, and Santa Ana Unified, a one year waiver from No Child Left Behind ("NCLB"), in exchange for locally developed plans to prepare all students for college and career, focus aid for the neediest students, and support effective teaching and leadership;

WHEREAS, these eight districts submitted a joint request to DOE for waivers as part of the California Office to Reform Education (CORE);

WHEREAS, the CORE waivers releases the CORE districts from six ESEA requirements and their associated regulatory, administrative and reporting requirements;

WHEREAS, the CORE waivers are authorized under the Elementary and Secondary Act of 1965, section 9401, as amended;

WHEREAS, the CORE waivers were granted directly to the districts participating in CORE, and not to the CORE organization;

WHEREAS, the approved CORE waivers release Title I set asides expenditures previously designated for Supplemental Education Services in the amount of **\$3,400,000** to support the implementation of the CORE Waiver in support of the students of Oakland;

WHEREAS, the categories of allowable Title I expenditures under the CORE waiver include:

- 1. School Interventions for:
 - a. Priority
 - b. Focus
 - c. Other Title I School
 - d. Low-Achieving Student Groups
- 2. Support for school partnering teams Priority, Focus
- 3. Support for communities of practice
- 4. Waiver implementation
- 5. CCSS implementation and assessment transition in Title I schools
- 6. Stakeholder outreach and engagement

WHEREAS, District Staff previously recommended to the Board of Education that the funds be used as follows:

- a. 65% (\$2,217,000 of the \$3,400,000) of the Total Title I Set Asides be allocated to schools to support their improvement plans and their planning.
- b. 15% of the Total I Set Asides will be allocated to develop two College and Career Readiness Ambassadors (parent leaders) at each school site who will gain an understanding of the Common Core and the multiple strategies and resources available to assist parents as they support their child towards College and Career Readiness.
- c. 20% of the Total Title I Set Aside will be allocated to support Instructional Leadership Teams (Teachers and Principals) especially new principals as well as principals of priority, focus and other Title I schools that need additional support in Common Core implementation. In addition, these resources will support the development of a set of tools and resources to increase the capacity of educators to successfully engage English Language Learners, Students with Disabilities and African American Students with Common Core aligned curriculum.
