TO ALL INTERESTED PARTIES PLEASE TAKE NO-TICE THAT ON WEDNESDAY, October 8, 2014, at a Regular Meeting of the Governing Board ("Board") of the Oakland Unified School Dis-trict, the Board will hold a public hearing on the District's Sufficiency of Textbooks and Instruc-tional Materials-School Year 2014-2015.

The public hearing will be held, October 8, 2014, at 6:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter, as the mat-ter may be heard in The Great Room, LaEscuelita Education Center, 1050 2nd Avenue, Oakland, CA 94606-2291.

California Education Code Section 60119 requires that the Board hold a public hearing, within the first eight weeks of school, to deter-mine for each pupil the sufficiency of textbooks or instructional materials or both,

- aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Sections 60605 or 60605.8 in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frame-work adopted by the state board [of educa-tion] is:

- Work adopted by the state board for eace tion] in: (i) Mathematics. (ii) Science. (iii) History-social science. (iv) English language arts, including the Eng-lish language development component of an adopted program; and .
- consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board [of education] for foreign lan-guage or health course(s).
- And sufficiency of laboratory science equip-ment . . . applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 to 12, inclusive.

Parents, teachers, members of the community interested in the affairs of the school district, and bargaining unit leaders are urged to partic-ipate in the hearing.
