**Subject** Presentation - Revised Oakland Unified School District's Graduate Profile - High School Linked Learning Office

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**Action Requested and Recommendation** Presentation by staff on the Revised Oakland Unified School District's Graduate Profile.

**Background** The Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) underwent a process to engage various stakeholders in revising the OUSD Graduate Profile to ensure K-12 instructional coherence in order for students to graduate college, career and community ready. The OUSD Graduate Profile defines what is meant by being college, career and community ready. It outlines the knowledge, disposition and skills must obtain and demonstrate in order to be prepared to pursue an array of post-secondary opportunities. It's five domains (community leaders, creative problem solvers, critical thinkers, collaborative teammates and resilient learners) and multiple indicators integrate Common Core Standards, CTE and community readiness standards.

The District began it's initial development of the graduate profile in 2011, and over the years, has engaged various stakeholders in helping shape the content of the proposed graduate profile.
