




Foundational Literacy

In SY 23-24, the number of KIPP Bridge kinder students reading at grade level grew from 18% → 73%.

We believe literacy is the foundation of all learning, and ensure every student enjoys reading and writing through:

- A challenging, rich, culturally diverse curriculum grounded in the science of reading
- Systematic phonics instruction
- Progress monitoring and small-group interventions




English Language Development

We apply a scientific, assets-based approach to ELD, featuring:

- 56.5% in 2023 (7% pts higher than state)

In 2023-2024 Bridge middle school students made academic growth at the 99th percentile relative to their peers.

Academic Impact: In 2022-2023, Black, Latinx and English Learner Students outperformed their peers statewide
