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



- ELLs have the lowest graduation rate of our targeted subgroups.






GROWTH OF NEWCOMER ENROLLMENT IN OUSD HIGH SCHOOLS

- The number of high school newcomers increased by 71% between 2011-12 and 2013-14
- In 2014-15, expect 130-200 newcomers to enroll in high school between October 1 and the end of the school year.

ELL REVIEW

- Last Spring, we commissioned Stanford to conduct an ELL Review focused on quality of programs and instruction. Preliminary Findings as well as the OUSD data narrative highlight the urgent need to focus on:
 - Parity of instructional quality for ELLs
 - Specialized programs for newcomers, SIFE, Long-term ELLs
 - Bilingual programs (uneven quality and non-existent in secondary)

FOCUS AREA: NEWCOMER ACTIONS TAKEN TO DATE

- Hired the country's first Unaccompanied Minor Support Services Consultant
- Granted a Haas Senior Grant to expand academic and social services to UAC
- New budget formula for newcomer programs
- Oakland International established as a lab school
- Expansion of Oakland High newcomer program by 100 seats and plans to expand at middle schools
- Established Newcomer Task Force

- Strategic Plan update on track for November 19, 2014 Board Meeting (review & adoption).
- Hiring Deputy Chief of Early Learning who will lead the change management for 0-8 initiatives and ensuring successful outcomes for all students by 3rd grade.
- Academic Leadership Team Goals:
 - Quality Schools
 - Deepening Common Core Instructional Practices
 - College, Career & Community Readiness
 - Building a Professional Culture
- Non-Public School team is working to identify students enrolled in Non-Public Schools who are ready to return to district special education programs.

DISTRICT WIDE EFFORTS

- Completed documentation of the entire Prop. 39 facility use process and on task to meet all deadlines associated.
- Leader Growth & Development System: stakeholders working on BloomBoard system so that it will be ready for all principals in their goal setting sessions with Network & Deputy Superintendents.
- Teacher Growth & Development System: 60% of schools participating in pilot are on track to complete preliminary observation system & SMARTe goals by 10/31. Engaging with other schools & Network Superintendents to determine personalized course of action.
- The Tenure Affirmation Cycle from 2013-14 has been closed by distributing tenure award letters & gifts for all teachers newly awarded tenure this year.
