- 5. An individual Board Member will not use the media as a personal forum, unless it is clearly indicated that the opinion is personal and not representative of the Board majority position.
- 6. Each Board Member will make every effort to attend all Board meetings in person; and to start and end on time.
- 7. Board Members will ensure opportunities for each to comment.

Superintendent

- 8. Staff is the responsibility of the Superintendent who will bring recommendations to the Board for action.
- 9. Questions regarding Board agenda items are to be communicated to the Superintendent prior to the Board meeting and the Superintendent will respond in a timely manner.

W. Introduction of New Legislative Matter(s)

Every Regular Meeting Agenda of the Board shall provide for the Introduction of New Matter(s). A Board member (except a Student Director), or a member of the Public desiring to have a motion, resolution, order, or other subject matter scheduled for consideration or action by the Board shall announce the subject nature of the intended matter during this item, provide written language of the specific legislative proposal and supporting documentation for such item, if any. The President shall assign the subject matter to the appropriate standing or special committee, if appropriate, for consideration of its programmatic, financial and/or other impact or consideration.

If the request to place a matter on the Board's Agenda pertains to a Closed Session topic, the President of the Board may so advise the member or the person requesting inclusion of such matter on the meeting Agenda.
