E. Adoption of the Committee General Consent Report

Chairperson Yee said they had received a report recently about keeping a lot of consultant expenditures. Are we moving in that direction and is there someone keeping track of the budget code and funding category? Mr. Stam said he would bring information back to the committee. Chairperson Yee said we know the cost of consultants is tied in with expenditures at the site and there are many funding sources. He requested ongoing information to explain to the public when the consultant contracts appear on the agenda. As we are constructing the consent calendar for this committee, the amounts and the funding sources are noted. Is there a way to pull that information and put it into a running spread sheet that would details amounts being paid from the various funding sources? Mr. Stam asked if amendments should be shown as part of the cumulative total? Mr. Rakestraw said he is unsure if the chairperson is asking whether the information should be detailed by vendor information cumulatively or whether he is asking for programmatic information. That would be a factor to be considered. Chairperson Yee said there will be public comments saying we spent millions of dollars on consultant contracts and where it has gone. It would be nice to have a listing available that would detail monies going to the site, to instructional services, etc., along with funding source.

Director Hodge said she would not wish to make an onerous request of staff that would require a justification for every single contractor. For her it is the process. She gets calls from consultants from the nonprofits and community-based organizations for assistance in getting paid from the District.

Vernon Hal, Chief Financial Officer, said he would work with the Procurement Office and the Technology Department to develop a listing by vendor, resource and location, to get a sense of the cumulative dollars of consultants hired for school sites, central office, restricted and unrestricted, and resource code.

Director Hodge said she has heard from her constituents regarding the single site plans process. She asked staff how they were making the single site plans more relevant and useful?

Brad Stam, Chief Academic Officer, said the single site plan is an annual plan, as opposed to a multi-year strategic plan. We will begin a new cycle in the fall. Schools will be engaged in visioning, goal setting and strategy development around their data and historic data patterns. We are starting early so that the RBB process does not drive the process. We have required principals to review a first draft of their plan with colleagues and central office personnel to get feedback on the appropriateness and power of the strategies identified with school communities to address the needs assessment section of the plan. The other main improvement is pushing toward an on-line tool so that it is easily accessible and would be a public document and could be easily updated. We plan to include the school community in the cycle of inquiry that would identify root causes, set goals and identify strategies to meet the goals.

Director Hodge asked about the strategic planning process and if the capacity of Network Officers and principals are to guide such a process. What are those skills and what is the professional development to get people where they need to be? Mr. Stam said it is his responsibility to ensure that the educational leadership team has skills to support principals to engage their school communities in this process. Part of our professional development is to go through a visioning process and have that as a model for what will cascade to the networks and to the schools; then to build out that vision based on where we currently are; then identify barriers, root causes and the intermediate goals to be put in place and the strategies to get there. Our challenge is to ensure we get a process that is strong enough, and is authentic; that it engages people, is clear enough and is doable so that school communities will be successful; to identify the areas in need of targeted support, i.e, school improvement coaches, BAYSES coaches, State and Federal staff, Network Officers and their supports, to ensure that we are all on the same page. The Network Officer did an inventory of principal strengths and areas of growth based on our

leadership competencies. Visioning was an area that needed more development for principals. We will be engaging on a collaborative effort on what it means to support principals to engage their school communities in the visioning process.

Chairperson Yee asked Mr. Stam about the role of board member in school site development. When will the site plan be in development? Mr. Stam said he can bring the proposed calendar for this process to committee.

Marcus Silvi, Program Manager, said Street Academy, Tilden School, and Manzanita Community Schools, have not submitted acceptable school site plans.

Presentation Swun Math - OUSD Math - A Five Year Plan for Building Oakland Unified School District's Capacity to Accelerate Student Achievement In Mathematics.

Brad Stam, Chief Academic Officer, used a PowerPoint in his presentation.

Mr. Stam reviewed the history of the Swun Math Program in Long Beach Unified which showed significant growth in student achievement and engagement in mathematics in his classroom that he was asked to become a math coach for the school. Subsequently the whole school showed dramatic gains in math achievement. He subsequently became a math coach for the entire school. Then Long Beach Unified saw dramatic gains in student achievement across all of its elementary schools as a consequence of the implementation of this program.

Si Swun has worked with Oakland Unified now for three years. We started year One with 3 elementary schools in Grades 2-5; then expanded to eight schools in year 2. This past year, we have expanded to 20 schools in Grades 2-5 and we have a pilot of K-1 at four of those schools in addition to a sixth grade pilot at three of our middle schools. We expanded professional development for principals, teacher leaders and coaches to support the program.

Mr. Stam reviewed the information contained on the PowerPoint related to "The Road to Capacity Building". For Year I we wish to build the capacity of district principals,

principal leaders and coaches and to support this program going forward. We are doing a significant expansion of math coaches and math teacher leaders this year and they will need intensive support over this year for the apprentice model to be successful. The scope includes all elementary schools, all middle schools, over 15 Phase II ready elementary and middle school sites.

Mr. Stam noted Bella Vista, Lakeview and Horace Mann Schools have been in the program for three years and had almost 20 point gains on the CST Math.

Mr. Stam reviewed information on CST Performance of Swun Math and Comparison Group Students in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade. The third grade Swun Math students scored an average of 11 points higher on the 2007-08 math CST than comparison students. The fourth grade Swun Math students scored an average of 22 points higher than comparison students; the change in 5th grade was more modest. While these are district benchmark assessments that have been developed by Si Swun, this is their rigorous assessments.

Chairperson Yee said he was impressed with the gains made at the 3rd, 4th and 5th grades, especially the fifth grade scores.

Heidi Boley, Manager K-12 Mathematics, said the Swun Math program recognizes the need for early intervention. Director Hodge asked about intervention strategies. Ms. Boley said the intervention includes an additional 30 minutes of math instruction per day. We have added more components to the program and are beginning to include fractions and decimals. We are not charged for the interventional materials. In some schools, the after school staff has been invited to attend the trainings which are implemented after school and during school. There is flexibility involved. The new component that we are adding is a broader offerings of parent workshops. We have four parent workshops. That will be expanded. The Office of Family and Community Services was included in the training and utilized their translation services.

Director Hodge asked about the capacity building piece. How many principals and teachers are going through professional development? What are the numbers for staff training?

Ms. Boley said every school that is participating in the Swun Math program are involved in 4.5 days of professional development every year. The training takes place during the summer and during the year. The principals will receive training, too. Mr. Stam said we are focused on systemic coherence and alignment to get this dramatic change so that students are truly prepared for success in algebra.

Director Hodge said she is in support of this program. There has been some work in the preschool area and she does not see it in tonight's materials. The early childhood development piece is very important for her.

Ms. Boley said she has met with Lynne Rodezno, Director of Early Childhood Education, today and they talked about obtaining math curriculum materials to be used at the preschool level. Ms. Rodezno was invited to select a teacher leader from each child development center to attend the Swun Math Kindergarten training.

Chairperson Yee asked about the implementation of this program at all elementary schools.

Ms. Boley said we are using one pacing guide this year and one set of District assessments. It creates greater opportunity for sharing among schools. We have been careful about not expanding too quickly. At this point more than 50 percent of the elementary schools have implemented the program. It gives us an opportunity to think ahead. Chairperson Yee said there should only be one set of assessments. Mr. Stam said it is the responsibility of principals to build their parents' understanding of the academic program. Chairperson Yee asked if Network Officers intend to organize a family presentation on the math program. Sharon Casanares, Network Officer, said Laurel Elementary is on the list for this school year. The school had community engagement to introduce academic strategies, English Language Arts and Math. Director Dobbins spoke in support of the Si Swun Math Program.

Denise Sadder, Network Officer, said Sankofa, Santa Fe, Lafayette, and Prescott had Math Nights last year with parents.

Mr. Stam said a video will be shared with board members at the next meeting on the Swun Math Program.

Mr. Stam said the contract provides for professional development for the 30 elementary schools that are not official Swun Math schools. Every teacher in the District in every elementary and middle school will be able to participate in professional development.

Ms. Boley said Phase II is called the Inquiry Lesson. It builds upon the original lessons designed. It allows students to tackle problems using their own prior knowledge and they come up with their solutions. After the teacher models the lesson, they look back at the ways they approached the problem and determine if there are multiple approaches to doing the problem which requires a higher level of skill for both teacher and student. It is hoped that we will get at least 20 percent of our schools into Phase II by the end of next year.

I. Introduction of New Legislative Matter

Chairperson Yee said last year at the end of the semester we talked about a recommendation for school closure possibilities. Hopefully, by the next meeting we will be able to talk about it if there are going to be any decisions. Chairperson Yee said last year we held open the possibility of accelerating some school closures. We had Tilden on the

books. We had asked to begin the discussions so that we do not make the decision too far into the year so that everybody knows that it is coming. Director Hodge said we talked a lot about right sizing and we ended the year talking about right sizing. Vernon Hal talked about wanting to do some stakeholder outreach to principals on the question of the teenie-tiny small schools. Mr. Stam said this is a top priority for Cabinet discussions. We are in the midst of bringing the Superintendent up to speed on the subject. The proposed calendar will be brought to committee that could a discussion about the engagements and criteria for closure. We can bring information on proposed changes to the tiering system that are focused more on API and less on AYP. Director Hodge said we get caught up in quagmire of discussions. Is teenie-tiny small schools a real category? What is staff thinking about it? She asked staff to show committee members the criteria for teenie-tiny small schools. Mr. Stam said staff may not be able to present the information at the next committee meeting. Director Hodge said there is a level of conversation that we need to have and it might be better to happen at the committee level. Mr. Stam referred to the preliminary calendar for committee feedback. Some of the strategies can be presented for committee feedback, as well as engagement and process. The financial analysis might not be done in two weeks. Chairperson Yee said we left a few schools hanging. We are talking about one school in District 6, several schools in District 7, and a few in District 3. He is concerned about Robeson. At some point, these are fiscal decisions. The purpose of having committees is that we take an academic prospective on it and take a look at it. He is not expecting any recommendations. We need to know where the cabinet is in terms of their thinking about right sizing schools.

Chairperson Yee said by the next committee meeting we will have our CST and API scores. What is the schedule of announcement? Mr. Stam said a date for the presentation had been listed in the Coherence Governance calendar, as well as a date for the students Results policy presentation. Staff has to do the analytics. Mr. Stam said Cabinet had a question about the relationship around issues such as student assessment results and the whole process surrounding school closures and school portfolio management. He wishes to ensure committee members are clear around where the different conversation are going to happen and in what sequence. Chairperson Yee said they could be of service to staff as they present their positions because the committee can better understand and have a thorough discussion. Mr. stam said on the issue of school closures, it needs to be clear on which committees to calendar, the process, and sequence. Director Hodge said she needs a definition of teenie-tiny schools and of right sizing. That is a finance conversaton. She has to be clear about the language.

Regarding Tilden, Chairperson Yee asked how do we ensure that instructional services to all the students is most cost effectively provided by the decisions that are made that have fiscal impact? We need to speak on that behalf.

Chairperson Yee said he is interested in the A-G requirements. We were going to set up a committee. What is the status?
