
'Ed Specs' Overview

- The 'ingredients for school design' (each project uses its own 'recipe' but with the same basic ingredients)
- A set of standards that translate curricular intent into spatial requirements that support it
- A **communication tool** for the Facilities Team to relay standards across all school sites and age cohorts for modernization and new construction projects. Used in communications with:
 - o Architect & Engineering Teams
 - o School Site Principals
 - o Parents & Community




