Ask of the Board	Approval by the Board of Education of Amendment No. 1 to the Cost Reimbursement Subaward by and between the District and California State University, East Bay Foundation, Inc., Hayward, CA, the Fiscal Agent, for the California Regional K-16 Education Collaboratives Grant Program, with the former accepting \$70,000.00, increasing the agreement from \$30,000.00, to amount for the budget (action) period of January 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025, with an Incrementally Finalized Total of \$100,000,00, for the estimated performance period of January 1, 2024 through June 30, 2026, to support OUSD's strategic plan for high school students with focus on enhancing their dual enrollment initiative, pursuant to the terms and conditions thereof, via the High School Linked Learning Office.
Background	The Oakland Unified School District participates in the California Regional K-16 Education Collaboratives Grant Program, funded by the California Department of General Services (DGS) and administered by the Foundation for California Community Colleges (FCCC). The fiscal agent for the Bay region is CSU East Bay Foundation, Inc.
Discussion	The Oakland Unified School District's participation in the California Regional K-16 Education Collaboratives Grant Program through the Bay Area K-16 Collaborative will enable McClymonds High School to increase Dual Enrollment programming, with a focus on college and career pathway alignment to high growth and high-wage industries, and supporting LCAP focal groups with accessing and succeeding in Dual Enrollment, with the ultimate goal of postsecondary matriculation. The funding provided by the grant will pay for essential costs associated with increased growth and improvements to the Dual Enrollment program at McClymonds HS. The California Bay Area K-16 Collaborative aims to strengthen linkages among school districts, community colleges, universities, and employers to streamline educational pathways and address inequities in education and employment in three vital sectors of the Bay Area economy. Collectively, partners will transform the student experience in three priority pathway sectors: Education,

Engineering/Computing, and Healthcare/Biotechnology. This grant program will support activities related to supporting the overarching goals of the Partnership:

- 1. Increase the number of graduates with postsecondary degrees and certifications in high-growth, high-wage disciplines that will meet the region's economic and labor market needs.
- 2. Address race equity, diversity, and inclusion of our most vulnerable populations by reducing economic disparities through improved socioeconomic mobility in degree and certification attainment and the labor market.
- 3. Improve graduation rates and shorten the time to completion for certifications, associate degrees, and bachelor's degrees in pathways to employment to increase educational attainment levels.

The Oakland Unified School District will engage in the collaborative through activities, specifically at McClymonds High School, including:

- 1. Increasing Dual Enrollment (DE) programming at McClymonds HS with Dual Enrollment courses aligned to the school's college and career pathways
- 2. Including DE courses in the Master Schedule leads to more equitable access to DE for focal students during the school day.
- 3. Adding DE courses to the HS course selection process to ensure maximum access and participation, especially of target groups
- 4. Improving and implementing systems around student recruitment and scheduling by supporting staffing capacity to support this work
- 5. Improving and implementing systems around Peralta enrollment and the DE enrollment process
- 6. Providing Dual Enrollment Student Orientations to build student awareness of crucial college success skills
- 7. Other programming is needed to ensure equitable and increased access and success in dual enrollment courses and postsecondary matriculation of DE participants.

BAY AREA K-16 CONSORTIUM GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN CHABOT-LAS POSITAS COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, EAST BAY FOUNDATION, INC.

This agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") is entered into between CHABOT-LAS POSITAS COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT (hereinafter "DISTRICT") and CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, EAST BAY FOUNDATION, INC. (hereinafter "SUBCONTRACTOR"). DISTRICT and SUBCONTRACTOR may be referred to individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties" in this Agreement.

WHEREAS, DISTRICT, as lead organization, was selected to administer the Regional K-16 Education Collaboratives Grant Program for the Bay Area K-6 Collaborative, as a means to "...remove barriers to degree completion, accelerate transfer success, increase equitable participation in early college credit, and expand work-based learning" (hereinafter "GRANT"), which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, by the CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES, PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION (hereinafter "GRANTOR").

WHEREAS, DISTRICT has the right to enter into agreements with outside entities for various services to deliver the services under GRANT; and

WHEREAS, SUBCONTRACTOR has agreed to administer the funds and provide narrative and expenditure reporting, and to provide them according to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Statement of Work

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to perform the work in the Scope of Work (Exhibit B), which by reference is incorporated into this Agreement. SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all provisions, to perform all work as set forth in this Agreement and the aforementioned Statement of Work in a professional, timely and diligent manner.

2. Period of Performance

The period of performance for this Agreement shall be from January 1, 2024, through June 30, 2026, unless terminated earlier in accordance with the termination provisions of this Agreement.

3. Service to the Region

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees that the services provided under this agreement are to serve the population of the incorporated region as defined in the Scope of Work (Exhibit B).

4. Total Costs

The payment of fees to SUBCONTRACTOR for performance of shall not exceed \$4,041,000.00, in accordance with the Budget (Exhibit C).

5. Expenditure of Funds

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees that expenditure of funds under this Agreement will be in accordance with the Scope of Work (Exhibit B) and Budget (Exhibit C), which by reference are incorporated into this Agreement.

6. Payment and Invoicing

Reimbursement for expenditures shall be on monthly basis and payment terms are Net 30 days, computed from the date of receipt of correct and proper invoice with accurate documentation prepared in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. Invoices should be sent to the DISTRICT contact for approval. DISTRICT will review and submit approved invoice to accounting for payment. Payments will not exceed the amount listed above in Section 4. "Total Costs". The final invoice is due no later than August 10, 2026. All reporting must have been completed prior to payment on the final invoice. DISTRICT will provide the invoice form and instructions to the SUBCONTRACTOR.

7. Reporting

SUBCONTRACTOR will provide reports as requested or required by the GRANTOR and/or DISTRICT, in a timely manner in accordance with the Reporting Schedule (Exhibit D).

8. Expenditure of Grant Funds

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all GRANT requirements, noting especially GRANT (Exhibit A) sections entitled "Eligible Expenditures" and "Ineligible Expenditures" and that it is solely responsible for the appropriate expenditure of all GRANT funds received and for any misappropriation or disallowment of GRANT funds.

9. Program Design Requirements

DISTRICT may request SUBCONTRACTOR to follow specific processes and procedures, complete forms or reports, or comply with related directions pertaining to program design, to ensure that projects meet the funding requirements and GRANTOR's expectations and standards.

10. Modifications

If the SUBCONTRACTOR wishes to make changes to the scope of work, then a revised scope of work that describes the requested changes and their impact to the budget and outcomes must be submitted to and approved by the DISTRICT. Changes in methods of implementation (i.e., the means by which the approved scope of work is implemented) or between different budget categories would also require prior approval.

11. Time Extensions

SUBCONTRACTOR must spend the funds allocated through this Agreement within the

timeframe of the Agreement.

12. Independent Contractors

For the purpose of this Agreement and all work and services specified herein, the parties shall be, and shall be deemed to be independent contractors and not agents or employees of the other party.

SUBCONTRACTOR, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor and not as an employee of the DISTRICT. The SUBCONTRACTOR understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided to employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation.

The SUBCONTRACTOR assumes full responsibility for its acts and/or liabilities including those of its employees or agents as they relate to the services provided under this Agreement. The SUBCONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for withholding and payment of all: Federal, State, Local and applicable income taxes; workers' compensation; contributions, including but not limited to, unemployment insurance and social security with respect to the SUBCONTRACTOR's employees. The DISTRICT will not withhold taxes, unemployment insurance or social security for the SUBCONTRACTOR's employees or independent subcontractors.

13. Subcontract Assignment

Except as specifically noted in the Scope Work (Exhibit A), none of the duties of, or work to be performed by, SUBCONTRACTOR under this Agreement shall be sub-contracted or assigned to any agency, consultant, or person without the prior written approval by the DISTRICT. No subcontract or assignment shall terminate or alter the legal obligation of SUBCONTRACTOR pursuant to this Agreement. SUBCONTRACTOR shall ensure that all subcontracts for services and contracted staff are procured in a manner consistent with state guidelines. Upon request, SUBCONTRACTOR shall submit to DISTRICT copies of all sub-contracts for services and contracted staff, and other agreements, as well as documentation indicating the approving authority's approval that relate to this Agreement.

14. Record Keeping

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to maintain project records for possible audit for a minimum of three (3) years after final payment or until any audit findings have been resolved, unless a longer period of records retention is stipulated.

15. Audit

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees that DISTRICT, the GRANTOR, the Bureau of State

Audits, any other appropriate state or federal oversight agency, or their designated representative(s), shall have the right to review and to copy any records and supporting documentation pertaining to the performance of this Agreement. SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to allow the auditor(s) access to such records during normal business hours and to allow interviews of any employees who might reasonably have information related to such records.

16. Mutual Indemnification

Both Parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other Party, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying Party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or willful misconduct of the Parties seeking indemnification or any of its agents or employees.

17. Insurance

Acceptance of this Agreement constitutes that SUBCONTRACTOR is not covered under DISTRICT's general liability insurance and that SUBCONTRACTOR agrees, during the term of this Agreement, to maintain, at the SUBCONTRACTOR's sole expense, all necessary insurance for its officers, agents, and employees, including but not limited to worker's compensation (if required by law), liability, disability, and unemployment insurance.

Certificates of insurance shall be provided to DISTRICT. Specifically, during the term of this agreement, SUBCONTRACTOR shall maintain in full force and effect the kinds of insurance, containing the limits of liability set forth below:

Workers' Compensation: SUBCONTRACTOR shall comply with the workers' compensation law of the state wherein the services are to be rendered. Such policy shall provide coverage for all persons engaged in the activities described in this Agreement under the employ, supervision or control of the SUBCONTRACTOR, and is exempt from the requirement of naming the DISTRICT as Additionally Insured.

General Liability: The policy shall contain a combined single limit of liability of not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence and not less than \$5,000,000 in the aggregate. Automobile Liability: If automotive vehicles are operated by SUBCONTRACTOR in SUBCONTRACTOR's performance of SUBCONTRACTOR's obligations under this agreement, SUBCONTRACTOR shall maintain an automobile liability policy which shall include coverage on all owned, non-owned and hired vehicles and shall have a minimum limit of liability of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

Coverage shall be placed with an insurer having AM Best's Key Rating of "A-" or better, unless SUBCONTRACTOR is self-insured or insured under a Joint Powers Authority, in which

case DISTRICT will review coverage and indicate in writing if coverage is acceptable. SUBCONTRACTOR shall furnish DISTRICT with Certificates of Insurance evidencing such coverage. Such Certificate shall name DISTRICT as additional insureds, and provide that it can be cancelled only with thirty (30) days prior written notice to DISTRICT. If any of the foregoing coverages expire, change, or are canceled, SUBCONTRACTOR shall notify DISTRICT within thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of such expiration, change or cancellation.

The following sentence shall be included in the additional insured endorsements: "Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, its Governing Board, as individuals and as an entity, its officers, directors, employees, and volunteers, are hereby named as additional insured, with respect to all work performed by or on behalf of the named insured under its contract with the Certificate Holder."

18. Termination

Either Party may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice served upon the other Party. Notice shall be deemed served on the date of mailing. Upon termination, or notice thereof, the Parties agree to cooperate with one another in the orderly transfer of contract responsibilities, records, and pertinent documents.

The obligations of DISTRICT under this Agreement are contingent upon the availability of State funds, as applicable, for the reimbursement of SUBCONTRACTOR expenditures, and inclusion of sufficient funds for the services hereunder in the budget approved by the DISTRICT's Board of Trustees for the term under which this Agreement remains in effect. In the event that such funding is terminated or reduced, DISTRICT shall provide SUBCONTRACTOR with written notification of such determination, and DISTRICT will reimburse SUBCONTRACTOR for costs incurred up to the termination date.

19. Disputes

In the event of a dispute between the Parties, the aggrieved Party shall notify the other Party and provide a detailed description of the alleged problem. The Parties agree to use reasonable efforts to resolve such dispute by good faith negotiations and mutual agreement. In the event such informal resolution is not successful within a reasonable period of time, the Parties hereby agree that such dispute will be resolved in the manner specified below.

Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, any dispute concerning any question arising under this Agreement shall be decided by DISTRICT. In such a case, the decision shall be reduced to writing and a copy thereof shall be mailed or otherwise furnished to SUBCONTRACTOR. The decision shall be final and conclusive unless within thirty (30) calendar days from the mailing or delivery of such copy, DISTRICT receives from SUBCONTRACTOR a written request to appeal said decision. Pending final decision of the appeal, SUBCONTRACTOR shall act in accordance with the written decision of DISTRICT. The handling of non-criminal complaints, including discrimination complaints, and complaints and reports of criminal fraud, waste and abuse shall be as prescribed by of California, and/or the GRANTOR, whichever is applicable.

20. Assurances

By signing this Agreement, the SUBCONTRACTOR certifies that it complies with state and federal requirements for standards of conduct, workers' compensation insurance, participation in grant-funded activities, non-discrimination, accessibility for persons with disabilities, drug-free workplace certification, intellectual property, and debarment and suspension, and will adhere to these legal standards and requirements in the performance of work related to this Agreement.

21. Unenforceable Provision

In the event that any provision of this Agreement is unenforceable or held to be unenforceable, then the parties agree that all other provisions of this Agreement remain in full force and effect and shall not be affected thereby.

22. Waiver

Any waiver by DISTRICT of any breach of any one or more of the terms of this Agreement shall not be construed to be a waiver of any subsequent or other breach of the same or of any other term. Failure on the part of the DISTRICT to require full, exact, and complete compliance with any terms of this Agreement shall not be construed as in any manner changing the terms of this Agreement, or stopping the DISTRICT from enforcing the terms of this Agreement.

23. Compliance With Applicable Laws

It is understood and agreed that this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California both as to the interpretation and performance; venue of any action brought with regard to this Agreement shall be in Alameda County, State of California. SUBCONTRACTOR shall be subject to and shall comply with all Federal, State and local laws and regulations applicable with respect to its performance of services under this Agreement.

24. Intellectual Property

Any work product resulting from this Agreement falls under the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Creative Commons Attribution license, which gives permission to the public to reproduce, distribute, perform, display or adapt the licensed materials for any purpose, so long as the user gives attribution to the author.

25. Total Agreement

This Agreement, together with the attachments hereto, expresses the total understanding of both Parties. There are no oral understandings of the Parties or terms and conditions other than as are stated herein. SUBCONTRACTOR acknowledges that it has read and

agrees to all terms and conditions included in this Agreement.
