CONTRACTOR shall not hire any OUSD employee to perform the services in this MOU, and affirms that to the best of its knowledge no such conflict presently exists. CONTRACTOR agrees to alert OUSD in writing if and when a potential conflict does arise.
- 4. Family Education Rights and Privacy Act—CONTRACTOR shall observe District policies and regulations, and state and federal laws, including the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, commonly known as FERPA, related to the confidentiality of pupil and personnel records.
- C. Required Documents—Ensure that all CONTRACTOR personnel who will be on OUSD premises have been: (a) fingerprinted; (b) submitted to DOJ and FBI criminal background check via Live Scan or a similar service as required by the Education Code, and (c) taken a tuberculosis test. Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation that is required.

D. Insurance

The CONTRACTORS' Employers' Liability Insurance shall not be less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident or disease.

At the request of School(s) or OUSD staff, provide reasonable data and information to students participating in the CONTRACTOR's program.
- F. Confidentiality—CONTRACTOR shall maintain strict confidentiality of all information about individual students received under this MOU and will not disseminate such information without the express written consent of OUSD. CONTRACTOR will comply with FERPA, and will be allowed to use the data received to solicit funding to continue to expand its services/program, so long as there is no information from which the identity of any student in the CONTRACTOR's program as a participant could be made.
- G. Register With/Update Community Partner Platform—Contractor shall register in OUSD's Community Partner Platform (CPP) database and perform annual updates by August 31 of each year, to maintain full and complete up-to-date information. The CPP database and instructions may be found online at ousd.org under Partner Organizations.

 - 2. Provide CONTRACTOR with any other student information reasonably necessary to provide its services consistent with the CONTRACTOR's program and to evaluate the impact of its program on students at School(s).

18 Reasons: Scope of Work

1. Services to be provided

18 Reasons will bring to OUSD schools the Cooking Matters program, a six-session series of free cooking and nutrition classes. Cooking Matters is a curriculum that offers basic cooking and nutrition know-how to low-income families who want to eat healthier on a budget. We can provide Cooking Matters classes for kids, for teens, for families, or for parents. These classes are generally 1.5 hours long for kids and teens, and 2 hours long for adults. They consist of a nutrition education component and a hands-on cooking component, culminating in a family-style meal shared by all.

To implement these classes, 18 Reasons brings in an expert team consisting of three people: the coordinator of the class, a chef instructor, and a nutrition instructor. The coordinator will bring in all the food and equipment needed for the class.

In order to ensure a successful class, the site is expected to provide an adequate room for the Cooking Matters series and to designate a site staff member to be the primary contact for 18 Reasons at the school. An adequate room has a sink, space enough to comfortably accommodate the class size, and ventilation. The primary contact from the school would be responsible for making sure the room is available each week, overseeing recruitment and outreach of participants, and helping successfully implement the class.

2. Expected outcomes

Expected outcomes of bringing Cooking Matters classes to OUSD students and families is that we will see positive changes in participants beliefs and practices around healthy eating. Taking a Cooking Matters class gives participants the confidence and skills they need to improve their families' health. Each year, over 2,500 participants graduate from Cooking Matters, taking with them improved eating habits and valuable cooking, nutrition, and household budgeting skills. Graduates report increased fruit and vegetable consumption; increased cooking skills; and increased use of nutrition facts, meal planning, and budgeting skills. Our program is a key component in strategies to improve the health and wellness of all communities.

18 Reasons: Statement of Qualification

18 Reasons' mission is to empower our community with the confidence and creativity needed to buy, cook, and eat good food every day. Our Cooking Matters program brings free cooking and nutrition classes to low-income communities around the Bay Area to do just that.
