# Quality Community Schools Strategic Planning

## INTRODUCTION

- As part of the Strategic Direction of the Oakland Unified School District, through continuous reflection and analysis of the achievements to date as a result of reform efforts employed over the past decade, the Oakland Unified School District has created the **Quality Community Schools Development** (QCSD) group. The focus of QCSD is to support the entire district in systematically reviewing the quality of its schools, initiating significant change efforts where necessary in the interest of continuous improvement, and supporting the overall push to elevate the quality of Oakland's schools on behalf of all children.
- The core strategies of QCSD rely on the establishment of Quality Standards for all schools, in addition to developing processes for how we review the quality of all schools and harnessing the effective practices that already exist within many Oakland schools to further narrow the opportunity gap experienced by many students not currently receiving a high quality public education.
- The following slides present the operating structure of QCSD, as well as key initiatives to be undertaken in the first year of operation in order to help ready the entire organization for success in fulfilling its mission.

# Quality Community Schools Strategic Planning

## QCSD PREMISE:

To develop an **ENGINE** for change within the Oakland Unified School District that will accelerate the development of **high quality community schools** as the norm for Oakland's public schools by:

Developing, through engagement of community and stakeholders, **Quality School Standards** and implementing a **Balanced Performance-based School Quality Review** of school programs and school systems, **including** an assessment of: **Parent & Community Engagement, Teacher Effectiveness, Student Engagement, and Curriculum Quality;**

Identifying and expanding **Effective Practices** in and among Oakland schools;

Applying that learning to more effectively inform **School Quality Management** decision-making, such as major school restructuring, school reconfigurations, and school closure; and

Acting as **critical friend** to the entire organization **by helping to identify where the system must change to support its schools.**

# Quality Community Schools Strategic Planning

## 1. Defining “What is good?”

Through stakeholder engagement, research and harnessing the outcomes of District-wide Task Forces, in 2010-2011 QCSD will

- Establish **School Quality Standards** and

## 2. “How do we see our schools?”

- Develop a **Balanced School Quality Review Process** for all schools.

# Quality Community Schools Strategic Planning

## 3. “How Do We Make Decisions About Our Schools?”

Where existing school options and/or school configurations are not yet effectively serving all students, QCSD will

- Facilitate **Stakeholder Engagement**,
- Conduct **Analysis of School Performance** *based on Quality Standards*, and
- Recommend high-stakes decisions, including **Major School Restructuring and Closure**.

## “How Do We Implement Our Decisions?”

This may result in the following interventions...

Incubation of single-school or multi-school program to replace or improve under-performing school options

Expansion of grade configurations, i.e. from K-5 to PK-8 or 9-12 to 6-12 as the result of multi-year design processes

Replication of school programs and/or effective practices through systematic knowledge transfer

School closures enacted only in favor of meaningful school improvement efforts invested in alternate school options

## GOALS

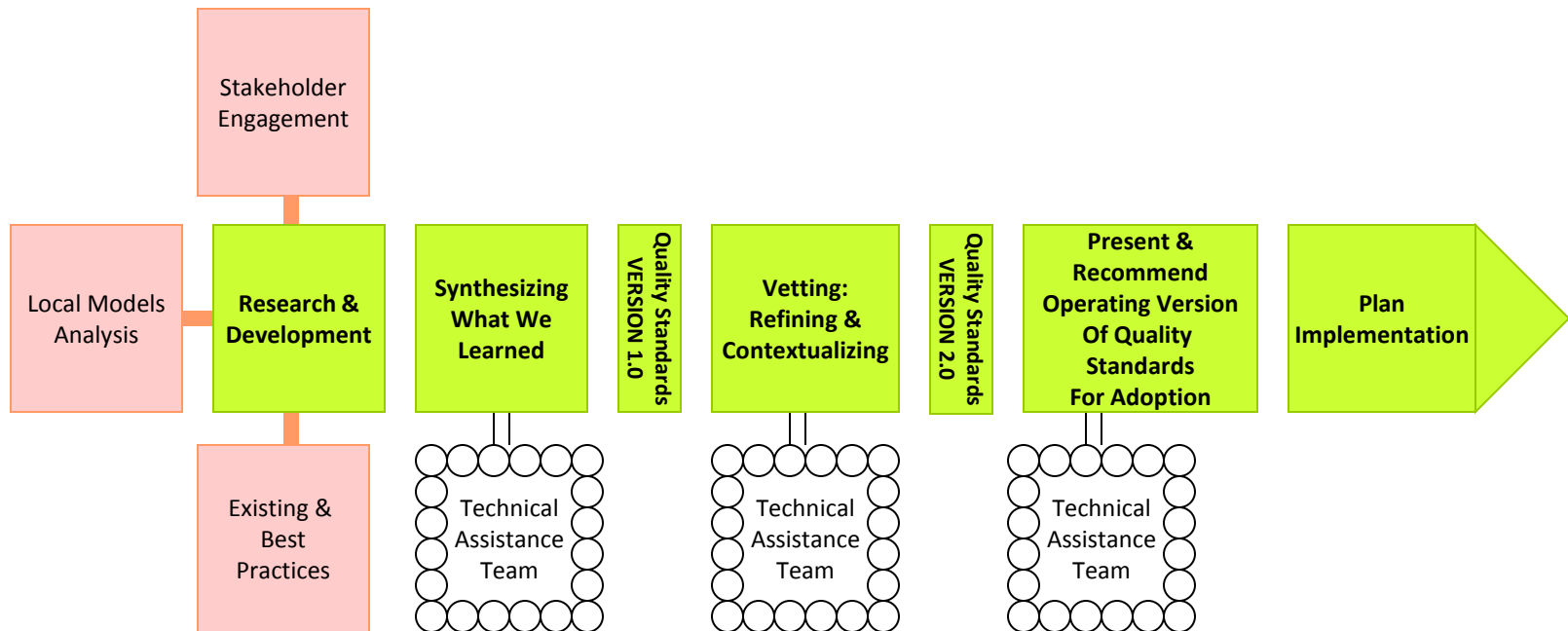
- Develop Standards for School Quality, through stakeholder engagement, review of local models of effective schools, and analysis of existing definitions of school quality
- Develop a Balanced School Quality Review process that may be applied to all schools on cyclical basis
- Develop School Quality Decision-making processes that support major school restructuring
- Support the alignment of tools and processes used throughout the district to reinforce the School Quality Standards

## DELIVERABLES

- Establish an operating set of **School Quality Standards** by May 2011.
  - Conduct stakeholder engagements through the support of schools and local community partners to conduct a listening campaign seeking to define school quality by January 2011
  - Facilitate Technical Assistant Team analysis and synthesis of results from stakeholder engagements, research, and local models by February 2010
  - Establish exemplars of school quality across PreK-12/Adult and in each core subject area, as well as exemplars across non-core disciplines, by April 2011
- Develop process for applying Quality Standards in a **Balanced School Quality Review** by March 2011
  - Pilot Balanced School Quality Review process utilizing beta version of Quality Standards by April 2011
- Develop a **3-year and 5-year strategic plan** for the continuous review of school quality based on School Quality Standards by June 2011

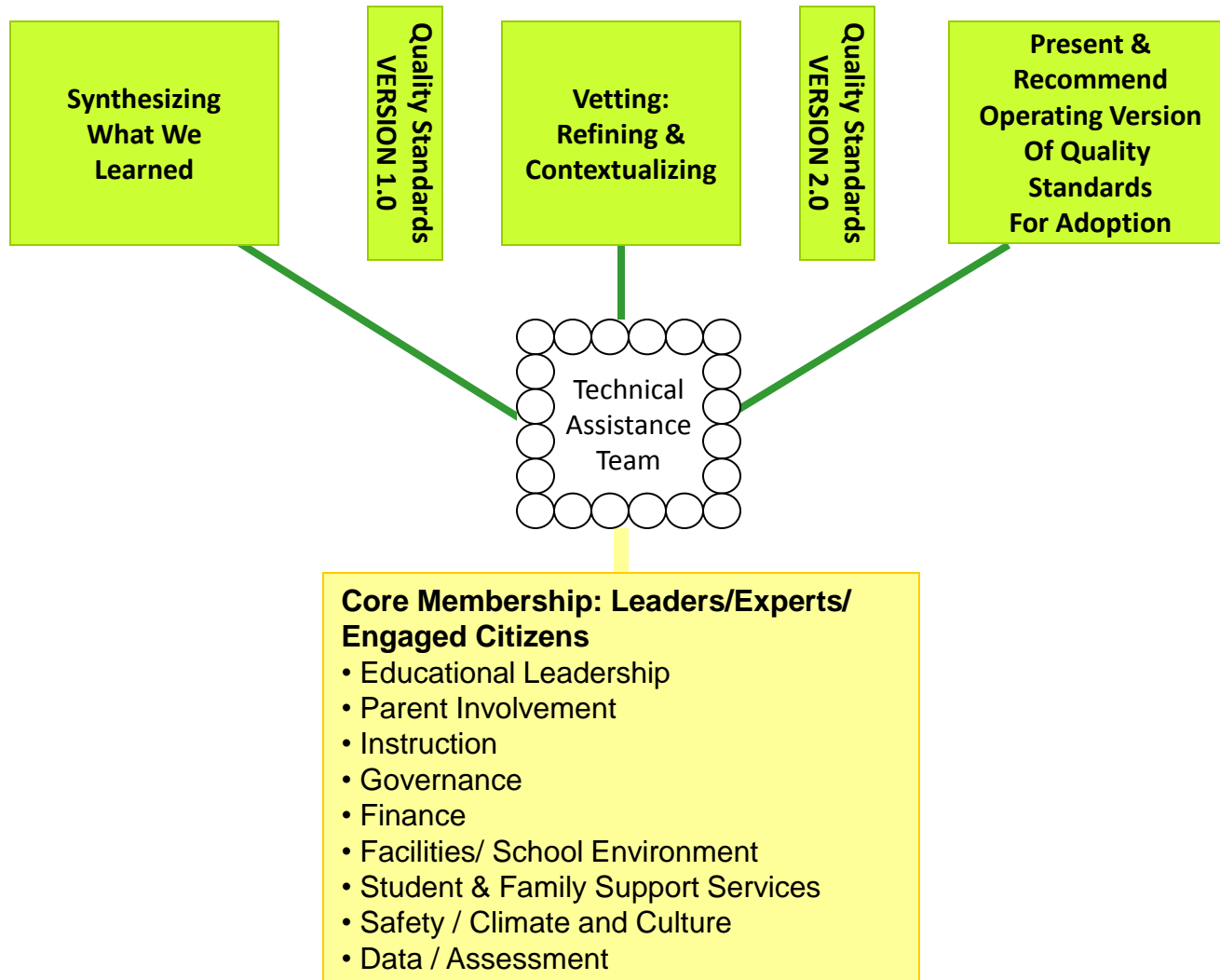

# Operating Norms & Work Structure

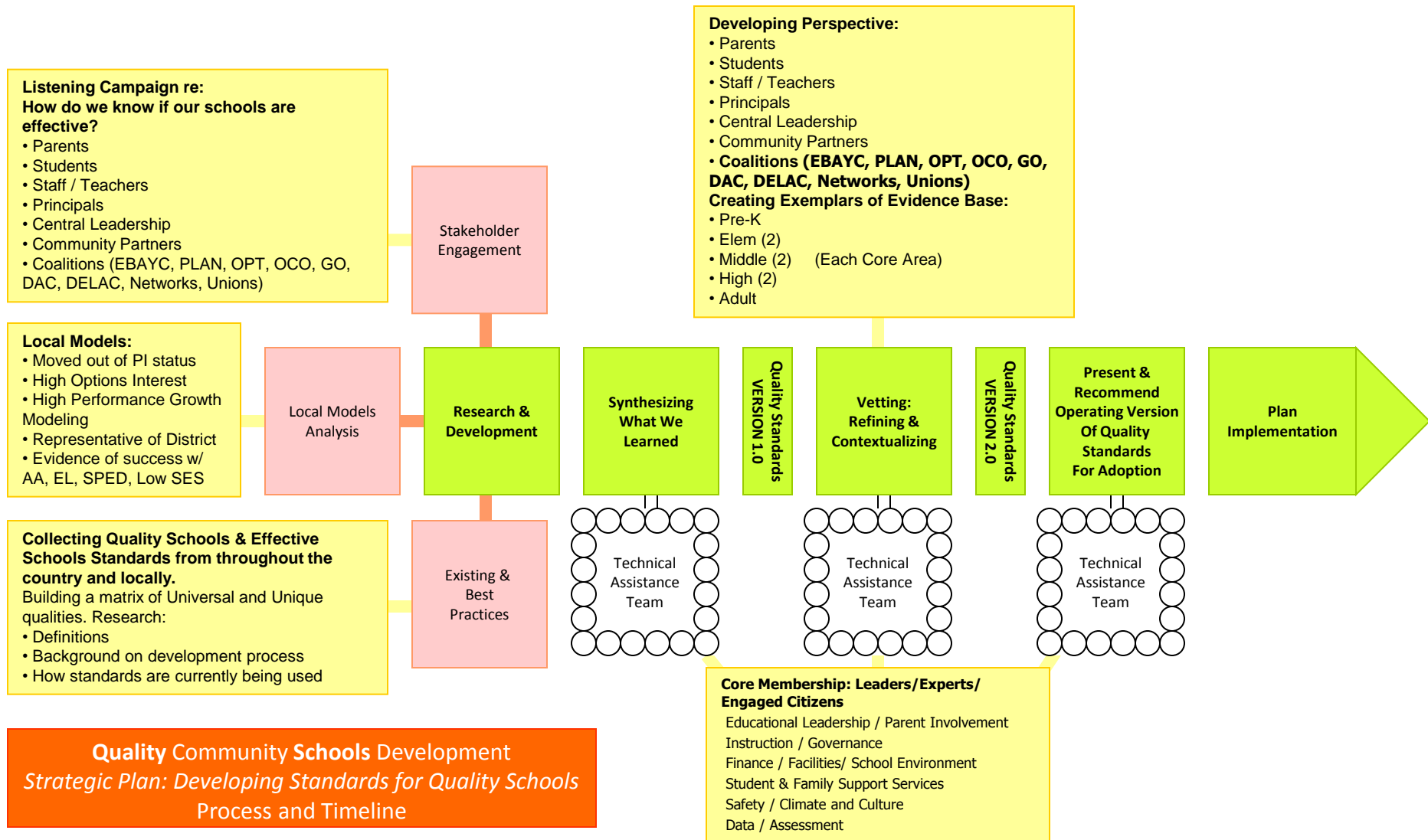
## OPERATING NORMS

- Quality
  - To establish high expectations and ensure the highest quality outcomes
- Accountability
  - To create conditions of mutual respect and to remain committed to the task
- Transparency
  - To ensure visibility, clarity, access, and to strive towards open dialog and communication
- Service
  - To remain student centered and to allow for diverse views, opinions and experiences

## WORK STRUCTURE

- QCSD Team w/ Technical Assistance during October - December:
  - creates initial matrix of existing quality standards
  - conducts stakeholder listening campaign activities
  - conducts site visits of local model schools
- Technical Assistance Team meets 4-6x weekly between December and February
- Vetting Process occurs through weekly engagement activity between February and March
- Technical Assistance Team meeting weekly in April and May to develop Operating version of Quality Standards
- Technical Assistance Team will manifest through large group, small group, and individual interactions to maximize the support provided.
