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### I. Executive Summary

In 2016, Oakland voters approved the Measure G1 Parcel Tax (a.k.a. Districtwide Teacher Retention and Middle School Improvement Act), authorizing the Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) to levy a qualified special tax on each parcel of taxable real property in the District, in the annual amount of \$120 per parcel.

The purpose of Measure G1 is to to provide a salary increase to school-site educators district-wide, including charter schools in the City of Oakland, and to provide middle school grants which shall be allocated pursuant to an education improvement plan submitted by each middle school which shall be spent in furtherance of the following goals:

- Attract and retain school-site educators.
- Increase access to courses in arts, music, and world languages in grades 6-8.
- Improve student retention during the transition from elementary to middle school.
- Create a more positive and safe middle-school learning environment.

Measure G1 also has the following accountability provisions which include the following requirements:

- The Board of Education shall establish a Commission comprised of five (5) persons, giving preference to persons who demonstrate extensive knowledge and expertise in middle school education, with a focus on arts, music, and world languages, school safety, and in compensation for K-12 educational professionals.
- The Commission shall advise and report to the Board of Education and shall be responsible for oversight, which includes:
  - (a) oversight of proper allocation and use of all parcel tax monies
  - (b) reviewing annual independent audit reports
  - (c) submitting recommendations to the Board of Education for any new or modified policies and administrative regulations to ensure the Oakland Unified School District's compliance with the requirements and intent of this Measure.
- The Board of Education shall provide by resolution for the composition, funding, staffing, and other necessary information regarding the Commission's formation and operation.

Measure G1 revenue for FY2023-2024 totaled \$11,757,749<sup>1</sup>.

- 65% of the funds, or \$7,429,922 was spent on staff salaries, as required statutorily.
- 35% of the funds, or \$4,000,727 was spent on middle school grants, as follows:

#### II. Introduction

On Tuesday, November 8, 2016, 82.24% of Oakland voters approved the Measure G1 Parcel Tax (a.k.a. Districtwide Teacher Retention and Middle School Improvement Act), meeting the required 2/3 approval threshold and thus authorizing the Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) to levy a qualified special tax on each parcel of taxable real property in the District, in the annual amount of \$120 per parcel.

The purpose of Measure G1 is to to provide a salary increase to school-site educators district-wide, including charter schools in the City of Oakland, and to provide middle school grants which shall be allocated pursuant to an education improvement plan submitted by each middle school which shall be spent in furtherance of the following goals:

- Attract and retain school-site educators.
- Increase access to courses in arts, music, and world languages in grades 6-8.
- Improve student retention during the transition from elementary to middle school.
- Create a more positive and safe middle-school learning environment.

Measure G1 thus ensured that Oakland schools would continue to receive a stable, reliable, local source of funding for middle schools for twelve years. This would serve the approximately 6,677 middle school students in OUSD and 459 middle school students in Oakland charter schools.

This Parcel Tax commenced on July 1, 2017 and remains in effect for twelve fiscal years, with exemptions from the Parcel Tax for citizens over the age of 65 if such citizens applied for an exemption. An exemption from this tax is also made for owners of single family residential units in which they reside whose combined family income from all sources for the previous calendar year is at or below the income level qualifying as "very low income" for a family of such size under Section 8 of the United States Housing Act of 1937, 42 U.S.C.A. Sections 1437 et seq. for each year. Owners must apply for this exemption annually by petition to the Office of the Chief Financial Officer of the District in the manner and at the time set forth in procedures established by the District.

This report covers the seventh fiscal year (FY2023-2024) of the Parcel Tax and details the commission's assessment of how the funds were dispersed and used in this fiscal year.

#### **III. Commission Details**

As part of Measure G1, a Citizens' Oversight Commission ("Commission") is convened annually to ensure that proceeds of the tax are spent wisely and only for the purposes named in Measure G1.

The Board of Education will establish a Commission comprised of five (5) persons giving preference to persons who demonstrate extensive knowledge and expertise in middle school education, with a focus on arts, music, and world languages, school safety, and in compensation for K-12 educational professionals. The Commission shall advise and report to the Board of Education and shall be responsible for oversight, which includes (a) oversight of proper allocation and use of all parcel tax monies, (b) reviewing annual independent audit reports, and (c) submitting recommendations to the Board of Education for any new or modified policies and administrative regulations to ensure the Oakland Unified School District's compliance with the requirements and intent of this Measure.

The Commission meets once a month (except for special meetings), and in adherence to the guidelines of the Brown Act.

#### IV. FY2023-24 Measure G1 Revenue and Allocations

Parcel taxes are collected for Measure G1 purposes, at \$120 per parcel, less exemptions for qualifying seniors and low-income families. Approximately 1.8% is subtracted for a county collection fee, and an additional 1% as an administration fee for OUSD.

Based on enrollment, the net funds are divided between OUSD and charters. Further, 65% of the funds are allocated for staff retention salaries, while 35% are allocated for middle school grants.

Funds are then distributed to schools based on their percentage of students enrolled (students who are OUSD residents only).

Finally, a portion of any unspent funds from previous years is reallocated to each school based on their percentage of students enrolled (students who are OUSD residents only).


