to receive a grant provided by the California Regional K-16 Education Collaboratives Grant Program for a grant period between May 2024 through June 2026 in an

amount not to exceed \$110,000.

Background The Oakland Unified School District is participating in the California Regional K-16

Education Collaboratives Grant Program funded by the CA Department of General Services (DGS) and administered by the Foundation for California Community Colleges (FCCC). The fiscal agent for the Bay region is CSU East Bay Foundation, Inc.

Discussion The Oakland Unified School District's participation in the California Regional K-16

Education Collaboratives Grant Program through the Bay Area K-16 Collaborative will enable Skyline High School to increase Dual Enrollment programming, with a focus on college and career pathway alignment to high growth and high wage industries, and supporting LCAP focal groups with accessing and succeeding in Dual Enrollment, with the ultimately goal of postsecondary matriculation. The funding provided by the grant will pay for essential costs associated with increased growth

and improvements to the Dual Enrollment program at Skyline HS.

The California Bay Area K-16 Collaborative aims to strengthen linkages in the region among school districts, community colleges, universities, and employers to streamline educational pathways and address inequities in education and employment in three vital sectors to the Bay Area economy.
