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PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project supports the grade expansion of the Madison Park Business & Art Academy (MPA) program serving grades 9 and 10 to serving grades 9 through 12. A new 2 story classroom building will be constructed to provide a permanent space exclusively for MPA high school students, currently housed in temporary portable classrooms. The new 30,464 square foot classroom building will feature:

- · 14 classrooms equipped with new classroom furniture
- · 2 science laboratories
- · 4 student restrooms will feature low water flow fixtures
- 6 administrative offices and increased staff work space, including a break room, conference room, work room and staff restrooms
- · Exterior assembly area for student activities
- · Renovation of kitchen shared by MPA and James Madison Middle School
- · Renovation of parking lot

UPDATE

Kitchen Renovation (Phase 1):

First day of operations by Nutritional Services was April 24, 2017.

New Construction (Phase 2):

- DSA approved the drawings in January 2017.
- The new state lease leaseback legislation caused OUSD to do a new procurement for Phase 2. This included a Board of Education resolution and the creation of new RFP and lease documents. Proposals are due April 28, 2017.

The McClymonds Intensive Support Site (ISS) project includes improvements based on priorities identified by members of the school community.

Phase 1: New parking lot light fixtures for improved site safety, wireless internet connectivity to Gymnasium and Plaza of Peace, re-flooring of main office embedded with MACK logo, new desks and chairs for computer lab room 200, new outdoor tables to create an extension of the classroom to inspire learning and power and data utilities to serve the new Best Buy Teen Tech Center.

Phase 1.1: New site surveillance cameras, and preparations of utilities for exterior marquee.

Phase 1.2: Makers Space and 9th Grade Academy Science Lab.

Phase 2: Major modernization of the Library Innovation Technology Center includes a flexible learning space for the Learning Commons, new Africana Center, new Mack World Café & Office complete with new lighting, carpeting, furniture & wall murals; new audio-visual system in Cafeteria & Auditorium; ceiling fans in classrooms to improve ventilation; new door hardware for classrooms to allow locking on classroom side; mandated ADA accessibility Improvements to exterior entry ramp and 2nd floor restrooms.
