About Civicorps Academy

Civicorps is a full-service community school serving young adults ages 18-24. As a public charter high school and a local conservation corps, corpsmembers are challenged with a rigorous schedule of field work and academic classes in pursuit of their high school diploma.

Being a job training and education program, corpsmembers work in the field of conservation and community service and learn the skills necessary for holding a job while earning money to support themselves in a healthy and respectful manner.

Throughout the process corpsmembers are asked to reflect on the work they are doing, set short and long term goals for themselves, and to step out of their comfort zone by engaging in extra-curricular activities such as the performing arts, camping, kayaking, and cross-country skiing.

Orientations to join Civicorps Academy are held every six weeks. Interested individuals must first complete an application and meet with the Recruiter.
