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Grant Award Notification (Continued)

The following conditions apply:

- The grant award will be processed upon receipt of the signed Grant Award Notification (AO-400).
 This AO-400 must be signed by the superintendent or an authorized official and returned within 10 working days.
- 2. All approved program funds must be expended within the dates designated and for the maximum amount indicated on the AO-400. Encumbrances may be made at any time after the beginning date of the grant stated on the AO-400. Expenditures must be completed by **June 30, 2025**. **No extensions of this grant will be allowed.**
- 3. The grantee is required to use these funds to implement the SSP as described in the approved planning grant application. Grantees must adhere to all communicated activity dates for the posting of the required curriculum. Line-item transfers in excess of 25 percent of the total budget amount require written approval from the California Department of Education (CDE) SSP consultant. Grant funds shall not be used to supplant. Expenditures shall comply with all applicable provisions for federal, state, and local rules, regulations, and policies relating to the administration and accounting for public school funds.
- 4. Administrative indirect costs are limited to the CDE approved rate for the applicable fiscal year in which the funds are spent.
- 5. Upon receipt of the required certifications, scheduled payments of grant funds will be as follows:
 - Seventy-five percent of the funds will be released upon completion and return of the AO-400. Please allow approximately four weeks for processing.
 - The final 25 percent of the funds will be released after the Annual Expenditure Report has been received and all reporting and submission requirements, including the posting of curriculum, have been met. All curriculum required for another teacher to implement the concentrator and capstone courses developed through this SSP grant must be posted and accessible on the California Educators Together SSP Group Page by April 18, 2025.
 - The Annual Expenditure Report is due July 31, 2025, after all funds have been expended. The Annual Expenditure Report includes a narrative of expenditures. Failure to submit a final Annual Expenditure Report with a budget narrative within 60 days of the end of the grant period will result in a billing from the CDE for the entire amount of any grant funds paid and possible reduction of any subsequent years' grant(s).
- 6. The Annual Progress Report and budget projection is a grant requirement and is due April 18, 2025. Guidelines will be emailed separately.
- 7. At least one of the identified SSP teachers is required to attend the annal SSP convening either virtually or in person. The virtual SSP convening will be held on February 20, 2025. The virtual meeting link will be emailed in advance. The in-person SSP convening will be held on March 2, 2025, at the SAFE Credit Union Convention Center in Sacramento in conjunction with the Educating for Careers Conference. **Note:** For the in-person SSP convening: If only attending the SSP convening, conference registration is not required. If attending the in-person SSP convening and the Educating for Careers Conference, registration is required.

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8. Grantees are required to accommodate SSP mentors in the performance of their duties, which includes scheduling site/virtual visits and responding to communications. Grantees will engage in reciprocal communication with their assigned mentor at least once per month to provide updates and for assistance.

9. If the grantee or the CDE terminates the grantee's participation in the program, the grantee shall submit a final expenditure report within 30 days and return the unexpended funds upon receipt of a billing from the CDE. Supplies and equipment purchased with these funds will be redirected to other programs.
