

Proposition 39: Background



2003: CA Prop 39 Law established

2013: OUSD Asset Management Policy approved

Intent

Treat all Oakland students attending publicly funded schools equitably with respect to facility allocation

Key Factors

- Timeline & procedures: Specific deadlines & steps outline entire Prop
 39 process
- "In Lieu": District permitted to deviate from deadlines & steps through mutual agreement w/ requesting charter school(s)
- Eligibility: Charter must serve at least 80 "in-district" (Oakland resident) students
- In-District: District required to house "in-district" (Oakland resident) students (...but not limited to doing so)
- Authorizer: District, County, State authorized all eligible for facility



Proposition 39: Background



As of 2015: 13 Facility Use Agreements in place



- Multiple types of facility use agreements (FUA) in place
 - Long-term "in lieu" (2 or more years)
 - One Year Prop 39 agreements
- Facility Use Rates: determined by either Prop 39 Regulations as "pro rata share of facility costs" or mutually agreed upon "in lieu" rates
- Fees charged: charter schools pay utilities, custodial in some instances, debt service (all other standard charter school authorizing and oversight fees apply)
- District may charge 3% oversight fee if facilities provided free of charge (analysis determined inconsistent value-add to this approach)

Proposition 39: Process



Law & Asset Management Policy

Treat all students attending publicly funded schools equitably with respect to facility allocation



Primary Considerations



Space allocation – required classrooms (teaching stations,) administration, specialized spaces



Location – proximity to desired location and/or students served



Grade level – compatibility of facility design to grades served



Unique program – specialized programmatic facility needs



Long-term need – consideration of school growth and expanded space needs



District Gaps – consideration identified unmet needs




Nov 1 Charter Facility Request Deadline	18 facility requests rec'd for 2015-16 cycle
Dec 1 Preliminary Offers Developed	Consider space capacity and space needed
Jan 1- Preliminary Offers Vetted and Revised	Engage District schools impacted & charter schools requesting space
Feb 1 Deadline to provide charter with Preliminary Offer	Goal is to engage In Lieu offers at this time, as appropriate
Mar 1 Deadline for charter to respond w/ feedback on Preliminary Offer	Charters walkthrough facility and discuss any "in lieu" considerations
Apr 1 Deadline for board approved Final P39 Offer to be provided to charter	Requires 1 st and 2 nd Reading by BOE in March
May 1 Deadline for charter to accept or decline P39 Final Facility Offer	Goal is to complete process as efficiently as possible
June 30 Non-statutory deadline by which District finalizes Facility Use Agreement	Consideration will also be given to long term "in lieu" facility use agreements in March


Proposition 39: Classrooms




Ensuring equitable allocation of classrooms is determined based on the process below, defined in the Prop 39 regulations.



Determine the District
High School attendance
area majority of charter
students reside in.



Identify all district schools in High School attendance area serving similar grades as requesting charter.




Analyze the facilities of the comparison schools. Includes determining actual average class size of similar schools in High School attendance area, as well as other facility comparisons.



Divide projected charter school In-District (average daily attendance) ADA by average class size of like grades in High School attendance area to determine base classroom loading ratio required to be considered for facility offers




Current facilities housing charter schools as of 2014-15 school year.








