SUBJECT: Application for One (1) District Intern Education Specialist Teaching Credential

ACTION REQUESTED

Approval by the Board of Education of Resolution No. 1112-0086 for a CL-707A form recommending approval for One (1) District Intern Education Specialist Teaching Credential.

BACKGROUND

The District Intern Certificate Program was enacted in 1983 under a major education reform law. This statute created an alternative route into teaching through district developed and administered teaching internships.

Over the past year, Oakland Unified School District worked to develop and register the Oakland Practitioner Teacher Program, Oakland Unified School District's Internship Program designed specifically for the Oakland Teaching Fellows who are recruited, selected, and trained to teach in mild to moderate and moderate to severe special education settings. Oakland Teaching Fellows fulfill a critical District need in ensuring that some of the most difficult to staff classrooms in the District start the school year with full credentialed and Highly-Qualified Teachers. The Oakland Practitioner Teacher Program provides a streamlined credentialing program aligned with the needs of first-year special education teachers in high-need OUSD schools and a certification path to ensure that Fellows remain highly qualified.

This District Internship Program allows individuals to provide instructional services to students while completing practical, highly relevant professional development that meets the requirements towards the Preliminary Education Specialist credential. District Interns must be approved by the School District's Governing Board in order to participate in this collaboration. Upon completion of all requirements under California Education Code 44328, the Commission awards the preliminary credential to interns upon the recommendation from the School District's Governing Board.

DISCUSSION

One (1) individual has successfully completed the requirements for admission into the OPTP District Intern program and is being recommended for a District Intern Education Specialist teaching credential, so she may work in the District for the 2011-2012 school year, with a District Intern Education Specialist teaching credential.


