What is a SAIT school?

A SAIT School:

- 1. Participated in either
 - Immediate Intervention/Underperforming School Program (II/USP) or
 - High Priority School Grant Program (HPSG).
- 2. Did not meet growth requirements of the program.

Allendale Elementary School:

- 1. Participated in II/USP and
- 2. Did not make growth in 2006-2007.



What is the SAIT process?

The SAIT process consists of:

- Contracting with a state-approved School Assistance and Intervention Team (SAIT) Provider;
- Implementing required activities to improve student achievement with the goal of being removed from statemonitored status.



What does a SAIT Provider do?

- Work with a District/School Liaison Team on an ongoing basis.
- 2. Conduct an investigation of the school and its academic program.
- 3. Prepare reports.
 - A Report of Findings and Corrective Actions on how to embed the SAIT recommendations into ongoing district and school work
 - Reports of the school's progress toward achieving the recommended actions
- 4. Provide intensive support to help the school implement the corrective actions.
- 5. Monitor the school's progress on an ongoing basis.



How are our SAIT schools doing?

Out of the five current SAIT schools:

- 1. Four schools made growth in two out of three years and exited this year:
 - Martin Luther King Elementary School
 - Sante Fe Elementary School
 - Bret Harte Middle School
 - Madison Middle School

- 2. One school in first year of SAIT made growth and must make growth next year to exit:
 - Lockwood Elementary School
