Background

A one paragraph explanation of why the consultant's services are needed. Cleveland Elementary is contracting with Cantare Con Vivo to bring choral music instruction into our 9 K-2 classrooms, as well as a monthly school assembly program designed to promote group cooperation, and cultural awareness. Without this program our students would have no vocal music instruction. Music plays an important role in building community at Cleveland and will enable students to learn to think creatively and to respect and appreciate the diversity in our community.

Discussion One paragraph summary of the scope of work.

Weekly sessions of choral instruction in each classroom will expose students to diverse musical traditions and enable students to develop fundamental music skills as outlined in the California Visual and Performing Arts standards. Curriculum will emphasize transferable skills, such as working cooperatively with others, analytical thinking and problem-solving. Curriculum will also support language arts development for English Learners and in TK-5 classrooms. Curriculum will help English Language Learners strengthen speaking and reading comprehension skills to assist students in improving CELDT levels and to practice grade-level vocabulary lists.

Notice shall be effective when received if personally served or, if mailed, three days after mailing. Either party must give written notice of a change of address.

8. Status of Contractor: This is not an employment contract. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partner, or joint venture of OUSD, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of OUSD and/or to which OUSD's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all Federal, State, and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees. In the performance of the work herein contemplated, CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor or business entity, with the sole authority for controlling and directing the performance of the details of the work, OUSD being interested only in the results obtained.

Insurance:

- 1. Unless specifically waived by OUSD, the following insurance is required:
 - i. If CONTRACTOR employs any person to perform work in connection with this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall procure and maintain at all times during the performance of such work, Workers' Compensation Insurance in conformance with the laws of the State of California and Federal laws when applicable. Employers' Liability Insurance shall not be less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident or disease.

- CONTRACTOR is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which require every employer to be insured against liability for workers' compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code, and will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the Work of this Contract.

The policy shall protect CONTRACTOR and OUSD in the same manner as though each were separately issued. Nothing in said policy shall operate to increase the Insurer's liability as set forth in the policy beyond the amount or amounts shown or to which the Insurer would have been liable if only one interest were named as an insured.
- iii. If CONTRACTOR is offering OUSD professional advice under this Contract, CONTRACTOR shall maintain Errors and Omissions insurance or Professional Liability insurance with coverage limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per claim.

OR

- iv. CONTRACTOR is not required to maintain any insurance under this agreement. (Completed and approved Waiver of Insurance Form is required from OUSD's Risk Management.) Waiver of insurance does not release CONTRACTOR from responsibility for any claim or demand.
- Licenses and Permits: CONTRACTOR shall obtain and keep in force all licenses, permits, and certificates necessary for the performance of this Agreement.
- 11. **Assignment**: The obligations of CONTRACTOR under this Agreement shall not be assigned by CONTRACTOR without the express prior written consent of OUSD.
- 12. Non-Discrimination: It is the policy of OUSD that in connection with all work performed under Contracts there be no discrimination because of race, color, ancestry, national origin, religious creed, physical disability, medical condition, marital status, sexual orientation, gender, or age; therefore, CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited to, the California Fair Employment and Housing Act beginning with Government Code Section 12900 and Labor Code Section 1735 and OUSD policy. In addition, CONTRACTOR agrees to require like compliance by all its subcontractor(s). CONTRACTOR shall not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment on the basis of actual or perceived; race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, age, marital status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, veteran status, gender, sex or sexual orientation.

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- Drug-Free / Smoke Free Policy: No drugs, alcohol, and/or smoking are allowed at any time in any buildings and/or grounds on OUSD property. No students, staff, visitors, CONTRACTORS, or subcontractors are to use controlled substances, alcohol or tobacco on these sites.
- 14. Indemnification: CONTRACTOR agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend OUSD and its officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims or losses accruing or resulting from injury, damage, or death of any person, firm, or corporation in connection with the performance of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR also agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend OUSD and its elective board, officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims or losses incurred by any supplier, contractor, or subcontractor furnishing work, services, or materials to CONTRACTOR in connection with the performance of this Agreement. This provision survives termination of this Agreement.
- 15. Copyright/Trademark/Patent/Ownership: CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement shall become the property of OUSD and cannot be used without OUSD's express written permission. OUSD shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark, and/or patent of said matter in the name of OUSD. CONTRACTOR consents to use of CONTRACTOR's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium. These matters include, without limitation, drawings, plans, specifications, studies, reports, memoranda, computation sheets, the contents of computer diskettes, artwork, copy, posters, billboards, photographs, videotapes, audiotapes, systems designs, software, reports, diagrams, surveys, source codes or any other original works of authorship, or other documents prepared by CONTRACTOR or its Sub-CONTRACTORs in connection with the Services performed under this Agreement. All works shall be works for hire as defined under Title 17 of the United States Code, and all copyrights in those works are the property of OUSD.
- 16. Waiver: No delay or omission by either party in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right or prevent a similar subsequent act from constituting a violation of the Agreement.
- 17. **Termination**: OUSD may at any time terminate this Agreement upon 30 days prior written notice to CONTRACTOR. OUSD shall compensate CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily provided through the date of termination. In addition, OUSD may terminate this Agreement for cause should CONTRACTOR fail to perform any part of this Agreement. In the event of termination for cause, OUSD may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to OUSD exceeds the cost of providing the services pursuant to this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall pay the additional cost.
- 18. **Conduct of CONTRACTOR**: By signing this Agreement, CONTRACTOR certifies compliance with the following requirements and will provide OUSD with evidence of staff qualifications, which include:
 - 1. **Tuberculosis Screening**: CONTRACTOR is required to screen employees who will be working at OUSD sites for more than six hours. CONTRACTOR affirms that each employee has current proof of negative TB testing on file and TB results are monitored.
 - 2. Fingerprinting of Employees and Agents. The fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 apply to CONTRACTOR's services under this Agreement and CONTRACTOR certifies its compliance with these provisions as follows: "CONTRACTOR certifies that CONTRACTOR has complied with the fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 with respect to all CONTRACTOR's employees, subcontractors, agents, and subcontractors' employees or agents ("Employees") regardless of whether those Employees are paid or unpaid, concurrently employed by OUSD, or acting as independent contractors of CONTRACTOR, who may have contact with OUSD pupils in the course of providing services pursuant to the Agreement, and the California Department of Justice has determined that none of those Employees has been convicted of a felony, as that term is defined in Education Code section 45122.1. Contractor further certifies that it has received and reviewed fingerprint results for each of its Employees and Contractor has requested and reviews subsequent arrest records for all Employees who may come into contract with OUSD pupils in providing services to the District under this Agreement.

In the event that OUSD, in its sole discretion, at any time during the term of this contract, desires the removal of any CONTRACTOR related persons, employee, representative or agent from an OUSD school site and, or property, CONTRACTOR shall immediately, upon receiving notice from OUSD of such desire, cause the removal of such person or persons.

- 19. **No Rights in Third Parties**: This Agreement does not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein.
- 20. OUSD's Evaluation of CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR's Employees and/or Subcontractors. OUSD may evaluate CONTRACTOR's work in any way that OUSD is entitled to do so pursuant to applicable law. The OUSD's evaluation may include, without limitation:
 - 1. Requesting that OUSD employee(s) evaluate the CONTRACTOR and the CONTRACTOR's employees and subcontractors and each of their performance.
 - 2. Announced and unannounced observance of CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s).
- 21. Limitation of OUSD Liability: Other than as provided in this Agreement, OUSD's financial obligations under this Agreement shall be limited to the payment of the compensation provided in this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event, shall OUSD be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenue, arising out of, or in connection with, this Agreement for the services performed in connection with this Agreement.
- 22. **Confidentiality**: CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR's agents, personnel, employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s) shall maintain the confidentiality of all information received in the course of performing the Services. CONTRACTOR understands that student records are confidential and agrees to comply with all state and federal laws concerning the maintenance and disclosure of student records. This requirement to maintain confidentiality shall extend beyond the termination of this Agreement. Contractors will be permitted

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- access to student data only where permissible under state and federal law and only after executing OUSD's Confidentiality Agreement Regarding Student Data.
- 23. **Conflict of Interest**: CONTRACTOR shall abide by and be subject to all applicable, regulations, statutes or other laws regarding conflict of interest. CONTRACTOR shall not hire any officer or employee of OUSD to perform any service by this Agreement without the prior approval of OUSD Human Resources.
 - CONTRACTOR affirms to the best of his/her/its knowledge, there exists no actual or potential conflict of interest between CONTRACTOR's family, business or financial interest and the services provided under this Agreement, and in the event of change in either private interest or services under this Agreement, any question regarding possible conflict of interest which may arise as a result of such change will be brought to OUSD's attention in writing.
 - Through its execution of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR acknowledges that it is familiar with the provisions of section 1090 *et seq.* and section 87100 *et seq.* of the Government Code of the State of California, and certifies that it does not know of any facts which constitute a violation of said provisions. In the event CONTRACTOR receives any information subsequent to execution of this Agreement which might constitute a violation of said provisions, CONTRACTOR agrees it shall notify OUSD in writing.
- 24. Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion: CONTRACTOR certifies to the best of his/her/its knowledge and belief, that it and its principals are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency according to Federal Acquisition Regulation Subpart 9.4, and by signing this contract, certifies that this vendor does not appear on the Excluded Parties List (https://www.sam.gov/).
- 25. **Litigation**: This Agreement shall be performed in Oakland, California and is governed by the laws of the State of California. The Alameda County Superior Court shall have jurisdiction over any state court litigation initiated to enforce or interpret this Agreement.
- 26. Incorporation of Recitals and Exhibits: The Recitals and each exhibit attached hereto are hereby incorporated herein by reference.
- 27. Integration/Entire Agreement of Parties: This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, and agreements, whether oral or written. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by both Parties.
- 28. Counterparts: This Agreement and all amendments and supplements to it may be executed in counterparts, and all counterparts together shall be construed as one document.
- 29. **Signature Authority**: Each party has the full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement, and the person signing this Agreement on behalf of each Party has been given the proper authority and empowered to enter into this Agreement.
- 30. Contract Contingent on Governing Board Approval: OUSD shall not be bound by the terms of this Agreement until it has been formally approved by OUSD's Governing Board, and no payment shall be owed or made to CONTRACTOR absent formal approval. This Agreement shall be deemed to be approved when it has been signed by the Board of Education, and/or the Superintendent as its designee.

Mission Statement:

Cantare Con Vivo seeks to foster a diverse community of compassion and understanding across generational, cultural, and economic boundaries, through the beauty and power of choral music.

Summary:

Cantare Con Vivo is a non-profit, 501(c)(3) Music Education and Performance organization (Tax ID: 94-3151337). Children's Choirs of Oakland is an integral part of Cantare Con Vivo's commitment to unleash the power of music to build compassionate communities. Created in 1999, CCCO program works with the Oakland Unified School District to address the lack of music opportunities for district students, particularly with regards to choral music instruction. CCCO brings high-quality choral music education and performance opportunities to urban neighborhoods where students have limited access to arts programs, currently serving over 2,600 Oakland students in ten elementary schools and from twelve middle and high schools. Students participate in our classes and special activities at no charge, through financial support from donors, local businesses and foundations. Through meaningful musical experiences, our students learn music fundamentals, develop increased self-esteem, teamwork and leadership skills, and gain appreciation and respect for the world around them.

From our base in Oakland, CA, Cantare offers three distinct programs: the 110-member Cantare Chorale, the 24-voice Chamber Ensemble and Cantare Children's Choirs, a tuition-free music education and outreach program for children and youth in Oakland's urban center. Our adult choirs perform 6-7 different concert programs annually that attract more than 5,000 residents from Oakland and surrounding Bay Area communities. The Children's Choirs program engages more than 2,600 low-income children (in grades K-12) weekly at ten school and after-school sites within the Oakland Unified School District.

Organization History:

In Fall 1987, Artistic Director David Morales founded Cantare Con Vivo (To Sing With Life), a non-profit, tax-exempt music organization. From its inception as a 24-voice choral ensemble, Cantare continues to provide choral music with an uncompromising commitment to musical

excellence for both its singers and listeners. In 1989, Cantare expanded to 40 singers and remained as such for a decade until February 1999, when Cantare reorganized forming three distinct wings to its program: Cantare Chorale, Chamber Ensemble, and a Music Education and Outreach Program for elementary public school children in Oakland's urban center. The Chorale consists of 100 auditioned singers performing four varied concert programs each season, two that are accompanied by full orchestra. They have performed a rich variety of choral/orchestral works and individual pieces accompanied by various instruments as well as a cappella selections. They have toured internationally three times, including a premier performance of Bloch's Avodath Hakodesh in Eastern Europe. The 24-voice Chamber Ensemble, Cantare's premier musical group, presents a rich array of the most challenging choral works including those hot off the press and from various countries. Both adult choirs routinely collaborate with a variety of musical organizations in the Bay Area and San Joaquin Valley. Cantare's adult choirs have performed over 130 different concert programs, representing over 1500 compositions, including numerous major choral/orchestral works.

Cantare Children's Choirs of Oakland currently offers weekly music education to over 2,500 underserved children from kindergarten through high school. Beginning in 1999 with a choir of 30 students, we now partner with 10 public elementary schools across Oakland offering in-school music education and performance opportunities in 65 classrooms each week, filling the gap created by city and state budgetary prioritization. We also support seven after-school choirs free-of-charge to all participants. Nova, our middle and high school choir, draws 35 children from an additional 12 Oakland middle and high schools. They regularly perform concerts throughout the Bay Area. In 2014, Cantare's Children's Choirs was the Chorus America recipient of the 2014 Education and Community Engagement Award.

School Partners and CCCO Programs:

Elementary Programs

We partner with Cleveland, Emerson, Manzanita SEED, La Escuelita, Lincoln, and Peralta Elementary Schools, Vincent Academy and Melrose Leadership Academy, to offer choral music education in 65 classrooms during the school day to K-5 students. Students learn diverse folk songs from around the world while building fundamental musical skills through a sequential curriculum based on the National Standards for the Visual and Performing Arts.

Music Stars

Our after-school Music Stars choirs offer third, fourth and fifth grade students an exciting array of musical opportunities. Students rehearse weekly, learning fundamentals of choral singing and music theory, and perform a variety of musical styles in unison and two-part singing. Singers also participate in field trips to live musical performances and special events. Our current Music Stars programs are at Bridges Academy, Harbor House, Lincoln Elementary, Markham Elementary, Melrose Leadership Academy, and Vincent Academy.

Nova

Nova is the pinnacle of our youth ensembles, bringing together students from 12 schools to learn and perform advanced choral repertoire. Under the direction of Julie Haydon and Katie Hom, Nova offers graduates from our Music Stars choirs and other talented young singers the opportunity to take on more challenging choral music and part-singing. Students entering grades 6-12 in the fall are invited to audition for Nova by contacting the director.

Major Project Activities:

The Cantare Children's Choirs consists of the following components:

*In-School Sessions for Grades K-5: Roughly 85% of all youth served through the Children's Choirs are reached through this component. Two teaching artists provide weekly 30 to 45-minute classes over 28 weeks at each participating elementary school. Following a curriculum based on Kodaly instruction and national and state Visual and Performing Arts Standards (VAPA), students learn a wide selection of folk songs and singing games from around the world while building fundamental musical skills and learning how to read and write music. Students have the opportunity to share what they've learned through performances at school assemblies, sing-alongs and community events throughout the year. In addition, all students receive "special units" in which they explore music from a particular culture, such as the Andes and Latin America and African American musical traditions.

*After-School Choirs for Grades 1-5: Teaching artists work with our seven after-school choirs in weekly one-hour rehearsals over 30 weeks. Students learn the fundamentals of choral singing and music theory, and perform in a variety of styles and languages including Hebrew, Arabic, Spanish, Italian, Latin, Mandarin and Japanese. Students also participate in special field trips to live performances, and perform in various community events sponsored by Cantare, which bring more than 250 students from across Oakland to perform together.

*Nova Choir for Grades 6-12: Youth perform advanced choral repertoire in an array of genres, study the historical and cultural context of each piece and learn music theory concepts. Singers rehearse for 90 minutes, twice a week, and perform minimally 15 times during the year, locally with Cantare's adult choirs and at national choral events. In addition, all Nova high school students are paired with adult mentors from Cantare's community to assist them with college preparation. In 2015-2016, the Nova Choir will split into two choirs, one for middle school and one for high school, so as to better serve the learning needs of each age group. This change also enables Cantare to increase membership in these advanced choirs, from 35 to 55.

Cantare Con Vivo Staff:

Administration consists of Artistic Director and General Manager, Director of Children's Choirs, Assistant Director of Children's Choirs, Administrative Director, and Administrative Assistant. Children's program staff consists of 11 teaching artists and 3 accompanists. Cantare Con Vivo is currently served by 10 Board members.
