- •Personalized involvement and leadership opportunities for families (looping, classroom family leaders, family involvement plans, family centers, family involvement and outreach coordinators, individual family conferences, family case management)
- •Personalized learning structures for staff (critical friends teams, peer observation and coaching, more collaboration time, team-teaching, smaller staffs, staff leadership and management teams, individualized PD plans, explicit culture development, leadership track for staff)

- •Created around a common vision with an explicit theory of action around closing the achievement gap and a clear plan for developing a culture of high non-negotiable expectations for student achievement






