Parker School SSC Meeting March 15, 2017 Minutes

The meeting was called to order by Koy Hill @ 1:45 pm. A quorum was established with 5 members present. There were also 4 guests. The minutes of February 22 were reviewed and approved. (Olvera, Martinez)

Mr. Hill indicated that the District did a mid year revision of Title I funds due to our fall drop in enrollment. Parker did appeal the cuts due to the infusion of Castlemont Primary Academy students last month. However school funding had to be based on the final application for funds based on enrollment earlier this year. We do have some unspent money in Title I in salary and benefits of about \$8,300 which can be used to minimize the revision of over \$17.000. In parent money, we have enough unspent money in supplies to cover the \$328 revision. The proposal to move all available funds to cover deficit in Title 1 and Title 1 Parent was made by Aida Olvera and seconded by N. Mehrizi passed unanimously.

Mr. Hill said that Measure G1 was passed and we will receive \$32,000 for middle school electives. After a short discussion about the current needs of our older students, we felt the money would best be used for art, coding(computer programming), and Spanish.

Mr. Hill reported on the budget lock in sessions for Parker earlier this month. At our last meeting, we voted to use Title I funds next year to fund a part-time TSA. This turned into only 0.3 FTE position, with \$4980.15 in surplus. Since our intent is to fund the TSA, it was proposed that we move all this money into extended contracts for the TSA so we can work to get to a 0.5 equivalent position. Moved by Lascon, seconded by Olbera, the motion passed.

Principal Hill shared upcoming events and days off for Cesar Chavez and Spring break.(March 31-April 9). Middle school began music and 8th graders will visit high schools and are conducting a research project 2X a week.

Meeting adjourned @ 2:05. The next meeting will be April 19.

Parker Middle School Planning Meeting

February 28, 2017

In attendance were Koy Hill, Sarah Mehrizi, Liz Henry, Roberto Lascon, Alicia Martinez, Virak Saroeun, Osun Tylor, and Taelor Lewis.

We reviewed the basic academic program for middle school, where grade levels were departmentalized for language arts and math/science. We were able to offer PE via our prep teacher, and Spanish through a consultant. In order to maintain professional development opportunities in PLCs, we also used other staff members, but it was not as organized or consistent as we would like. In addition, middle school students new to Parker need more intervention strategies to learn responsibility for decisions and adhering to the high expectations at Parker.

The electives need to be expanded into the arts, since that supports the mastery of state standards, and uses natural student interests. We also recognize that our library is designed for elementary school and needs to be expanded to include more middle school titles. There needs to be a more consistent elective schedule, with clear communication to both students and staff.

Mr. Hill indicated that we have been offered Measure G-1 funds from the City Parcel tax in the amount of over \$32,000. In addition to electives to expand student offerings, the money can be used to promote grade 5 to 6 retention and to provide safe and positive school culture. Since we were able to provide Spanish classes this year from regular school funds, we cannot use this money for this program. Our expenditures need to be over and above our former base program. We have no existing art or music program, so investigating those two electives were our highest priority. Although we currently retain 80% of our fifth graders going into 6th, we thought we could ease the transition by having a family engagement meeting at the beginning of the year to respond to concerns by families about what to expect at Parker in terms of academics and school discipline. We also considered a mid August orientation for students. To enhance the feeling of belonging, we would like to provide beginning of year t-shirts

and/or hoodies different from elementary school. The earlier suggestion to provide new library books geared to middle school students was also agreed upon. To help develop organizational skills, a personalized school agenda/planner would be helpful. We also recognized that middle school has some specific needs like math aids (protractors, compasses, etc) and more advance science materials to help promote success.

Next month, the SSC will also consider Measure G-1 money, and will submit their ideas for consideration.

Parker Measure G-1 Lead Team Meeting

March 30, 2017

In attendance were Koy Hill, Sarah Mehrizi, Roberto Lascon, Liz Henry, and Ayana Dupree.

We reviewed the five components of the Measure G-1 Funds. The first three were on areas of enhanced instruction: Art, Music and World languages. We had no art or music programs for middle school this year, so we only looked at world languages. We provided Spanish to all middle school students using Lamorinda Spanish, Inc. This was challenging since the MOU signed in the Spring of 2016 was for \$8,370. In the fall, as the program was developed, the price went up another \$5,000 in order to cover all students. Student interest was high, and beneficial to students gaining a new skill and developing global learning since the classes also incorporated cultural information. We continued by discussion the retention of 5th grade to 6th grade. Some of the more challenging students were not invited to return to Parker for 6th grade, and some students wanted to go to other schools. As a result, we had an 80% retention rate. Under Safe and Positive School Culture, we want to be sure we continued the high expectations for all students in terms of achievement and behavior. We want all students to be proud of themselves and our school.

Mr. Hill announced that the District had cut our funding from over \$32,000 to just \$17, 415. Programs in existence this year (ie Spanish) cannot be funded from this money. Ms. Henry has been in communication with MOCHA, and has a proposed invoice for four classes a week in art for middle school for the year in the amount of \$12,374. We do not have an estimate for music at this time. In addition, the recent guidelines on Measure G-1 funds indicate that no funds may be spend on food, which was a luring tactic we wanted for our family engagement meeting on middle school.

By consensus, we decided to focus on art for our elective next year using Measure G-1 funds. The other focus for the other \$5000, is on Safe and Positive School Culture. The general funds will pay for our security officer, so we want to focus

on items that will make our students feel a real part of Parker. A special middle school t-shirt will be designed and given to all middle school students. A special Parker School Planner/Agenda will be used to help students keep track of schedules and assignments. Our library will be upgraded to include at least \$2,000 worth of middle school books of interest. Finally, there will be a special funds for specific middle school supplies and instructional materials.
