MK Think was hired by the Facilities Department to perform a Facility and Real Property Asset Management Study. Mr. Marijke Smit guided Committee Members through a PowerPoint Presentation. Highlights of the presentation were:

Project Objectives

- 1. To develop and assess inventory of all OUSD space used to provide education and related support services for students and their families.
- 2. To develop utilization and occupancy targets that better support OUSD mission, goals, school operations and associated programs.
- 3. Recommend specific strategies to Fight size'the District, including improving utilization and optimizing use and allocation of assets.

Summary of Findings

- 1. The District currently has a large surplus of classroom inventory.
- 2. The District has more classrooms than required to meet future student enrollment targets.
- 3. There are two basic methods for addressing over capacity:
- · Maximize efficiencies at largest scale facilities.
- · Harvest facilities space at all sites to maximize community value.

Asset Inventory

- 1. The majority of classrooms are appropriately sized for current class sizes.
- 2. The total square footage of OUSD School inventory is 5.8 millions square feet.
- 3. The percentage of Oakland's student-aged population attending OUSD schools is 56%.

Asset Realignment Strategies

- 1. Meeting enrollment demands.
- 2. Schools as Center of Community Model.
- 3. Accommodating neighborhood student population.

Alternate Use and Disposition Strategies

- 1. Short-term leases.

- 3. Joint occupancy precedents.
- 4. Adaptive re-use disposition precedents.
