Overview of School

Student Enrollment:

Total Enrollment 142 students 71 female - 50% 71 male - 50%

Highlights of Student Demographics:

English Language Learners - 22.5% Socioeconomically Disadvantaged - 98% Students with Disabilities - 19.7% Unhoused - 12.7% Foster Youth - 1.4%

Other Highlights:

Small Learning Community
Low staff turnover
87% students graduate with postsecondary plan
10% Graduation Rate Increase from prior year
20% Increase in course completion rate over past 2 years

Expansion of strong industry, non-profit and college partnerships.	Increase in number of partnerships: MIMS - Substance Use Navigator Apprenticeship Planting Justice Bay Area Medical Academy - On Ramp











Reflections on Past 3 Years



What have been some of the challenges?

Challenges	Evidence
The sequence needs to be fully specified so as to accommodate different students spending different amounts of time at the school	Some students spend as little as 6 weeks at Dewey, while others spend 2+ years
Materials are needed to stretch the Foundations course to a full 3-trimester sequence	The materials required for the curriculum are prohibitively expensive from the permitted vendors
Attendance	Only 11% of our students are categorized as having satisfactory attendance









Looking Ahead to 25-26

Insights: Our Learning and Implications

- Students engage best with hands-on experiences.
- Paid internships motivate students and have a positive effect on attendance.
- It is important to incorporate students' voices into the pathway design team and process.
- Strong industry, non-profit and college partnerships help expose students to career opportunities.

Implications

- Build more hands-on experiences into all pathway classes [Measure N/H funds]
- Find sports or fitness-focused internships [Measure N/H funds]
- Continue to create curriculum for Graduate Writing Seminar [Measure N/H funds]
- Create a tiered course schedule and scheduling system to ensure all students have pathway experiences
- Utilize California Colleges website data collection to help connect students with internships
- Schedule one school-wide health-related assembly
