E. Adoption of the Committee General Consent Report

Director Spearman wanted to know the procedures for Contract Amendments and the difference between an Amendment and a Change Order.

Mr. White said Change Orders represent cost for work associated with construction. He said the Amendments represent additional work above and beyond the original Scope of Work for professional services that were rendered by non-construction types of entities and firms. Mr. White requested Tadashi Nakadegawa, Director, Facilities, provide Director Spearman with a general overview of Amendments and Change Orders.

Director Spearman said she wants to know the difference between an Amendment and a Change Order and the District's policy on both.

Mr. White requested Facilities Legal Counsel, Kate Boskoff, respond to Director Spearman's questions.

Ms. Boskoff said Change Orders are what happens on a construction project when the actual scope of the project is changed and causes additional costs to the contractor. Amendments to Professional Service Agreements are for Architects, Inspectors of Record, and Geotech professionals. Amendments are submitted because there has been a not to exceed price and the work on a contract at a particular site went longer or cost more than expected.

Ms. Boskoff said Mr. White will have to speak to why the Facilities department doesn't properly scope the contracts so you don't end up with Amendments. She said under the Education Code the District is allowed to be in a Professional Service Agreement up to five years. After five years the contract can be increased for another five years if it is the Board's decision. Ms. Boskoff noted after five years, the contract would have to be brought back to the Board for review.

Director Spearman said an Amendment appears to be changes that were not foreseen in the contract.

Ms. Boskoff said an Amendment is an additional Scope of Work that is required of a particular service provider.

Director Spearman said a Change Order is a change in the work being done.

Ms. Boskoff explained the Change Order process saying on the publicly bid project something happened. Either the plans were deficient and did not spell out a particular item that needed to be put in or the District requested a change after the project had started and the contractor was directed to perform additional work over and above the hard bid original contract price. The contractor requests a Change Order so that they can be compensated for the additional work that was not a part of the contractor's bid on bid day.

Director Spearman requested an explanation for Amendment No. 1 and the Change Order No. 3 for Madison Middle School.

Mr. White said if a project is divided between two disciplines you have Construction Services or Professional Services. For Construction Services, if there is a cost that goes outside the contract, that is a Change Order. For professional services, if there is a cost that goes outside the contract amount, that is an Amendment. He said both have costs over and above the contract amount.

Director Spearman wanted to know why the work was necessary in Change Order No. 3, Madison Middle School (dry wall, moving cabinets, fire alarms, etc.) for an additional \$58,000. She said the building is there; the District has dedicated the building; the building has been occupied; and now these changes are necessary.

Mr. Nakadegawa said the changes were necessary due to architect's error. The architect drew up the plans; put out the project manual; but did not include the work which was necessary to complete the project. He noted this was formerly a shop building that had a special type of screening on the walls and when that was taken off, the architect assumed there was dry wall underneath, but it wasn't. As a result, the District had to pay the contractor to go back and put dry wall on the walls.

Data Work - Mr. Nakadegawa said the data work done at Madison Middle School is not uncommon in District projects when you have to relocate a portion of the data technology after it has been designed because the of the pathway or the power to the data cable was not located in a place that enables the District to power and run the data system as design. He said these are the kinds of things the department does not find out until a part of the building is torn away.

Fire Alarm Changes - Mr. Nakadegawa said fire alarm projects are similar to data work. He said you have to tear out a piece of the ceiling and some of the wall framing to figure out how the existing fire alarm runs before you can figure out how to reconnect it and make sure the fire alarm operates correctly before putting it back.

He said the department has an extensive review and price negotiation procedures before settling on a price.

Director Spearman requested an explanation for Amendment No. 1 and the Change Order No. 3 for Madison Middle School.

Mr. White said if a project is divided between two disciplines you have Construction Services or Professional Services. For Construction Services, if there is a cost that goes outside the contract, that is a Change Order. For professional services, if there is a cost that goes outside the contract amount, that is an Amendment. He said both have costs over and above the contract amount.

Director Spearman wanted to know why the work was necessary in Change Order No. 3, Madison Middle School (dry wall, moving cabinets, fire alarms, etc.) for an additional \$58,000. She said the building is there; the District has dedicated the building; the building has been occupied; and now these changes are necessary.

Mr. Nakadegawa said the changes were necessary due to architect's error. The architect drew up the plans; put out the project manual; but did not include the work which was necessary to complete the project. He noted this was formerly a shop building that had a special type of screening on the walls and when that was taken off, the architect assumed there was dry wall underneath, but it wasn't. As a result, the District had to pay the contractor to go back and put dry wall on the walls.

Data Work - Mr. Nakadegawa said the data work done at Madison Middle School is not uncommon in District projects when you have to relocate a portion of the data technology after it has been designed because the of the pathway or the power to the data cable was not located in a place that enables the District to power and run the data system as design. He said these are the kinds of things the department does not find out until a part of the building is torn away.

Fire Alarm Changes - Mr. Nakadegawa said fire alarm projects are similar to data work. He said you have to tear out a piece of the ceiling and some of the wall framing to figure out how the existing fire alarm runs before you can figure out how to reconnect it and make sure the fire alarm operates correctly before putting it back.

He said the department has an extensive review and price negotiation procedures before settling on a price.

Charles Love, Facilities Department, reported on Measure "B" Fund as of June 30, 2011.

Mr. Love reported:

The total approved budget by the Board is \$401 million which includes a \$5 million increase for the La Escuelita project from \$33 million to \$38 million; a decrease in the Life Academy roof replacement project of \$200,000 and an increase in the Prescott Small School budget of \$150,000.

Actual Spending for the year as of June 30, 2011 for all projects was \$57 million. The District continues to project it will spend the total bond amount of \$435 million.

Increases from the last report is approximately \$9.3 million. Pre-design \$172,000; Design \$5.6 million; Construction \$202 million; Closeout approximately \$10 million; Completed projected \$43,000; Staff salaries \$365,000; and Consultants \$963,000.

Director Spearman wanted to know more about the design increase.

Mr. Love said this was due to an increase in processing invoices for work done in June. He said the department tries to get as many items billed and paid for and not have items accrue in the new fiscal year.

Acting Chairperson London wanted to know if a report can be provided that categorizes the different projects Measure "B" funds were used for.

Mr. Love said he could provide the report.
