1. Why do you want to be a school Board Member?

I want to contribute to the already improving school system by looking into new ways to raise funds for the children of Oakland. This may include marketing to attract potential pupils among other alternatives. A former pupil and high school graduate of the Oakland Unified School District, I understand the challenges and the felicity that come with being part Oakland's diverse school community. Despite recent improvements, our community can benefit from a financial bolster. After participating in the labor market and graduating from the University of California, Berkeley, I feel a strong urge to give back to my community. Most importantly, I want to esure that the children of Oakland continue to benefit from a more improved school through better programs and extracurricular activities.

2. Please discuss your interest in and commitment to the Oakland Unified School District. This may be an asbstract concept, but I see myself in the children and people of Oakland. I have worked hard to improve my life in order to improve the life of those alike myself. I feel a deep sense of accomplishment when I can make a positive contribution, particularly to folks who have similar backgrounds as me. Additionally, having had the opportunity to live in numerous other places, I have chosen to stay in Oakland because I understand that people who are familiar with Oakland have the strongest potential to implement changes that will benefit our demographics. My primary purpose in life is to be of service to those closer to me. In light of this, my family and community fall first in line to receive my attention and assistance. As such, mproving the academic achievements of the children of Oakland is a priority on my list.

3. Identify the most significant issues confronting public education, in general, and the Oakland Unified School District, in particular, and include your position on each. Please also discuss the ways you feel the District should respond to these issues.

The biggest challenge facing public education in California is financial instability, namely budget cuts. As far as the OUSD is concerned, I would say it is also a financial problem that has hitorically held back the education of the children of Oakland. Such was the case in 2003 when the district found itself insolvent and was coerced to go under state receivership. A significant part of the reason for low pupil performance is less qualified teachers, less extracurricular activities and a higher ratio of students per teacher among other reasons. All of the issues just listed boil down to cuts on education as a result of lack of funds. I suspect that being less dependent on state funding and creating new ways to increase local funding will provide greater financial stability, thus enhancing the educational system. Such ways would include new marketing strategies, community fund raising in areas outside of Oakland and a partnership with higher education institutions.

 Please describe any positions you have held as a volunteer, employee, former employee or consultant for the Oakland Unified School District.

As a first generation Mexican-American of low income background I have spent much of the last decade working to support my mother and brother while going to school to improve our lives. As a consequence, I have not had the priviledge to participate on many activities hosted by the OUSD.

- 5. What do you see as the major responsibilities of a Board Member? My major responsability as a Board Member will be to work hand in hand with my colleagues to improve the academic achievement of the children of Oakland. Remaining teachable in areas where my knowledge may be limited and being willing to take advice and suggestions, while retaining my creativity and uniqueness will also be an integral part of creating a better place for Oakland's children. Part of ensuring a better place for children to learn includes working with teachers and administrative staff to promote a rich learning environment. Also, being sensitive to the requests of teachers, parents and the community as a whole is a responsability I would take serious.
- 6. How does the Board's role differ from that of the Superintendent? The Superintendent is the Chief Administrative Officer of the School District. He or she is responsible for the faithful excecutions of the policies implemented by the governing board, or School Board Members.

7. Please identify and discuss the areas of knowledge or expertise that you would bring to the Board.

I am fluent in English and Spanish and will use my ability to communicate with our Spanish-speaking community to enhance the education of our children. I also have done extensive research on State Financial Takeovers of Local Districts and have analyzed a variety of alternatives to this. I have found that other states such as Colorado and Alabama are taking a closer look into capacity-building through financial training for Board Memebers and managerial staff of their districts. The results they have been getting from engaging in such activities have given their districts positive results. I will use my refined techniques for research and development to improve areas of the district that may need attention.

8. Have you worked on any school committees or participated in any school activities recently? Please list them.

As mentioned in my answer to question 4 I have not participated in many OUSD hosted events. However, I have interned for governmental organizations that have worked hand in hand the OUSD such as the Office of Congresswoman Barbara Lee and the Office of former Assemblymember Sandre Swanson.

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9. Describe any other community or business activities in which you have participated. Describe your role, and whether your work was as a volunteer or employee.

I have participated as coordinator for Stiles Hall, a non-profit organization dedicated to increasing the number of underrepresented groups in institutions of higher education. It was my pleasure to have served for a year and a half. My role was to guide low income students through the process of applying to U.C. Berkeley. I provided information and resources that were essential to applying as well as helped with the drafting of their personal statement. For example, last semester I worked with a case of 8 students, out of which 5 were accepted to U.C. Berkeley. The rest were accepted to other UCs.

- Receiving gratuity for appointment to office (Penal Code § 74)
- Judicial Officer who has asked for or received emoluments, gratuities, rewards, or the fee of a stenographer (Penal Code § 94)
- Officers committing bribery or corruption crimes (Penal Code § 98)
- Giving or offering bribe to Councilman or Supervisor (Penal Code § 165)
- Misappropriation of public funds (Penal Code § 424)
- Interference with work or discipline of, or giving certain articles to prisoners (Penal Code § 2772)
