Effective July 1, 2023, Measure H revenue replaced Measure N.

The Measures N and H Commission approved the General Counsel and Measures N and H team's proposal to allocate Measure N Contingency in the first half of 2023-24 in order to accelerate the spend-down and to build a Measure H Reserve. **Effective 2024-25**, the balance in the Measure N Contingency is \$1,288,854.45.

#### The Measure H Contingency balance as of 2024-25 is \$5,297,962.15.

## **Considerations:**

OUSD must determine how best to allocate the Measure N Contingency. To support the decision, the High School Linked Learning and Measures N and H team drew up several scenarios for consideration:

#### 1) Fully Expend Measure N Contingency in 2025-26

The Measure N Contingency could be fully expended in 2025-26 by allocating it to cover the site portion of pathway coach or a Measure N permissible position (WBL Liaison, College & Career Readiness Specialist, Career Transition Specialist) at a site without a pathway coach; for charters, the Measure N Contingency could fund the full contract of a

charter-dedicated pathway coach. OUSD anticipates unspent Measure N Carryover in 2024-25, which will be swept at the close of the fiscal year. These funds will be allocated to sites either in 2025-26 or 2026-27, depending on the overall balance and how the funds are allocated (such as mini-grants to eligible sites). *This scenario would allow OUSD to submit a Measure N Contingency plan to the Measures N and H Commission on February 4, 2025. Funds would be added to schools' one-pagers to allocate during the budget development process.* 

# 2) Allocate Measure N Contingency across 2025-26 and 2026-27

The Measure N Contingency could be spent across two academic years. OUSD anticipates an unspent Measure N Carryover in 2024-25, which will be swept at the close of the fiscal year. By prolonging the allocation of the Measure N Contingency, OUSD can effectively bundle any Measure N Carryover with half of the Measure N Contingency to fund Measure N permissible strategic priorities at schools.

# 3) Allocate all Measure N Contingency for 2026-27

The Measure N Contingency could be held in 2025-26. This fund could be combined with any unspent Measure N Carryover and allocated with more input than is possible with Scenario One in 206-27.

Staff gathered input from High School Principals, High School Principal Supervisors, the Measures N and H Commission Chair and Vice Chair, and the Measures N and H team as follows:

- All allocations to schools must be made on a per-pupil basis
- Allocate to deepen the impact of Measure N on student outcomes, not to address overall budget needs
- Spend the remaining Measure N fund expeditiously to reduce the administrative burden
- Increasing the per-pupil allocation to schools over time is a priority
- OUSD high school principals prefer a two-year allocation
- Focus on an increase overall in the per pupil allocation of Measure H to reflect inflation and collective bargaining agreements

## Measures N and H Team Recommendation:

As a result of the input gathered, the Measures N and H Team recommends the Commission approve a two-year allocation of the contingency fund. The two-year allocation proposal reflects a per-pupil allocation increase for the 2025-26 and 2026-27 years, a defined period of time to strategically spend down the Measure N Fund, and aligns with the preference of OUSD high school principals. The recommendation also addresses the increase, over time, of the per-pupil allocation.

If an allocation for 2025-26 is approved on February 4, 2025, the recommendation will go to the OUSD Board of Education for approval on March 12, 2025. If approved, funds will be made available in Education Improvement Plan budgets for 2025-26 and via modifications to site budgets for OUSD schools.

## Calculations

These calculations illustrate a per-pupil allocation of Measure N Contingency and illustrate both a one-year and a two-year scenario.

The High School Linked Learning leadership and Measures N and H staff will develop a funding model to propose to the Commission at a later date that leverages the cost-of-living adjustment afforded by Measure H and potentially a portion of the Measure H Contingency.

Measure H legislation states, "Beginning with the 2024-25 tax year (the second year of assessment of the special tax), and each year thereafter, as long as the Measure is in effect, the Rate may be adjusted from the Rate levied in the prior tax year by

a cost-of-living adjustment equal to the annual average percentage change (currently, the "All Items" category, not seasonally adjusted) of the Bay Area Consumer Price Index – All Urban Consumers for the San Francisco-Oakland- Hayward area over the prior twelve months, as of December of the prior fiscal year, as published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. If, in any given year, that index is not available, then the Rate may be adjusted based on the next comparable Consumer Price Index published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics that is available as of December of the prior fiscal year in the following priority: Bay Area, California, the United States. The cost-of-living adjustment shall be limited to an increase of five (5) percent per year and the new Rate shall be rounded annually to the nearest cent. The determination of the Rate and which index to use shall be determined by the District in its sole discretion."
