What the Research Says

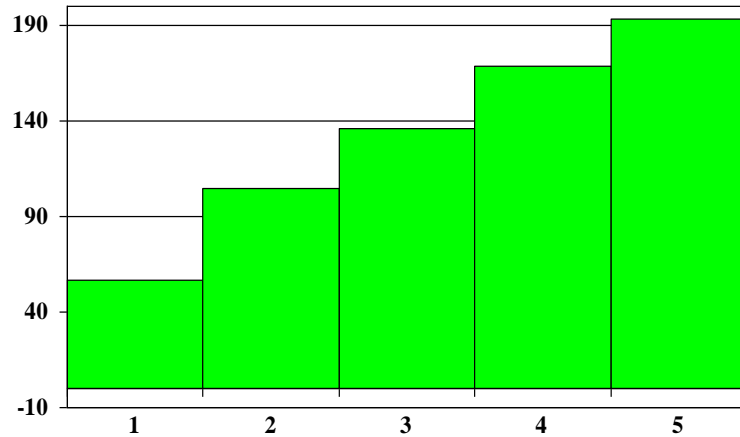


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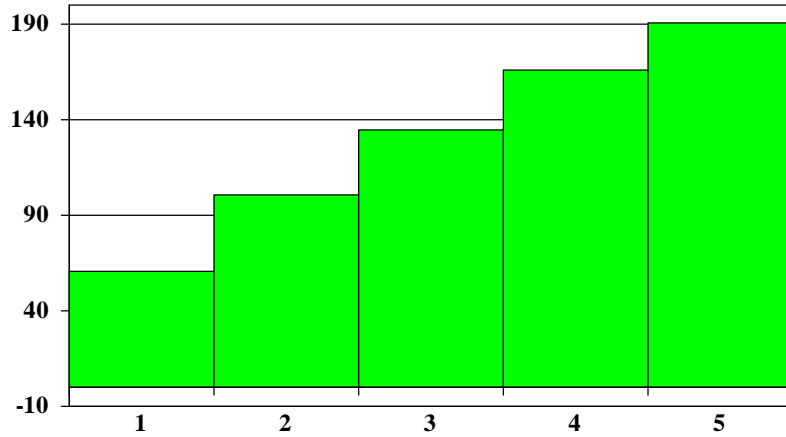
- Most students lose about 2 months of grade-level equivalency in mathematical computational skills over the summer months. Low-income students also lose more than 2 months in reading achievement, while their middle-class peers make slight gains.

(Cooper, 1996)

SCHOOL YEAR CUMULATIVE GAINS

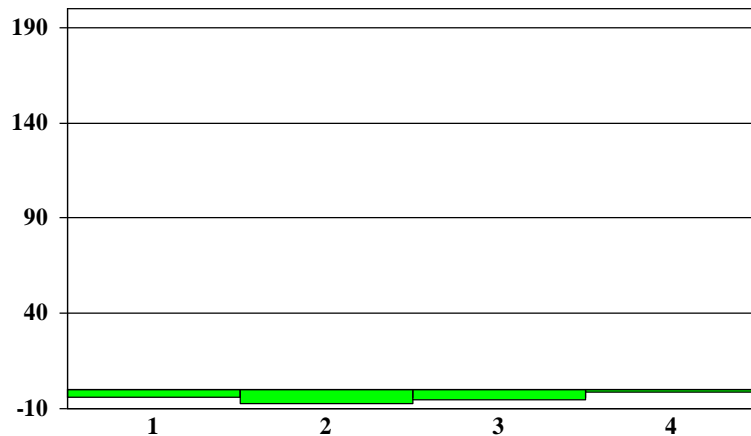


Low-Income Students, by Year

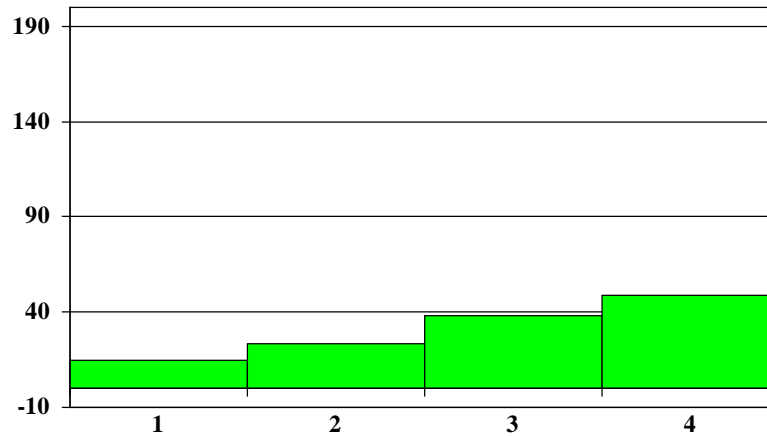


Middle and Upper Income Students, by Year

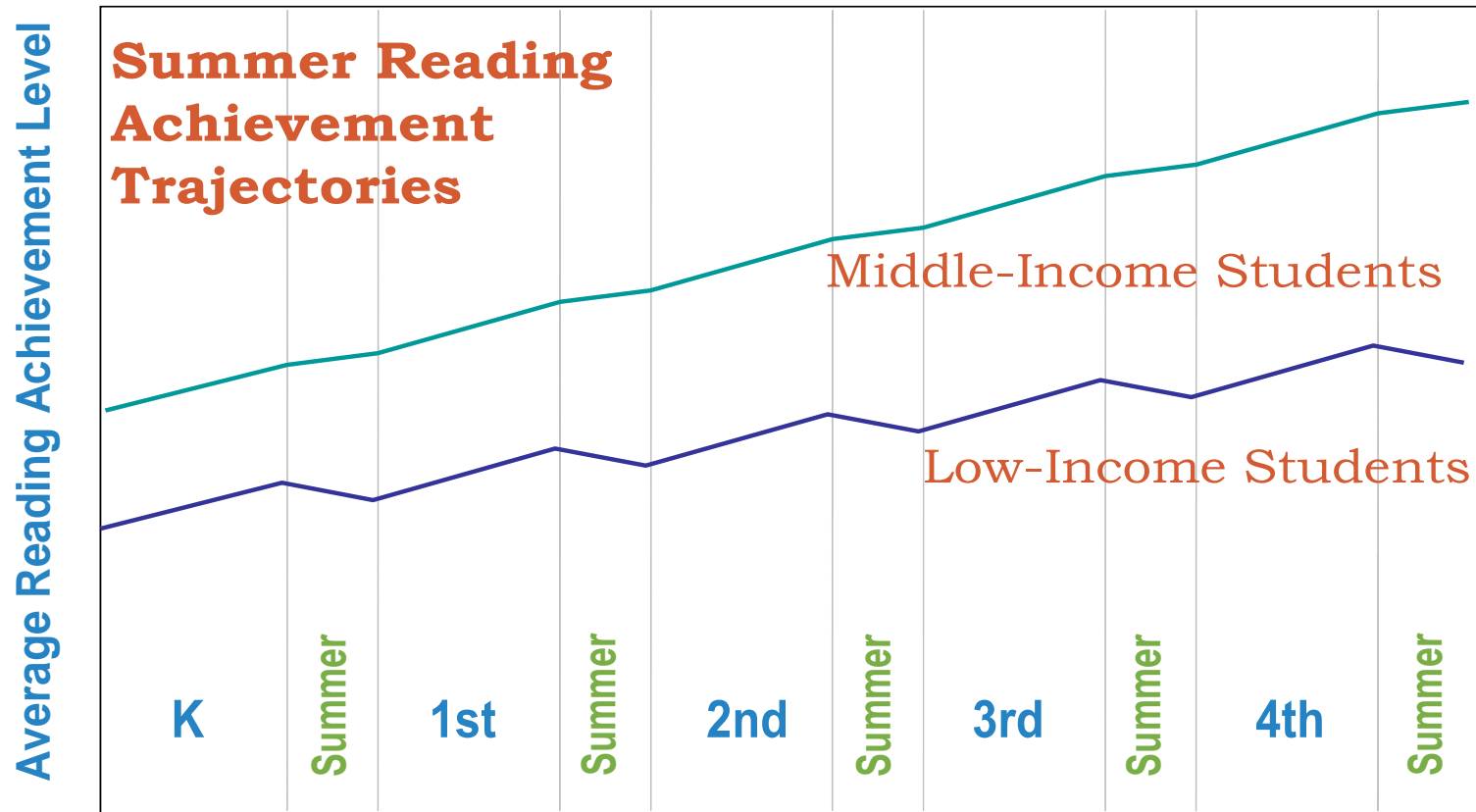

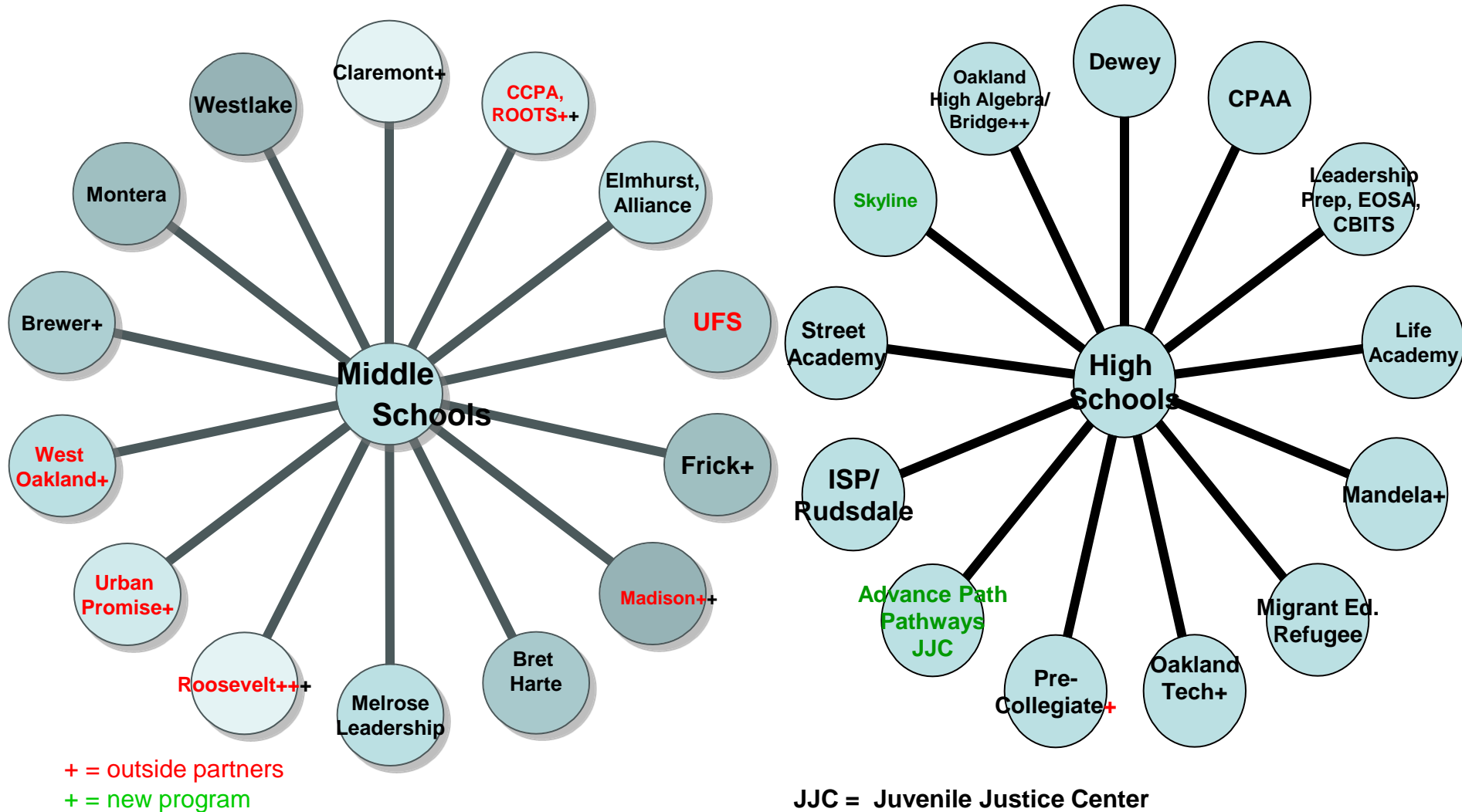

- Co-teaching model
- Goal of program is to support Kindergarten readiness including social emotional development

- Oakland Tech: 890 students, 1390 five credit classes

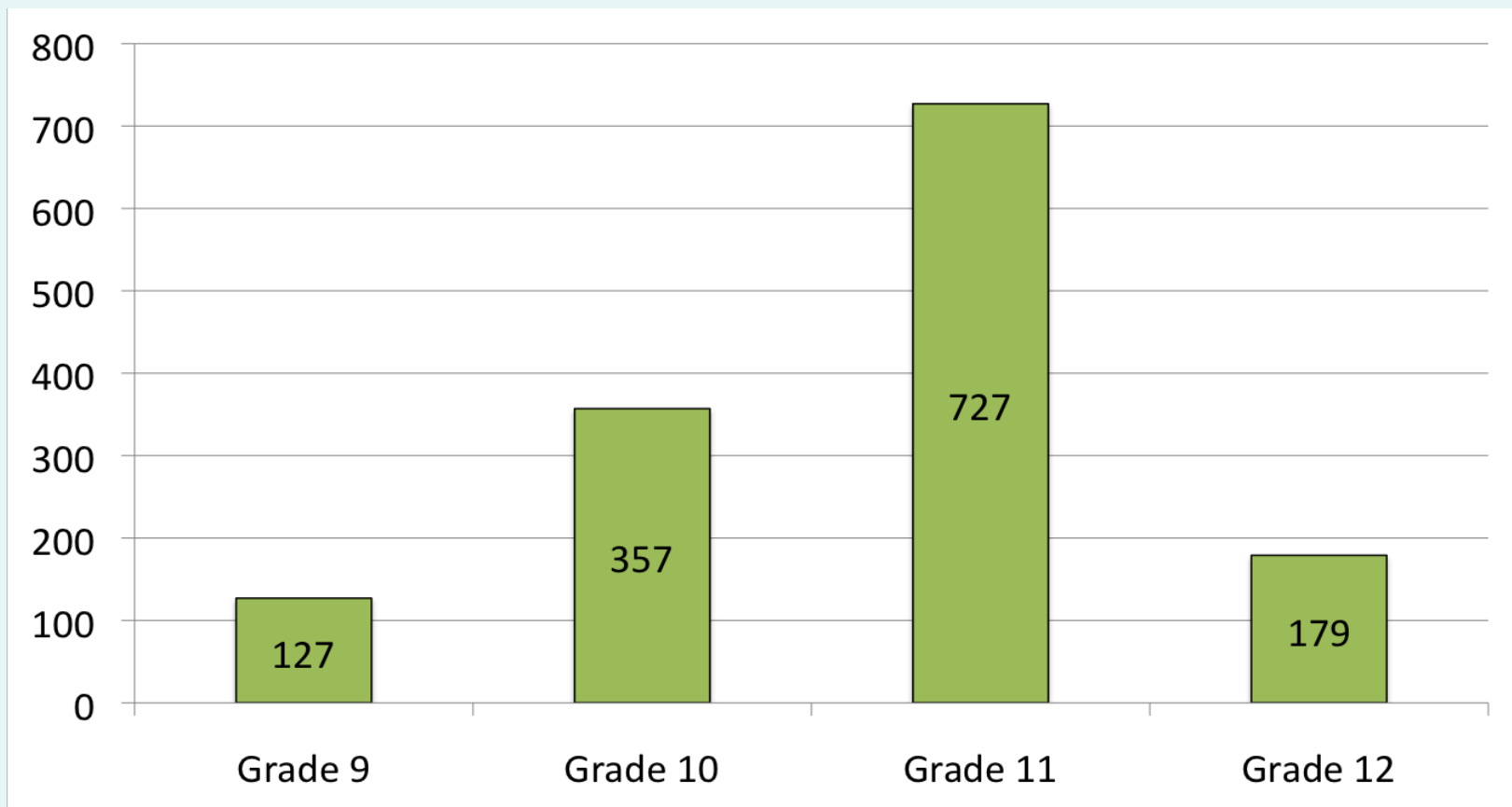

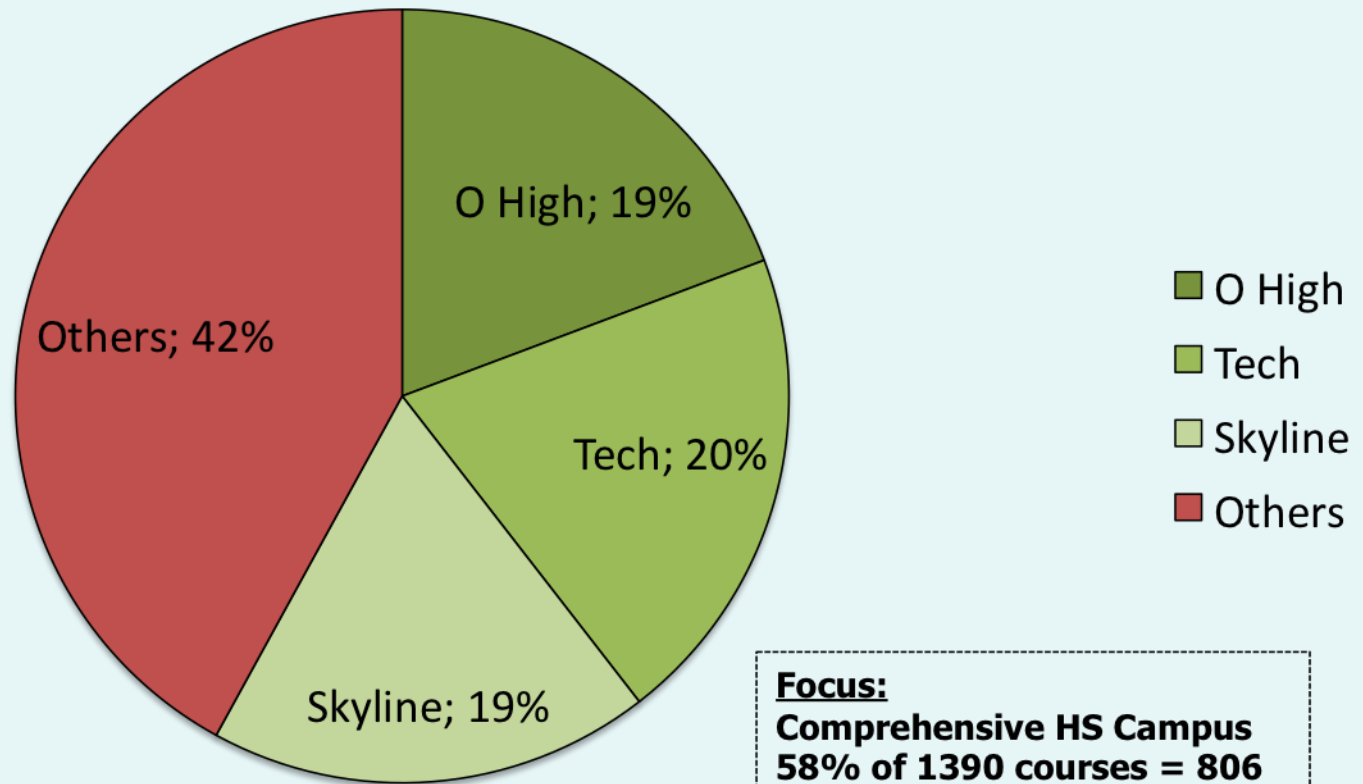
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Distribution by Grade Summer 2010
